SENATE BILL NO. 2678 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT MAKING AN APPROPRIATION FOR THE PURPOSE OF DEFRAYING 1 THE ADMINISTRATIVE EXPENSES OF THE STATE BOARD FOR COMMUNITY AND 2 3 JUNIOR COLLEGES; FOR THE AID AND SUPPORT OF THE PUBLIC COMMUNITY AND JUNIOR COLLEGES; FOR SUPPORT OF THE EIGHT STATE-SUPPORTED 4 UNIVERSITIES AND PROGRAMS OPERATED BY THOSE UNIVERSITIES; FOR 5 SUPPORT OF STUDENT FINANCIAL AID PROGRAMS; FOR SUPPORT OF THE 6 UNIVERSITY RESEARCH CENTER, THE EDUCATION AND RESEARCH CENTER, THE 7 EXECUTIVE OFFICE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES, THE MISSISSIPPI 8 VOLUNTEER COMMISSION; AND RELATED PROGRAMS; FOR FISCAL YEARS 2003 9 10 AND 2004.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 11 12 SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 13 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the State Board for 14 Community and Junior Colleges for the purpose of defraying the 15 administrative expenses of the Board and for the aid and support 16 of the public community and junior colleges for the fiscal year 17 beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004..... 18\$ 19 118,308,008.00. 20 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 21 Treasury to the credit of the State Board for Community and Junior 22 Colleges, and any other special source funds herein made available 23 to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, for the 24 purpose of defraying the administrative expenses of the Board and 25 for the aid and support of the public community and junior 26 27 colleges for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004\$ 68,249,858.00. 28 SECTION 3. With the funds appropriated under the provisions 90 of this act to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, 91 the following positions are authorized: 92 AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 93 Full Time..... 94 Permanent: 41 95 Part Time.... 1 96 Time-Limited: Full Time..... 0 97 Part Time..... 0 S. B. No. 2678 03/SS26/ANAP2SG

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SECTION 5. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 98 this act and allocated to paying administrative expenses of the 99 State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, funds in the amount 100 101 of Fourteen Million Five Hundred Sixty-three Thousand Four Hundred 102 Thirty-two Dollars (\$14,563,432.00) are provided for the Workforce Education Program and Industrial Training. No funding obligation 103 104 or commitment shall be made on behalf of the state for industrial training beyond the level of funding made available in this 105 All industrial training program commitments made in 106 section. Fiscal Year 2004 and future fiscal years shall be based only upon 107 108 funds available in this section and any proposed commitments shall be approved by the Executive Director of the State Board for 109 Community and Junior Colleges, or the Executive Director's 110 designee prior to such commitment being finalized. 111 Industrial training program commitments shall be made and based only upon 112 training services provided and not for a specific funding amount. 113 Any expenditures of funds authorized in this section are limited 114 115 to obligations made July 1, 2003, or after, and shall not be expended for obligations made prior to this date. 116

117 **SECTION 6.** The funds appropriated under the provisions of 118 this act and allocated for the purpose of hiring nursing and 119 allied health teachers, awarding interest free nursing and allied 120 health student loans, and providing instructional support for the 121 Rural Health Corps shall be allocated as follows:

122 (1) One-half (1/2) divided equally among the fifteen (15)123 public community and junior colleges.

(2) One-half (1/2) divided upon the basis of the number of full-time academic, technical and vocational public community and junior college students actually enrolled and in attendance on the last day of the sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding year counting only those students who reside within the State of Mississippi.

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The public community and junior colleges shall prepare and make available to the Legislature and the Legislative Budget Office an accounting of expenditures and program accomplishments of the Rural Health Corps Program for each of the individual community and junior colleges in a format and manner prescribed by the Legislative Budget Office.

SECTION 7. The funds appropriated under the provisions of this act and allocated for funding life and health insurance for all employees of the public community and junior colleges shall only be used to participate in the State and School Employees' Life and Health Insurance Plan, and any of these funds which are not expended during the fiscal year shall be carried forward for the same purposes during the next succeeding fiscal year.

SECTION 8. A Mississippi Prepaid Affordable College Tuition (MPACT) program beneficiary shall be considered a Mississippi resident for the purposes of participating in funds appropriated herein to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges regardless of the beneficiary's residence on the date of enrollment, as set out in Mississippi Code Annotated, Section 37-155-5(d)(iii).

SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Board of Community and Junior Colleges is hereby authorized to accept, budget and expend funds from any source in an amount not to exceed Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$500,000.00) in accordance with rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 10. The funds appropriated in this act for the aid 157 and support of the public and community junior colleges shall be 158 159 apportioned in accordance with the following assigned weights: 160 Assigned Weight 161 4/5 Headcount 1/5 FTE 162 Formula Section Formula Formula S. In the 4/5 Headcount Formula, such Academic, Technical, and 176 Vocational funds shall be disbursed to such public community and 177 junior colleges on the basis of the full-time enrollment of each 178 such public community and junior college as of the last day of the 179 sixth week of the fall semester or its equivalent of the preceding 180 year, counting only students who reside within the State of 181 182 Mississippi. Part-time academic vocational and technical credit courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time 183 184 equivalency of part-time and summer students, counting only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. 185

Virtual Community College hosted and provided courses may qualify on the basis of the prior year full-time equivalency of virtual community college hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters that did not make a student full-time in the fall semester.

