SENATE BILL NO. 2651

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 49-15-64.1, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO CHANGE MARINE WATER BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION TO CONFORM TO NEW 3 CHANNEL MARKER NUMBERS ESTABLISHED BY UNITED STATES COAST GUARD; 4 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 49-15-64.1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

49-15-64.1. The shrimp season shall open on the first 8 9 Wednesday of June. The shrimp season shall be closed from January 1 until it is opened the first Wednesday of June, except south of 10 the intercoastal waterway. The shrimp season shall be closed 11 south of the intercoastal waterway from May 1 until it is opened 12 the first Wednesday of June. For the purposes of this section 13 only, that portion of the intercoastal waterway that extends from 14 a point south of Long Beach to a point south of Point Clear is 15 described as follows: 16

Begin at green buoy or beacon number 1 which is located 17 approximately three (3) miles north of West Point on Cat 18 Island, thence extending southwesterly to buoy or beacon 19 number 4P, thence southwesterly to Pass Marianne Light, 20 thence southwesterly to buoy or beacon number 15P at the 21 northernmost point of Merrill Coquille, thence 22 southwesterly to buoy or beacon number 17P, thence 23 southwesterly to buoy or beacon number 22, thence 24 westerly to Lighthouse Point and continuing westward 25 following the meandering of the shoreline to the 26 boundary line of the state. 27

The commission, by majority vote, may open the season at an 28 29 earlier or later date in designated areas only after sampling areas within its jurisdiction where shrimp may be caught for the 30 purpose of determining the count of shrimp per pound. 31 The 32 commission may also, by majority vote, close certain designated areas where the shrimp count is found, by sampling, to be in 33 excess of sixty-eight (68) per pound. The following waters are 34 protective and staging areas for young shrimp, and are permanently 35 closed to commercial and recreational shrimping activities: 36

All waters north of a line beginning at a point one-half mile 37 38 due South of the shoreline at the Mississippi-Alabama state boundary; thence running westerly following the meanderings of the 39 shoreline one-half mile therefrom to Light "5" in the Bayou 40 Casotte Channel; thence running northerly to Light "7" in the 41 Bayou Casotte Channel; thence running westerly following the 42 meanderings of the shoreline one-half mile therefrom to the 43 intersection with the Pascagoula Channel; thence running 44 45 northwesterly to Beacon "50" in the Pascagoula Channel; thence running southwesterly to Beacon "49" in the Pascagoula Channel; 46 47 thence running in the most direct line to the northeast point of Singing River Island; thence running westerly along the north 48 49 shoreline to the northwest point of Singing River Island; thence running northwesterly to a point one-half mile due south of the 50 mouth of Graveline Bayou; thence running westerly following the 51 52 meanderings of the shoreline one-half mile therefrom to Beacon "18" in the Biloxi Bay Channel; thence running northwesterly to 53 Beacon "22" in the Biloxi Bay Channel; thence running 54 northwesterly to Beacon "26" in the Biloxi Bay Channel; thence 55 running westerly to Beacon "34", exclusive of the Biloxi Channel 56 57 itself; thence running westerly to Beacon "30" in the Biloxi Channel, exclusive of the Biloxi Channel itself; and thence 58 59 running due South to a point on the north shore of Deer Island; thence running westerly following the north shore of Deer Island 60

to the westernmost tip; thence running westerly in the most direct 61 line to Biloxi Beacon "8"; thence running westerly following the 62 meanderings of the shoreline at a distance of one-half mile 63 therefrom to a point on the centerline of the CSX Railroad Bridge 64 65 over St. Louis Bay; thence running westerly along the centerline of said bridge to a point one-half mile south of the western 66 abutment; thence running southwesterly following the meanderings 67 of the shoreline, at a distance of one-half mile therefrom, to a 68 point one-half mile due East of the mouth of Bayou Caddy; thence 69 running due West to the mouth of Bayou Caddy; thence running 70 71 southwesterly following the meanderings of the shoreline to the southernmost point of the Mississippi shoreline on the east bank 72 of the mouth of the Pearl River thence following the meanderings 73 of the east bank of the Pearl River to a point where the east bank 74 75 of the Pearl River intersects the centerline of the Highway 90 bridge; thence westerly along the centerline of the Highway 90 76 bridge to a point that intersects the Mississippi-Louisiana state 77 78 boundary. The redesignation of beacon numbers by the United States Coast Guard shall not alter the description of the boundary 79 80 described in this section.

81 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 82 and after its passage.
