1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 69-27-9, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CONFORM MEMBERSHIP OF THE STATE SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION COMMISSION TO NEW CONGRESSIONAL DISTRICTS ON A PHASED-IN BASIS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 69-27-9, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	69-27-9. (1) The State Soil and Water Conservation
9	Commission shall be constituted as follows:
10	(a) Eleven (11) voting members:
11	(i) The Commissioner of Agriculture and Commerce;
12	(ii) The State Forester;
13	(iii) The President of the Mississippi Association
14	of Soil and Water Conservation District Commissioners;
15	(iv) The first vice president of the association;
16	(v) The second vice president of the association;
17	(vi) The immediate or most recent ex-president of
18	the association willing and able to serve; and
19	(vii) Five (5) members to be elected from the
20	membership of the soil and water conservation district
21	commissioners at the annual meeting of the association, one (1)
22	from each United States congressional district by a caucus of the
23	association members from each congressional district as
24	constituted at the time of the caucus, to be elected as follows:
25	First District, one (1) member elected for a one-year term,
26	beginning January 1, 1968, and ending January 1, 1969, his
27	successor to be similarly elected at the 1968 annual meeting of

each successor elected in the succeeding third annual meeting for 29 30 a three-year term; Second District, one (1) member elected for a two-year term beginning January 1, 1968, and ending January 1, 31 1970, his successor to be similarly elected at the 1969 annual 32 33 meeting of the association for a three-year term ending January 1, 34 1973, and each successor elected in the succeeding third annual meeting for a three-year term; Third District, election to be 35 similar to the Second District; Fourth District, one (1) member 36 elected for a three-year term beginning January 1, 1968, and 37 ending January 1, 1971, each successor to be similarly elected at 38 the succeeding third annual meeting for a three-year term; Fifth 39 District, election to be similar to Fourth District. 40 41 (viii) The elected members of the board as constituted on January 15, 2003, shall continue to serve until the expiration 42 of their respective terms. As the terms of the five (5) members 43 expire, the members shall be elected as follows: one (1) member 44 from each congressional district by caucus of the association 45 members from each congressional district as constituted at the 46 time of the caucus and the remainder to be elected from the state 47 at large by the membership of the association. The position and 48 term of the member elected from the Third District whose term 49 50 expires January 1, 2004, shall be the term and position of the at 51 large member. - 52 (b) The purpose of the above procedure is to provide
 53 that when put into effect, elected members will serve three-year
 54 staggered terms. The State Soil and Water Conservation Commission
 55 is empowered to adopt and carry out procedures for filling
 56 unexpired terms of its elected members. The incumbent will
 57 continue to serve until his successor is duly qualified and enters
 58 into the duties of his office.
- (c) Two (2) members shall serve ex officio and without voting power, but with all privileges of discussion and debate as follows:

(i) The Director of the State Extension Service;

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64 (ii) The Director of the State Agricultural and

65 Forestry Experimental Station.

(d) Such nonvoting ex officio member who, due to the

67 pressure of his other required official duties, believes that he

68 will be unable to regularly attend meetings of the commission

shall designate a substitute to attend in his stead with the same

rights and privileges that he would have had.

71 (2) The commission shall designate its chairman and vice

chairman and may, from time to time, change such designation. A

majority of the voting members of the commission shall constitute

a quorum, and the concurrence of a majority in any matter within

75 their duties shall be required for its determination. The voting

members of the commission shall receive a per diem at the uniform

77 rate established in Section 25-3-69, Mississippi Code of 1972, for

78 their services on the commission for not more than thirty-six (36)

79 days in any one calendar year. In addition, and in the discretion

80 of the commission, all members may be entitled to expenses,

81 including traveling expenses, necessarily incurred in the

82 discharge of their duties on the commission, not to exceed the

83 rate established in Section 25-3-41, Mississippi Code of 1972, for

84 state officers and employees. The commission may provide for the

85 execution of surety bonds for all employees and officers who shall

86 be entrusted with funds or property, shall provide for the keeping

87 of a full and accurate record of all proceedings and of all

88 resolutions, regulations and orders issued or adopted, and shall

89 provide for an annual audit of the accounts of receipts and

90 disbursements by the State Auditor.

91 (3) The commission shall keep a record of its official

92 actions, shall adopt a seal, which seal shall be judicially

93 noticed, and may perform such acts, hold such public hearings, and

- 94 promulgate such rules and regulations as may be necessary for the
- 95 execution of its functions under this article.
- 96 **SECTION 2**. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 97 and after its passage.
