SENATE BILL NO. 2458

- AN ACT TO DEFINE THE TERM "SERVICE CONTRACT"; TO PROVIDE THAT SERVICE CONTRACTS ARE NOT SUBJECT TO TITLE 83, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, AND TO PROVIDE THAT SERVICE CONTRACTS ARE SUBJECT TO THE MISSISSIPPI CONSUMER PROTECTION ACT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 SECTION 1. (1) The term "service contract," as used in this
- 7 section, means a contract or agreement for a separately stated
- 8 consideration for a specific duration to perform the repair,
- 9 replacement or maintenance of property or to reimburse, in whole
- 10 or in part, the owner of such property for the repair, replacement
- 11 or maintenance of property if so operational or structural failure
- 12 is due to a defect in materials or manufacturing or to normal wear
- 13 and tear. A service contract may contain a provision for
- 14 incidental payment under such contract where service, repair or
- 15 replacement is not feasible or economical.
- 16 (2) The marketing, sale, offering for sale, issuance,
- 17 making, proposing to make and administration of a service contract
- 18 is exempt from the provisions of Title 83, Mississippi Code of
- 19 1972.
- 20 (3) Service contracts shall be subject to the provisions of
- 21 the Mississippi Consumer Protection Act, Section 75-24-1 et seq.
- 22 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 23 and after its passage, and shall be applicable to all proceedings
- 24 pending before the Department of Insurance or the courts of this
- 25 state on the effective date of this act.
