SENATE BILL NO. 2333

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-36, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 INCREASE THE SALARY OF JUSTICE COURT JUDGES IN TUNICA COUNTY; AND 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 25-3-36, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

25-3-36. (1) From and after October 1, 1998, every justice 7 court judge shall receive as full compensation for his or her 8 services and in lieu of any and all other fees, costs or 9 compensation heretofore authorized for such justice court judge, 10 an annual salary based upon the population of his or her county 11 according to the 1990 federal decennial census; however, no 12 13 justice court judge shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section to be paid the justice court judge based upon 14 15 the population of the county according to the 1980 federal decennial census. The amount of which salary shall be determined 16 as follows: 17

(a) In counties with a population of more than two
hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-six Thousand Two
Hundred Ninety-nine Dollars (\$46,299.00).

(b) In counties with a population of more than one
hundred fifty thousand (150,000) but not more than two hundred
thousand (200,000), a salary of Forty-two Thousand Five Hundred
Four Dollars (\$42,504.00).

(c) In counties with a population of more than
seventy-five thousand (75,000) but not more than one hundred fifty

27 thousand (150,000), a salary of Thirty-eight Thousand Seven 28 Hundred Nine Dollars (\$38,709.00).

(d) In counties with a population of more than
forty-nine thousand (49,000) but not more than seventy-five
thousand (75,000), a salary of Thirty-three Thousand Three Hundred
Ninety-six Dollars (\$33,396.00).

33 (e) In counties with a population of more than
34 thirty-four thousand (34,000) but not more than forty-nine
35 thousand (49,000), a salary of Twenty-eight Thousand Eight Hundred
36 Forty-two Dollars (\$28,842.00).

37 (f) In counties with a population of more than 38 twenty-four thousand five hundred (24,500) but not more than 39 thirty-four thousand (34,000), a salary of Twenty-seven Thousand 40 Three Hundred Twenty-four Dollars (\$27,324.00).

(g) In counties with a population of more than
twenty-one thousand (21,000) but not more than twenty-four
thousand five hundred (24,500), a salary of Twenty-four Thousand
Two Hundred Eighty-eight Dollars (\$24,288.00).

(h) In counties with a population of more than sixteen
thousand five hundred (16,500) but not more than twenty-one
thousand (21,000), a salary of Twenty-one Thousand Two Hundred
Fifty-two Dollars (\$21,252.00).

49 (i) In counties with a population of more than twelve
50 thousand (12,000) but not more than sixteen thousand five hundred
51 (16,500), a salary of Eighteen Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen
52 Dollars (\$18,216.00).

(j) In counties with a population of more than eight
thousand (8,000) but not more than twelve thousand (12,000), a
salary of Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00).

(k) In counties with a population of eight thousand
(8,000) or less, a salary of Twelve Thousand Dollars (\$12,000.00).
The board of supervisors of any county having two (2)
judicial districts and two (2) justice court judges for the county

No. 2333 03/SS01/R626 PAGE 2 60 shall pay the justice court judges an amount equal to that 61 hereinabove provided for judges in the next higher population 62 category per year, if said justice court judges maintain regular 63 office hours and are personally present in the office they 64 maintain for at least thirty (30) hours per week.

In any county having a population greater than eight thousand (8,000) but less than eight thousand five hundred (8,500) according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which U.S. Highway 61 and Mississippi Highway 4 intersect, the board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay such justice court judges an additional amount not to exceed the sum of <u>Seventeen Thousand</u> Five Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$17,550.00) per year * * *.

72 In any county having a population greater than ten thousand 73 (10,000) but less than ten thousand five hundred (10,500) according to the 1990 federal decennial census and in which 74 75 Mississippi Highway 3 and Mississippi Highway 6 intersect, the 76 board of supervisors may, in its discretion, pay such justice 77 court judges an additional amount not to exceed One Thousand Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$1,450.00) per year, payable beginning 78 79 April 1, 1997.

In any county having a population greater than twenty-four thousand seven hundred (24,700) and less than twenty-four thousand nine hundred (24,900), according to the 1990 federal census, wherein Mississippi Highways 15 and 16 intersect, the board of supervisors shall pay such justice court judge an additional amount equal to Two Thousand Five Hundred Dollars (\$2,500.00) per year.

87 (2) Notwithstanding the provisions of subsection (1) of this
88 section, in the event that the number of justice court judges
89 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) is exceeded pursuant to
90 the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4), the aggregate of the salaries
91 paid to the justice court judges of such a county shall not exceed
92 the amount sufficient to pay the number of justice court judges

S. B. No. 2333 03/SS01/R626 PAGE 3 93 authorized pursuant to Section 9-11-2(1) and such amount shall be 94 equally divided among those justice court judges continuing to 95 hold office under the provisions of Section 9-11-2(4).

96 (3) From and after January 1, 1984, all fees, costs, fines 97 and penalties charged and collected in the justice court shall be 98 paid to the clerk of the justice court for deposit, along with monies from cash bonds and other monies which have been forfeited 99 in criminal cases, into the general fund of the county as provided 100 in Section 9-11-19; and the clerk of the board of supervisors 101 shall be authorized and empowered, upon approval by the board of 102 103 supervisors, to make disbursements and withdrawals from the general fund of the county in order to pay any reasonable and 104 necessary expenses incurred in complying with this section, 105 106 including payment of the salaries of justice court judges as provided by subsection (1) of this section. The provisions of 107 this subsection shall not, except as to cash bonds and other 108 monies which have been forfeited in criminal cases, apply to 109 110 monies required to be deposited in the justice court clerk clearing account as provided in Section 9-11-18, Mississippi Code 111 112 of 1972.

(4) The salaries provided for in subsection (1) of this 113 114 section shall be payable monthly by warrant drawn by the clerk of 115 the board of supervisors on the general fund of the county; however, the board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and 116 117 entered on its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If 118 119 a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or 120 legal holiday. 121

122 (5) Provided, that the salary of any justice court judge
123 shall not be reduced during his term of office as a result of a
124 population change following a federal decennial census.

S. B. No. 2333 03/SS01/R626 PAGE 4 (6) Any justice court judge who is unable to attend and hold court by reason of being under suspension by the Commission on Judicial Performance or the Mississippi Supreme Court shall not receive a salary while under such suspension.

SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

136 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from 137 and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 138 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, or October 1, 2003, 139 whichever occurs later.
