## SENATE BILL NO. 2482

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-159-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972,
TO PROVIDE THAT CRITICAL NEEDS TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP STUDENTS SHALL
AGREE TO TEACH IN A SUBJECT AREA IN WHICH THERE IS A SHORTAGE OF
TEACHERS IN ORDER TO COMPLETE THEIR OBLIGATION AND CONVERT THEIR
LOANS TO INTEREST-FREE SCHOLARSHIPS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 37-159-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

9 37-159-3. (1) There is established the "Critical Needs 10 Teacher Scholarship Program," the purpose of which is to attract 11 qualified teachers to those <u>subject</u> areas of the <u>curriculum</u> where 12 there exists a critical shortage of teachers by awarding full 13 scholarships to persons declaring an intention to serve in the 14 teaching field who actually render service to the state while 15 possessing an appropriate teaching license.

(2) Any individual who is enrolled in or accepted for 16 enrollment at a baccalaureate degree-granting institution of 17 higher learning whose teacher education program is approved by the 18 State Board of Education or at an accredited, nonprofit community 19 or junior college in the State of Mississippi and has a passing 20 21 score on the Praxis I Basic Skills Test who expresses in writing 22 an intention to teach in a subject area of the public school curriculum in which there exists a critical shortage of teachers, 23 as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be eligible 24 for a financial scholarship to be applied toward the costs of the 25 individual's college education. The annual amount of the award 26 27 shall be equal to the total cost for tuition, room and meals, books, materials and fees at the college or university in which 28

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the student is enrolled, not to exceed an amount equal to the highest total cost of tuition, room and meals, books, materials and fees assessed by a state institution of higher learning during that school year. Awards made to nonresidents of the state shall not include any amount assessed by the college or university for out-of-state tuition.

Awards granted under the Critical Needs Teacher 35 (3) Scholarship Program shall be available to both full-time and 36 part-time students. Students enrolling on a full-time basis may 37 receive a maximum of four (4) annual awards. The maximum number 38 39 of awards that may be made to students attending school on a part-time basis, and the maximum time period for part-time 40 students to complete the number of academic hours necessary to 41 obtain a baccalaureate degree in education, shall be established 42 by rules and regulations jointly promulgated by the Board of 43 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning and the State 44 Board of Education. Critical Needs Teacher Scholarships shall not 45 46 be based upon an applicant's eligibility for financial aid.

Except in those cases where employment positions may not 47 (4) 48 be available upon completion of licensure requirements, at the beginning of the first school year in which a recipient of a 49 50 Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship is eligible for employment as a licensed teacher or a nontraditional teacher intern pursuant to 51 Section 37-3-2 (6)(b), that person shall begin to render service 52 53 as a licensed teacher or nontraditional teacher intern in a public school district teaching in a subject area of the curriculum where 54 55 there is a critical shortage of teachers, as approved by the State Board of Education. Any person who received four (4) annual 56 57 awards, or the equivalent of four (4) annual awards, shall render 58 three (3) years' service as a licensed teacher or nontraditional teacher intern, as the case may be. Any person who received fewer 59 60 than four (4) annual awards, or the equivalent of four (4) annual awards, shall render one (1) year's service as a licensed teacher 61 

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Any person failing to complete a program of study which 68 (5) will enable that person to become a licensed teacher or 69 nontraditional teacher intern under Section 37-3-2 (6)(b), as the 70 case may be, shall become liable immediately to the Board of 71 72 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the sum of all Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship awards made to that person, 73 74 plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person abrogates his participation in the program. 75 Any person failing to complete his teaching obligation, as required 76 77 under subsection (4) of this section, shall become liable immediately to the board for the sum of all scholarship awards 78 79 made to that person less the corresponding amount of any awards for which service has been rendered, plus interest accruing at the 80 81 current Stafford Loan rate at the time the person discontinues his service, except in the case of a deferral of debt for cause by the 82 83 State Board of Education when there is no employment position immediately available upon a teacher's completion of licensure 84 requirements. After the period of such deferral, such person 85 shall begin or resume teaching duties as required under subsection 86 (4) or shall become liable to the board under this subsection. 87 Τf 88 a claim for payment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an 89 additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee. 90

91 (6) The obligations made by the recipient of a Critical 92 Needs Teacher Scholarship award shall not be voidable by reason of 93 the age of the student at the time of receiving the scholarship.

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94 (7) Any student who, prior to July 1, 2003, had been accepted into the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program under 95 the authority of Section 37-159-3(4), as said statute existed 96 97 prior to July 1, 2003, shall be allowed to remain in the scholar 98 loan program, and conversion shall continue to be based on one (1) semester of service in either (a) a geographic area of the state 99 100 in which there exists a critical shortage of teachers as 101 determined by the State Board of Education, or (b) a subject area 102 of the curriculum in the public schools in which there exists a critical shortage of teachers as determined by the State Board of 103 104 Education, for each year a loan was received by the student.

105 <u>(8)</u> The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher 106 Learning and the State Board of Education shall jointly promulgate 107 rules and regulations necessary for the proper administration of 108 the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program. The Board of 109 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall be the 110 administering agency of the program.

111 (9) If insufficient funds are available to fully fund 112 scholarship awards to all eligible students, the Board of Trustees 113 of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall make the awards to 114 first-time students on a first-come, first-served basis; however, 115 priority consideration shall be given to persons previously 116 receiving awards under the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship 117 Program.

118 (10) All funds received by the Board of Trustees of State 119 Institutions of Higher Learning from the repayment of scholarship 120 awards by program participants shall be deposited in the 121 Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

122 (11) The State Department of Education shall compile and 123 report, in consultation with the Board of Trustees of State 124 Institutions of Higher Learning, an annual report with findings 125 and recommendations to the legislative committees on education by 126 December 1, 2003, and annually thereafter, on the following:

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The number of participants in the Critical Needs 127 (a) Teacher Scholarship Program, by institution and by freshman, 128 sophomore, junior and senior level; 129 130 (b) The number of nontraditional teacher license 131 program participants; The number of individuals who completed the 132 (C) 133 Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship Program and the school district in which they are employed; 134 (d) The number of individuals who are in default of 135 their obligation under the Critical Needs Teacher Scholarship 136 137 Program and the status of their obligation; and 138 (e) The number of participants in the program who have successfully completed the Praxis examination in their junior 139 140 year. SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 141

142 and after July 1, 2003.
