SENATE BILL NO. 2484

- AN ACT ENTITLED THE "MISSISSIPPI RX SENIOR PATIENT ASSISTANCE
- PROGRAM"; TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION OF MEDICAID TO PROVIDE PAYMENT
- 3 ASSISTANCE FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS TO LOW-INCOME SENIOR AND
- DISABLED CITIZENS WHO ARE INELIGIBLE FOR DRUG BENEFIT COVERAGE
- FROM PUBLIC OR PRIVATE SOURCES; TO PROVIDE ELIGIBILITY STANDARDS;
- TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION TO ESTABLISH A STATE REBATE PROGRAM FROM 6
- PHARMACEUTICAL MANUFACTURERS; TO AUTHORIZE A CO-PAYMENT PROGRAM; 7

- TO CREATE A PRESCRIPTION ASSISTANCE FUND; TO AUTHORIZE THE DIVISION TO ADOPT RULES TO IMPLEMENT THIS ACT; AND FOR RELATED 9
- 10 PURPOSES.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11
- 12 SECTION 1. This act shall be known and may be cited as the
- "Mississippi RX Senior Patient Assistance Program." 13
- SECTION 2. The Mississippi Rx Senior Patient Assistance 14
- Program shall provide payment assistance for prescription drugs to 15
- the state's low-income senior and disabled citizens who are 16
- ineligible for, or do not have, prescription drug benefits or 17
- coverage through federal, state, or private sources. 18
- SECTION 3. As used in this act: 19
- 20 (a) "Division" shall mean the Division of Medicaid in
- the Office of the Governor. 21
- "Eligible person" shall mean a person eligible for 22
- the Mississippi RX Senior Patient Assistance Program. 23
- "Prescription drugs" shall mean drugs and supplies 24
- that have been approved safe and effective by the Federal Food and 25
- Drug Administration or are otherwise legally marketed in the 26
- 27 United States, including items related to diabetes management, if
- not covered by Medicare, that a physician has deemed medically 28
- 29 necessary for the diagnosis and/or treatment of the patient.
- Prescription drugs covered under this Chapter shall be limited and 30

- 31 subject to the provisions of Section 5 and the rules and
- 32 regulations adopted pursuant thereto.
- 33 (d) The "program" shall mean the Mississippi Rx Senior
- 34 Patient Assistance Program.
- 35 **SECTION 4.** To be eligible for payment assistance for
- 36 prescription drugs a person must:
- 37 (a) Be a United States citizen or lawfully admitted
- 38 alien.
- 39 (b) Have resources (as determined under 42 USC 1382B
- 40 for purposes of the supplemental security income program) that do
- 41 not exceed twice the maximum amount of resources that an
- 42 individual may have to obtain benefits under that program;
- 43 (c) Be a resident of the State of Mississippi;
- 44 (d) Be ineligible for Medicaid prescription benefits;
- (e) Be ineligible for and/or not receiving a
- 46 prescription drug benefit through a Medicare supplemental policy
- 47 or any other third-party payer prescription benefit; and
- 48 (f) Be an individual aged sixty-five (65) or over or be
- 49 an individual between the ages of nineteen (19) and sixty-four
- 50 (64) who is otherwise eligible for benefits under Title II of the
- 51 Social Security Act (Federal Old Age, Survivors and Disability
- 52 Insurance).
- 53 <u>SECTION 5.</u> (1) The Mississippi Rx Senior Patient Assistance
- 54 Program shall be administered by the division. The division shall
- 55 promulgate and adopt rules and regulations as are necessary to
- 56 implement the program in a cost-effective manner and to ensure the
- 57 program is the payer of last resort for prescription drugs. Rules
- 58 and regulations shall include the following:
- 59 (a) Payment assistance shall not exceed a dollar amount
- 60 established by the division per state fiscal year to assist each
- 61 eligible person in the purchase of prescription drugs.
- (b) The division shall establish a state rebate program
- 63 to collect rebates from pharmaceutical manufacturers in an amount

- 64 consistent with the base Medicaid rebate of fifteen and one-tenth
- 65 percent (15.1%) of Average Manufacturer Price (AMP) for
- 66 innovator/brand name products and eleven percent (11%) of AMP for
- 67 noninnovator/generic products. The program shall not provide for
- 68 a Consumer Price Index penalty.
- (c) The division shall not restrict by any prior or
- 70 retroactive approval process a physician's ability to treat a
- 71 patient with a prescription drug that has been approved as safe
- 72 and effective by the Food and Drug Administration or is otherwise
- 73 legally marketed under Food and Drug Administration regulations.
- 74 (d) The division shall develop a co-payment requirement
- 75 which shall not exceed a percentage of the acquisition cost as
- 76 determined by the division. Co-payments may be waived in cases of
- 77 severe hardship.
- 78 (e) The division shall provide a clear, written
- 79 explanation defining the scope of the program's coverage and the
- 80 amount of the cost-sharing requirements. The division shall
- 81 provide notice to the program participant when the cap has been
- 82 expended. The division shall also notify program participants of
- 83 the process to appeal a decision denying reimbursement for
- 84 prescription drugs or denying a person's eligibility for the
- 85 program. Services shall begin on the first day of the month,
- 86 following the month that eligibility is determined. Eligible
- 87 persons will receive an identification card for the program.
- (f) No drug prescription may exceed one hundred (100)
- 89 dosing units or a thirty-four-day supply, whichever is greater.
- 90 (g) No system of administration shall make a direct
- 91 cash payment to any eligible person.
- 92 (h) The division shall require a mandatory

- 93 point-of-sale claim submission within fourteen (14) days unless
- 94 extenuating circumstances as defined by the division exist.
- 95 (2) The division may promulgate and adopt rules and
- 96 regulations consistent with the following:

- 100 Imposing an annual enrollment fee to be paid by all 101 eligible persons in the program to defray administrative expenses. Payment of any such fee shall be credited to a special fund to be 102 103 designated the Prescription Assistance Fund. For each fiscal year, the maximum unencumbered balance that remains in the 104 Prescription Assistance Fund at the end of any fiscal year shall 105 be no more than the administrative cost of the program in the 106 107 subsequent fiscal year.
 - (c) Determining income eligibility of a person by any reasonable means, including but not limited to a review of the person's most recent federal and state income tax returns and copies of income checks. Residence and age/disability eligibility may be verified by submission of such document, as the division deems reasonable.
- (d) Rules and regulations the division deems necessary to implement the program consistent with the purposes outlined herein and appropriations provided to implement this program.
- SECTION 6. The division shall maintain data to evaluate the cost and effectiveness of the program and shall produce a semi-annual report summarizing participant demographics, utilization, utilization review results, and such other available information as may be needed to evaluate the costs and benefits of the program.
- 123 <u>SECTION 7.</u> A pharmacist shall not dispense or provide a

 124 covered prescription drug to an eligible person until the eligible

 125 person makes the required copayment.
- 126 **SECTION 8.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 127 and after July 1, 2003.

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
