- 63-2-7. (1) A violation of this chapter shall be a 11
- misdemeanor, punishable by a fine of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25.00) 12
- upon conviction; however, only the operator of a vehicle may be 13
- 14 fined for a violation of this chapter by the operator, for a
- 15 violation of this chapter by * * * all passengers or * * * for a
- violation of this chapter by a child who is at least four (4) 16
- years of age but under eight (8) years of age, regardless of the 17
- seat that the child occupies * * *. The maximum fine that may be 18
- imposed against the operator of a vehicle for a violation of this 19
- 20 chapter by the operator or for a violation of this chapter by one
- or more passengers shall be Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) in the 21
- 22 aggregate.
- 23 (2) A violation of this chapter shall not be entered on the
- driving record of any individual so convicted, nor shall any state 24
- assessment provided for by Section 99-19-73, or any other state 25
- law, be imposed or collected. 26
- SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from 27
- 28 and after July 1, 2003.
