SENATE BILL NO. 2397

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-31-205, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO AUTHORIZE THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION TO UTILIZE 2 APPROPRIATE STAFF TO PERFORM SERVICES FOR VOCATIONAL STUDENT ORGANIZATIONS AND TO EXPEND VOCATIONAL FUNDS FOR RELATED COSTS; 3 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 7 SECTION 1. Section 37-31-205, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows: 8 37-31-205. (1) The State Board of Education shall have the 9 authority to: 10 Expend funds received either by appropriation or 11 (a) directly from federal or private sources; 12 (b) Channel funds to secondary schools, community and 13 14 junior colleges and regional vocational-technical facilities according to priorities set by the board; 15 Allocate funds on an annual budgetary basis; 16 (C) (d) Set standards for and approve all vocational and 17 technical education programs in the public school system and 18 19 community and junior colleges or other agencies or institutions which receive state funds and federal funds for such purposes, 20 including, but not limited to, the following vocational and 21 22 technical education programs: agriculture, trade and industry, occupational home economics, consumer and homemaking education, 23 distributive education, business and office, health, industrial 24 arts, guidance services, technical education, cooperative 25 education, and all other specialized training not requiring a 26 27 bachelors degree, with the exception of programs of nursing education regulated under the provisions of Section 37-129-1. 28 The

29 State Board of Education shall authorize local <u>school</u> boards, 30 within such school board's discretion, to offer distributive 31 education as a one-hour or two-hour block course. There shall be 32 no reduction of payments from state funding for distributive 33 education due to the selection of either the one-hour or two-hour 34 course offering;

Set and publish licensure standards for vocational 35 (e) and technical education personnel. The State Board of Education 36 shall recognize a vocational and technical education teacher's 37 work when school is not in session which is in the teacher's 38 39 particular field of instruction as a means for the teacher to fulfill the requirements for renewal of the teacher's license. 40 41 The board shall establish, by rules and regulations, the documentation of such work which must be submitted to the board 42 and the number of actual working hours required to fulfill renewal 43 If a vocational and technical education teacher who requirements. 44 does not have a bachelor's degree takes classes in fulfillment of 45 licensure renewal requirements, such classes must be in 46 furtherance of a bachelor's degree; 47

Expend funds to expand career information;

(h) Supervise and maintain the Division of Vocational and Technical Education and to utilize, to the greatest extent possible, the division as the administrative unit of the board responsible for coordinating programs and services with local institutions;

 technical education equipment and facilities purchased and/or
 leased with state and federal vocational funds;

71 (1) Encourage provisions for lifelong learning and 72 changing personal career preferences and advancement of vocational 73 and technical education students through articulated programs 74 between high schools and community and junior colleges;

75 (m) Encourage the establishment of new linkages with 76 business and industry which will provide for a better 77 understanding of essential labor market concepts;

78 (n) Periodically review the funding and reporting 79 processes required of local school districts by the board or 80 division with the aim of simplifying or eliminating inefficient 81 practices and procedures;

82 <u>(o)</u> Assist in the development of high technology 83 programs and resource centers to support current and projected 84 industrial needs;

85 <u>(p)</u> Assist in the development of a technical assistance 86 program for business and industry which will provide for 87 industrial training and services, including the transfer of 88 information relative to new applications and advancements in 89 technology; and

90 (q) Enter into contracts and agreements with the State 91 Board for Community and Junior Colleges for conditions under which 92 vocational and technical education programs in community and 93 junior colleges shall receive state and federal funds which flow 94 through the State Board of Education for such purposes.

It is the intent of the Legislature that no vocational 95 (2) 96 and technical education course or program existing on June 30, 1982, shall be eliminated by the State Board of Education under 97 98 the authority vested in paragraph (d) of subsection (1) of this 99 section prior to June 30, 1985. It is further the intent of the Legislature that no vocational and technical education teacher or 100 other personnel employed on June 30, 1983, shall be discharged due 101 102 to licensure standards promulgated by the board under paragraph (e) of subsection (1) of this section, if any such teacher or 103 personnel shall have complied with any newly published licensure 104 standards by June 30, 1985. Nothing contained in this section 105 106 shall be construed to abrogate or affect in any manner the authority of local public school districts or community and junior 107 colleges to eliminate vocational and technical education courses 108 or programs or to discharge any vocational and technical education 109 110 teacher or other personnel.

The State Board of Education and the State Board for 111 (3) 112 Community and Junior Colleges may provide that every vocational and technical education course or program in Mississippi may 113 114 integrate academic and vocational-technical education through coherent sequences of courses, so that students in such programs 115 116 achieve both academic and occupational competencies. The boards may expend federal funds available from the 1990 Perkins Act, or 117 other available federal funds, for the alignment of 118 119 vocational-technical programs with academic programs through the accreditation process and the teacher licensure process. 120

121 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 122 and after July 1, 2003.
