SENATE BILL NO. 2497

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-9-23 AND 73-9-24, MISSISSIPPI 2 CODE OF 1972, TO CLARIFY CERTAIN REQUIREMENTS FOR LICENSURE BY THE 3 MISSISSIPPI STATE BOARD OF DENTAL EXAMINERS, TO ALLOW FOR EITHER 4 GENERAL OR SPECIALTY POST-DOCTORAL DENTAL EDUCATIONAL TRAINING, 5 AND TO REQUIRE SUCCESSFUL COMPLETION OF A CLINICAL LICENSURE 6 EXAMINATION TO QUALIFY FOR LICENSURE BY CREDENTIALS; AND FOR 7 RELATED PURPOSES.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 9 SECTION 1. Section 73-9-23, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 10 amended as follows:

11 73-9-23. (1) No person who desires to practice dentistry or 12 dental hygiene in the State of Mississippi shall be licensed until 13 that person has passed an examination by the board. Applicants 14 for examination shall apply in writing to the board for an 15 examination at least thirty (30) days before the examination and 16 shall upon application pay a nonrefundable fee as elsewhere 17 provided in this chapter.

18 (2) An applicant for licensure by examination as a dentist
19 who is a graduate of a dental school accredited by the Commission
20 on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association (ADA),
21 or its successor commission, shall:

(a) Be of good moral character, be possessed of a high
school education, and have attained the age of twenty-one (21)
years;

(b) Exhibit with the application a diploma or
certificate of graduation from the ADA accredited dental school;
and

(c) Have successfully completed Parts I and II of theNational Board Examinations of the Joint Commission on National

30 Dental Examinations, or its successor commission, unless the 31 applicant graduated from an accredited dental school before 1960. 32 (3) An applicant for licensure by examination as a dentist 33 who is a graduate of a non-ADA accredited foreign country dental 34 school shall:

35 (a) Be of good moral character and have attained the36 age of twenty-one (21) years;

37 (b) Be proficient in oral and written communications in38 the English language;

39 (c) Have completed not less than six (6) academic years
40 of postsecondary study and graduated from a foreign dental school
41 that is recognized by the licensure authorities in that country;

(d) Have been licensed as a dentist or admitted to the
practice of dentistry in the foreign country in which the
applicant received foreign dental school training;

Present documentation of having completed at least (e) 45 two (2) or more years of full-time post-doctoral * * * dental 46 47 education in a dental school accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental Association, or its 48 49 successor commission, and has been certified by the dean of the accredited dental school as having achieved the same level of 50 51 didactic and clinical competence as expected of a graduate of the school; and 52

(f) Have successfully completed Parts I and II of the
National Board Examinations of the Joint Commission on National
Dental Examinations, or its successor commission, unless the
applicant graduated from an approved dental school before 1960.

57 (4) An applicant for licensure by examination as a dental
58 hygienist who is a graduate of a dental hygiene school accredited
59 by the Commission on Dental Accreditation of the American Dental
60 Association (ADA), or its successor commission, shall:

(a) Be of good moral character, be possessed of a high
school education and have attained the age of eighteen (18) years;

(b) Exhibit with the application a diploma or
certificate of graduation from the ADA accredited dental hygiene
school; and

(c) Have successfully completed the National Board
Dental Hygiene Examinations of the Joint Commission on National
Dental Examinations, or its successor commission.

69 (5) An applicant for licensure by examination as a dental
70 hygienist who is a graduate of a non-ADA accredited foreign
71 country dental hygiene school shall:

72 (a) Be of good moral character and have attained the73 age of eighteen (18) years;

(b) Be proficient in oral and written communications inthe English language;

(c) Have completed not less than two (2) academic years of postsecondary study and graduated from a foreign dental hygiene school that is recognized by the licensure authorities in that country;

(d) Have been licensed as a dental hygienist or
admitted to the practice of dental hygiene in the foreign country
in which the applicant received foreign dental hygiene school
training;

Present documentation of having completed at least 84 (e) one or more years of full-time post-graduate clinical education in 85 a dental hygiene school accredited by the Commission on Dental 86 87 Accreditation of the American Dental Association, or its successor commission, and has been certified by the dean of the accredited 88 89 dental hygiene school as having achieved the same level of didactic and clinical competence as expected of a graduate of the 90 school; and 91

92 (f) Have successfully completed the National Board
93 Dental Hygiene Examinations of the Joint Commission on National
94 Dental Examinations, or its successor commission.

Applications shall be made in the form and content as 95 (6) required in this section and as shall be prescribed by the board, 96 and each applicant shall submit upon request such proof as the 97 98 board may require as to age, character and qualifications. 99 Applications must be signed by two (2) citizens of the state of which the applicant is a resident, attesting under oath that the 100 applicant is of good moral character. All applicants for 101 licensure shall submit an endorsement from all states in which he 102 or she is currently licensed or has ever been licensed to practice 103 dentistry or dental hygiene. The board may disallow the licensure 104 105 examination to any applicant who has been found guilty of any of 106 the grounds for disciplinary action as enumerated in Section 107 73-9-61.

