SENATE BILL NO. 2351

AN ACT TO PROVIDE AN ALLOTMENT OF FUNDS UNDER THE ADEQUATE 1 EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR THE PURPOSE OF EMPLOYING SCHOOL 2 3 PSYCHOLOGISTS BASED UPON SCHOOL STUDENT ENROLLMENT AND SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS APPROPRIATED; TO DEFINE THE COMPREHENSIVE SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGIST SERVICES TO BE PROVIDED BY 4 5 SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS PRACTICING IN SCHOOL SETTINGS; TO AMEND 6 SECTION 73-31-27, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY THE 7 APPROPRIATE USE OF TITLES BY SCHOOL PSYCHOLOGISTS PRACTICING IN 8 SCHOOL SETTINGS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 10 11 **SECTION 1.** (1) Subject to the availability of funds specifically appropriated therefor by the Legislature, beginning 12 with the 2003-2004 school year, in addition to other funds 13 allotted under the adequate education program, each school 14 district shall be allotted funding to employ one (1) school 15 16 psychologist for every one thousand (1,000) students enrolled in the school district, or fraction thereof; provided that each 17 school district shall be eligible for at least one (1) 18 state-funded school psychologist. The State Department of 19 Education may, however, increase the number of positions funded 20 each year beyond the above requirements as money is made 21 available. 22

(2) Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year, the assignment
of K-12 school psychologists to the particular schools within the
district shall be at the discretion of the local school board with
the following restrictions:

(a) To the extent practicable, no school psychologist
shall be assigned a pupil-teacher ratio in excess of one (1)
school psychologist per one thousand (1,000) pupils; and

No individual shall be employed as a school 30 (b) 31 psychologist without a minimum of: Holding a AAA certification issued by the 32 (i) 33 Mississippi Commission on Teacher and Administrator Education, 34 Certification and Licensure and Development; Holding the Nationally Certified School 35 (ii) Psychologist (NCSP) certificate offered through the National 36 Association of School Psychologists; or 37 (iii) Holding a school psychologist credential 38 equivalent to (a) or (b) issued by another state or jurisdiction; 39 40 and (C) School psychologists shall not be required to 41 42 conduct testing, assessment and evaluation of special education students for more than fifty percent (50%) of their workday; and 43 (d) School psychologists shall be full-time 44 professional personnel and shall spend a minimum of eighty-five 45 percent (85%) of work time in direct psychologist activity with 46 47 students. School psychologists shall abide by the National 48 (3) 49 Association of School Psychologists (NASP) Code of Ethics. The State Department of Education may adopt regulations 50 (4) 51 regarding the activities of the school psychologist as are not inconsistent with this section. 52 SECTION 2. Section 73-31-27, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 53 54 amended as follows: 73-31-27. (1) Nothing in this chapter shall be construed to 55 limit: 56 (a) The activities, services and use of an official 57 title on the part of a person in the employ of a federal, state, 58 county or municipal agency, or of other political subdivisions, or 59 any educational institution chartered by the state, insofar as 60 61 such activities, services and use of an official title are a part

62 of the duties of his office or position with such agency or 63 institution; or

(b) The activities, services and use of an official
title on the part of a person in the employ of an exempt
organization (in any state) who may be employed by another exempt
organization for a consulting fee; or

(c) The activities and services of a student, intern or
trainee in psychology pursuing a course of study in psychology at
an institution of higher education, if these activities and
services constitute a part of his supervised course of study; or

The services and activities of members of other 72 (d) professional groups licensed or certified by the State of 73 74 Mississippi who perform work of a psychological nature consistent with their training, work experience history, and with any code of 75 76 ethics of their respective professions, provided they do not hold themselves out to be psychologists. The practice of psychology as 77 defined by this act overlaps with the activities of other 78 79 professional groups and it is not the intent of this act to regulate the activities of these professional groups. 80

(2) Individuals certified by the Mississippi State
Department of Education may use appropriate titles such as "school
psychologist," "certified school psychologist," "educational
psychologist" or "psychometrist" only when they are employed by
or under contract with a school * * * and practicing in * * * <u>an</u>
educational setting.

87 (3) Lecturers from any school or college may utilize their
88 academic or research title when invited to present lectures to
89 institutions or organizations.

90 This section shall stand repealed from and after July 1,91 2011.

92 **SECTION 3**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 93 and after July 1, 2003.
