## SENATE BILL NO. 2485

AN ACT ENTITLED THE "MISSISSIPPI READING SUFFICIENCY ACT OF 2003; TO REQUIRE EACH STUDENT ENROLLED IN THE 3RD AND 4TH GRADES TO BE ASSESSED FOR THE ACQUISITION OF READING SKILLS, AND TO REQUIRE A PROGRAM OF INSTRUCTION FOR THOSE FOUND NOT TO BE READING AT THE APPROPRIATE GRADE LEVEL; TO PRESCRIBE THE COMPONENTS OF THE PLAN, TO PROVIDE FOR SCHOOL READING ASSESSMENT COMMITTEES, TO PROVIDE FOR TUTORING AND TO PROVIDE THAT COPIES OF THE ASSESSMENT SHALL BE MADE PART OF THE PERMANENT RECORD OF EACH STUDENT; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 10 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 11 <u>SECTION 1.</u> This act shall be known and may be cited as the 12 "Mississippi Reading Sufficiency Act of 2003."
- SECTION 2. The purpose of the Mississippi Reading

  Sufficiency Act is to ensure that each child attains the necessary

  reading skills by completion of the Fourth Grade which will enable

  that student to continue development of reading skills and to
- 18 **SECTION 3.** (1) Beginning with the 2003-2004 school year,
- 19 each student enrolled in Third and Fourth Grades of the public
- 20 schools of this state shall be assessed by multiple on-going
- 21 assessments for the acquisition of reading skills for the grade
- 22 level in which that student is enrolled. Before the close of the
- 23 current school year, any student, except for students who are on
- 24 an individualized education program or have limited English
- 25 proficiency, found not to be reading at the appropriate grade
- level shall be provided a reading assessment plan which will
- 27 include a program of instruction in reading designed to enable the
- 28 student to acquire the appropriate grade level of reading skills.
- 29 The plan shall include, but not be limited to:

succeed throughout school and life.

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- Sufficient additional in-school instructional time 30 31 for the development of reading and comprehension skills of the 32 student;
- 33 (b) If necessary, tutorial instruction after regular 34 school hours, on Saturdays and during summer; and
- Utilization of teaching methodologies, including 35 phonics and other methodologies in wide practice, as is determined 36 appropriate by the reading assessment committee. 37
- The student shall be reassessed at the conclusion of the 38 program of instruction. The program of instruction shall continue 39 40 until the student is determined to be reading at or above grade level. The student may continue to progress to the next grade 41 42 level while the tutorial reading instruction continues.
  - Each school site shall establish a committee composed of educators, which if possible shall include a certified reading specialist, to determine the reading assessment plan for each student for whom one is necessary. A parent or guardian of the student shall be included in the development of the reading assessment plan for that student. Every school district shall adopt and annually update a district plan which includes a plan for each site and which outlines how each school site will comply with the provisions of the Mississippi Reading Sufficiency Act.
- For any Fourth Grade student not reading at that grade 52 level as determined by multiple assessments including a nationally 53 54 recognized reading assessment given mid-year, a new reading assessment plan shall be developed as specified in this section 55 56 and implemented. In addition to other requirements of this act, the plan shall include specialized tutoring and may include a 57 recommendation as to whether the student should be retained in the 58 59 Fourth Grade at the close of that year.
- Copies of the results of the assessment administered 60 61 pursuant to subsection (1) of this section shall be made a part of the permanent record of each student until the student is reading 62 S. B. No. 2485

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- on grade level so that the results of the next grade level
- 64 assessment can be measured against the previous grade level
- 65 results.
- 66 **SECTION 4.** Pursuant to appropriation by the Legislature
- 67 specifically for such purpose, the State Department of Education
- 68 shall provide in-service training, computer software and certified
- 69 reading instructor personnel for training local school district
- 70 certificated personnel to assist students and otherwise implement
- 71 the provisions of this act.
- 72 **SECTION 5.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 73 and after July 1, 2003.
