## SENATE BILL NO. 2504

AN ACT TO CREATE SECTION 49-17-44.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF
1972, TO PROVIDE THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A WATER POLLUTION CONTROL
PERMIT FOR A CONCENTRATED ANIMAL FEEDING OPERATION SHALL PROVIDE A
BOND OR OTHER FINANCIAL SECURITY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. The following shall be codified as Section
49-17-44.1, Mississippi Code of 1972:

49-17-44.1. (1) The permit board shall require any 8 9 applicant for a water pollution control permit for a concentrated animal feeding operation to provide a bond or other acceptable 10 financial security instrument payable to the commission and 11 conditioned upon full and satisfactory performance of the 12 requirements of the Mississippi Air and Water Pollution Control 13 Law and any water pollution control permit issued under that law. 14 Any bond shall be executed by the permittee and a corporate surety 15 licensed to do business in the state. The commission shall 16 establish by regulation the acceptable forms of financial security 17 and the amount of financial security required for the various 18 types and sizes of facilities. The purpose of the bond or other 19 financial security shall be the protection of the public health, 20 welfare and the environment. 21

(2) (a) There is established a special account within the
Pollution Emergency Fund created under Section 49-17-68. The
proceeds of any forfeiture shall be deposited into the special
account. The proceeds may be expended under the authority of this
section without additional action of the Legislature.

(b) The commission shall file an annual reportdetailing the receipts and expenditure of the bond forfeiture

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29 account with the Chairmen of the House and Senate Appropriations 30 Committees.

31 (c) Expenditures may be made from the account upon32 requisition by the executive director of the department.

33 (d) Any unexpended funds remaining in the fund at the
34 end of the fiscal year shall not lapse. Interest earned on the
35 principal shall be credited by the Treasurer to the account.

36 (e) The account may receive monies from any available
37 public or private source, including, but not limited to, proceeds
38 from bond or other financial security forfeitures, interest and
39 funds from other judicial actions.

40 (3) Funds in the account may be used by the commission or 41 any receiver appointed by a court to address noncompliance or for 42 mitigation, abatement, clean-up or other remedial actions 43 involving pollution at the facility for which the bond or 44 financial security was forfeited.

45 (4) An appeal from any decision of the commission under this
46 section may be taken as provided in Section 49-17-41, Mississippi
47 Code of 1972.

(5) This section is applicable to applications for new
concentrated animal feeding operations and to existing permits
upon application for reissuance or transfer of a permit.

51 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 52 and after its passage.
