## SENATE BILL NO. 2647

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT IT SHALL BE UNLAWFUL TO USE A REMOVABLE WINDSHIELD PLACARD TO PARK IN AN AREA SET ASIDE FOR THE DISABLED UNLESS THE DATE OF EXPIRATION OF THE PLACARD IS VISIBLE; AND FOR RELATED 2

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6
- 7 SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- amended as follows: 8
- 9 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the
- State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 10
- ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 11
- through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 12
- 13 the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation
- 14 International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on
- Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 15
- that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 16
- application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 17
- licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of 18
- 19 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to
- walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 20
- will have the disability for at least three (3) years. The State 21
- 22 Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of
- the various counties, decals for placement on the special license 23
- The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the 24
- license plate was issued and the year in which the special license 25
- plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this 26
- 27 section is valid for the period of time that the license tag
- attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section 28

- 29 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued
- 30 may retain the special license plate and may renew it by
- 31 submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its
- 32 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the
- 33 physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the
- 34 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs
- 35 the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the
- 36 disability for at least three (3) years. If an applicant fails to
- 37 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration,
- 38 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county
- 39 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a
- 40 regular license plate to replace the special license plate.
- The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this
- 42 section, includes motorcycles.
- The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the
- 44 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons
- 45 who, as determined by a licensed physician:
- 46 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping
- 47 to rest; or
- 48 (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
- 49 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
- 50 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or
- 51 (c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent
- 52 that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one
- 53 (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1)
- 154 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60)
- 55 mm/hg on room air at rest; or
- (d) Use portable oxygen; or
- (e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the

- 59 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American

61 (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due 62 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.

An applicant for a special license plate bearing the International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.

- (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. - The International Symbol of Access, which is at 106 107 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue 108 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be 109 white on a red shield); 110
- 111 An identification number and, on the reverse side, the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued; 112
- 113 A date of expiration, which shall be entered on the placard by the tax collector; and 114

- (5) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an (a) 116 area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle 117 118 does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in this section with the date of expiration visible, 119 120 (ii) have the special license plate issued under this section properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, or (iii) have the 121 disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 122 27-19-53 properly displayed upon the motor vehicle. 123 Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such areas, or who blocks 124 125 such spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not more than Two

- Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, 159 license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit 160 bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with 161 162 a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of 163 the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, 164 permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and 165 166 is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
  disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
  the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
  with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.

  The identification required to park in such an area, except as
  provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:
- 173 (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a

  174 permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard

  175 must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag

  176 issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed.
- 177 (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a
  178 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,
  179 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary
  180 windshield placard must be displayed.
- Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as provided for in subsection (5) of this section.
- (10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or 184 other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax 185 Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant 186 to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is 187 188 registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport disabled residents of the institution. Such institution shall 189 190 comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such 191 vehicle.
