SENATE BILL NO. 2636 (As Sent to Governor)

27 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. (1) Prior to October 1, 2003, the Oversight 28 Committee established in Section 5 of this act shall cause to be 29 conducted an assessment of all prekindergarten structured school 30 or school readiness programs, including pilot programs, operated 31 by a public, private or parochial school or a Head Start program 32 in the state. The assessment shall include, but not be limited 33 to, data that identifies the population served by each program, 34 including the age and number of children served in total and in 35 each classroom; the number and qualifications of teachers and 36 37 teacher assistants in total and in each classroom; the days and hours of program operation; the criteria used to determine 38 eligibility for enrollment; the early care and education programs 39 S. 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attended by these children prior to enrollment, or in addition to 40 current enrollment; hours of parental employment; identification 41 of eligibility of the enrolled population for any other 42 43 publicly-supported programs; and how each district is evaluating 44 the success of these programs. The assessment shall also include 45 data comparing program operation to the Regulations Governing the Operation of a Licensed Child Care Facility. The assessment shall 46 also include data comparing the benchmarks of the prekindergarten 47 and kindergarten curriculums authorized by the State Board of 48 Education to the developmental milestones recognized by the 49 50 Department of Pediatrics of the University Medical Center as representing the optimum development of children three (3) to five 51 (5) years of age. 52

53 (2) Local school districts operating a prekindergarten
54 program shall provide local program data to the Department of
55 Education as directed by the State Board of Education.

SECTION 2. Prior to October 1, 2003, the Oversight Committee 56 57 established in Section 5 of this act, shall cause to be conducted an assessment of all school readiness programs operated by 58 59 licensed childcare centers in the state. The assessment shall include, but not be limited to, data that identifies the 60 61 population served by each program, including the age and number of children served in total and in each classroom; the number and 62 qualifications of teachers and teacher assistants in total and in 63 64 each classroom; the days and hours of program operation; the criteria used to determine eligibility for enrollment; the early 65 66 care and education programs attended by these children prior to enrollment, or in addition to current enrollment; hours of 67 parental employment; identification of eligibility of the enrolled 68 population for any other publicly-supported programs; and how each 69 70 program is evaluating the success of these programs. The 71 assessment shall also include data comparing program operation to the Regulations Governing the Operation of a Licensed Child Care 72

The assessment shall also include data comparing the benchmarks of the prekindergarten and kindergarten curriculum authorized by the State Board of Education to the developmental milestones recognized by the Department of Pediatrics of the University Medical Center as representing the optimum development of children three (3) to five (5) years of age.

79 <u>SECTION 3.</u> The Division of Child Care Licensure, Mississippi 80 State Department of Health, shall assist the Oversight Committee 81 established in Section 5 of this act in carrying out those 82 responsibilities related to the licensing of childcare facilities.

83 **SECTION 4.** (1) The Oversight Committee established in Section 5 of this act shall consider the findings of the 84 85 assessment and make recommendations on the need for additional early childhood education programs or services and the steps 86 necessary to ensure early childhood education programs operating 87 in the state meet or exceed recognized standards of excellence. 88 The Oversight Committee shall submit a report of the findings of 89 90 the assessment and any recommendations based on these findings to the Legislature no later than January 15, 2004. The Oversight 91 92 Committee shall also make the report and recommendations available to the Interagency Council on Early Childhood Services and the 93 94 Advisory Committee to the Council for the review and comment of the membership. Any comments and recommendations adopted by the 95 council shall be included in the report to the Legislature. 96

97 (2) The Oversight Committee established in Section 5 of this 98 act shall cause to be developed a single assessment instrument to 99 collect and compile data required under this section into a single 100 report. It is the intent of the Legislature that any funds used 101 shall be associated with the production and duplication of the 102 report to make the information available to the Legislature.

103 <u>SECTION 5.</u> There shall be established an Oversight
 104 Committee, which shall oversee the process and conducting of

107 (a) A representative of the State Department of
108 Education designated by the State Board of Education who shall
109 serve as chairman of the committee;

(b) A representative of the State Department of Healthdesignated by the State Board of Health;

(c) A representative of the State Department of Human
Services designated by the Executive Director of the State
Department of Human Services;

115 (d) The President of the Mississippi Head Start116 Association, or his designee;

117 (e) A representative of a licensed child care center118 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;

(f) A representative of a private or parochial school prekindergarten program appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

(g) A representative from a university or college earlychildhood program appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;

(h) A representative of an advocacy organizationappointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives;

(i) A representative of a community or junior collegeearly childhood program appointed by the Governor; and

(j) A representative of the cooperative extension service appointed by the Lieutenant Governor. All required appointments to the Oversight Committee shall be made not later than May 15, 2003. The Oversight Committee shall meet on a date designated by the chairman, not later than May 15, 2003, to organize, elect a chairman and establish rules for transacting its business and keeping records.