108 (7) Examination shall be as elsewhere provided in this 109 chapter and the board may by its rules and regulations prescribe reasonable professional standards for oral, written, clinical and 110 other examinations given to applicants, and, if deemed necessary 111 112 by the board, include a requirement that licensure examinations of applicants be conducted utilizing live human subjects. 113 Each 114 applicant shall appear before the board and be examined to determine his or her learning and skill in dentistry or dental 115 If found by the members of the board conducting the 116 hygiene. examination to possess sufficient learning and skill therein and 117 to be of good moral character, the board shall, as early as 118 119 practicable, grant to the person a license to practice dentistry or dental hygiene, as the case may be, which shall be signed by 120 each member of the board who attended the examination and approved 121 the issuance of a license. 122

(8) The Board of Dental Examiners may, at its own discretion, accept certification of a licensure applicant, either dentist or dental hygienist, by the National Board Examinations of the Joint Commission on National Dental Examinations, or its successor commission, in lieu of the written examination.

However, in all such instances the board shall retain the right to administer such further written and practical examinations and demonstrations as it deems necessary.

(9) Each application or filing made under this section shall
include the social security number(s) of the applicant in
accordance with Section 93-11-64.

134 SECTION 2. Section 73-9-24, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 135 amended as follows:

136 73-9-24. (1) In addition to the method for obtaining a 137 license to practice dentistry or dental hygiene by way of 138 examination as provided by Section 73-9-23, the board, in its sole 139 discretion, may grant a license to a candidate who meets the 140 following criteria:

(a) Submit proof of graduation from a dental school or
school of dental hygiene accredited by the Commission on Dental
Accreditation of the American Dental Association (ADA), or its
successor commission.

(b) Be engaged in the active practice of dentistry or
dental hygiene or in full-time dental education or dental hygiene
education for the past five (5) years;

(c) Currently hold a valid, unrestricted and unexpired license in a state whose standards for licensure are determined by the board as equivalent to Mississippi's standards, and which state grants reciprocity or licensure by credentials to licensees of the State of Mississippi;

(d) Provides an endorsement from all states in which he or she is currently licensed or has ever been licensed to practice dentistry or dental hygiene;

(e) Has not been the subject of pending or final
disciplinary action in any state in which the applicant has been
licensed;

(f) Is not the subject of a pending investigation inany other state or jurisdiction;

(g) Has <u>passed a state or regional clinical licensure</u> <u>examination and</u>, within the past five (5) years, <u>has not failed</u> a <u>clinical</u> licensure examination administered by another state, jurisdiction or regional licensing board;

(h) Has not failed at any time, a licensure examinationadministered by the Mississippi State Board of Dental Examiners;

167 (i) Provides a written statement agreeing to appear for168 interviews at the request of the board;

(j) Has successfully completed all parts of the National Board Examinations of the Joint Commission on National Dental Examinations, or its successor commission, unless the applicant graduated from an accredited dental or dental hygiene school before 1960;

174 (k) Successfully passes a written jurisprudence175 examination;

176 (1) Provides payment of a nonrefundable application fee177 as provided in Section 73-9-43; and

(m) In addition, the State Board of Dental Examiners
may consider the following in accepting, rejecting or denying an
application for licensure by credentialing:

(i) Information from the National Practitioner
Data Bank, the Healthcare Integrity and Protection Data Bank
and/or the American Association of Dental Examiners Clearinghouse
for Disciplinary Information.

(ii) Questioning under oath.

186 (iii) Results of peer review reports from187 constituent societies and/or federal dental services.

188 (iv) Substance abuse testing or treatment.
189 (v) Background checks for criminal or fraudulent
190 activities.
191 (vi) Participation in continuing education.

192 (vii) A current certificate in cardiopulmonary

193 resuscitation.

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194 (viii) Recent patient case reports and/or oral195 defense of diagnosis and treatment plans.

196 (ix) No physical or psychological impairment that197 would adversely affect the ability to deliver quality dental care.

198 (x) Agreement to initiate practice in the199 credentialing jurisdiction within a reasonable period of time.

(xi) Proof of professional liability coverage and
that the coverage has not been refused, declined, canceled,
nonrenewed or modified.

203 (xii) Any additional information or documentation 204 that the board may stipulate by rule or regulation as necessary to 205 qualify for a license by credentialing.

(2) The board shall be granted sufficient time to conduct a complete inquiry into the applicant's qualifications for licensure by credentials, and the board may adopt such rules and regulations pertaining to the time needed to conduct investigations and the responsibility of applicants to produce verifiable documentation.

211 (3) Any applicant failing to meet the criteria in subsection (1) of this section shall not be eligible for a license based on 212 213 credentials. Upon meeting the criteria in subsection (1) of this section, the Mississippi State Board of Dental Examiners may, in 214 215 its discretion, issue to the applicant a license to practice dentistry, or dental hygiene, unless grounds for denial of 216 licensure exist as enumerated in Section 73-9-61. Evidence of 217 218 falsification in the application for licensure through credentialing will result in revocation of the license. 219

(4) Any applicant applying for a specialty license by
credentials must stay within his or her board recognized specialty
and must practice only that specialty within the State of
Mississippi. A specialty license holder must hold a general
dentistry license before obtaining a specialty license.

225 **SECTION 3**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 226 and after July 1, 2003.