In the 1/5 FTE Formula, such Academic, Technical, Vocational, Associate Degree Nursing and Associate Degree Allied Health funds shall be disbursed on the basis of prior year full-time equivalency (FTE) of hours generated during the summer, fall and spring semesters for each public community and junior college as

of the last day of the sixth week of each semester, or its equivalent, counting only students who reside within the State of Mississippi. However, Associate Degree Nursing students who reside outside the State of Mississippi may be counted for pay purposes.

Of the funds appropriated in this act for the aid and support of the public community and junior colleges, funds up to Six Hundred Ninety-two Thousand Dollars (\$692,000.00) are provided to be set aside as a mechanism to hold harmless those colleges that lose funding in the first year of a five year phase-in implementation period to a full-time equivalency (FTE) funding formula.

The Director of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges, or his designee, shall audit each public community and junior college and shall determine who shall be counted in each college and shall certify the number to the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

213 If, pending determination of the enrollment of students at the public community and junior colleges entitled to participate 214 215 in this appropriation, as provided for in this subsection, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges shall find and 216 217 determine that any such public or community junior college does not have sufficient funds on hand for payment of the necessary 218 expenses of its operation for the period commencing July 1, 2003, 219 220 until distribution of the funds appropriated hereby, then, in that event, the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges is 221 222 expressly authorized to make an advance to any such public community or junior college or colleges not having sufficient 223 operating funds for such period from the funds appropriated 224 225 hereby; provided, however, that the amount of any such advance to any one public community or junior college shall not exceed 226 227 thirty-three percent (33%) of the amount of state appropriated funds received by such public community or junior college during 228

the preceding fiscal year; and provided, further, that the amount of any such advance shall be deducted from the pro rata part of the funds appropriated hereby accruing to said public community or junior college when enrollment has been ascertained and distribution of funds is made.

SECTION 11. No part of the amount herein appropriated for the aid and support of public community and junior colleges shall be used by the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges for administrative or other purposes except in the manner and to the extent authorized in the act making an appropriation for the expenses of the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges.

SECTION 12. The following public community and junior colleges which qualify shall participate in the funds provided in this act for the aid and support of public community and junior colleges:

Coahoma Community College, Copiah-Lincoln Community College, 244 East Central Community College, East Mississippi Community 245 246 College, Hinds Community College District, Holmes Community College, Itawamba Community College, Jones County Junior College, 247 248 Meridian Community College, Mississippi Delta Community College, Mississippi Gulf Coast Community College District, Northeast 249 250 Mississippi Community College, Northwest Mississippi Community 251 College, Pearl River Community College, and Southwest Mississippi 252 Community College.

253 SECTION 13. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 254 255 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of 256 257 support, maintenance, and repairs at the state-supported 258 institutions of higher learning, those being Mississippi State University, University of Mississippi, Mississippi University for 259 260 Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State University, 261 Alcorn State University, Jackson State University, and Mississippi

Valley State University, and programs operated by those institutions; for support of student financial aid programs authorized by law; for support of the University Research Center, the Education and Research Center, the Executive Office of the Board of Trustees, the Mississippi Volunteer Commission; and related programs, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004\$ 469,946,479.00.

SECTION 14. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 269 270 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Board of Trustees of State 271 272 Institutions of Higher Learning or any institution or program administered by the Board; and out of the proceeds from any 273 federal, student fees or other special source funds, not otherwise 274 appropriated, to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 275 Higher Learning for the purpose of support of the state-supported 276 institutions of higher learning, those being Mississippi State 277 University, University of Mississippi, Mississippi University for 278 279 Women, University of Southern Mississippi, Delta State University, Alcorn State University, Jackson State University, and Mississippi 280 281 Valley State University, and programs operated by those institutions; for support of student financial aid programs 282 283 authorized by law; for support of the University Research Center, the Education and Research Center, the Executive Office of the 284 Board of Trustees, the Mississippi Volunteer Commission; and 285 286 related programs, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004\$1,025,003,324.00. 287 288 SECTION 15. Upon the Ayers Settlement Agreement becoming 450 451 final and effective according to its terms (including, but not limited to, the exhaustion of all rights to appeal), it is the 452 intention of the Legislature that the Five Million Dollars 453 (\$5,000,000.00) appropriated in this act from the Ayers Settlement 454 Fund, created by House Bill No. 1471, 2001 Regular Session, is 455 456 hereby authorized for use by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for the purpose of establishing an 457 458 Ayers settlement endowment fund to comply with the Settlement 459 Agreement in the case of Ayers v. 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SECTION 17. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 460 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following 461 amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be expended 462 463 by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning 464 for the purpose of defraying the costs associated with Ayers-related programs at Alcorn State University, Jackson State 465 University and Mississippi Valley State University; interest on 466 467 the Ayers Endowment Fund and any other Ayers-related activities 468 associated with the implementation of the Remedial Decree of the District Courts.....\$ 14,246,000.00. 469

470 SECTION 18. It is the intention of the Legislature that upon 471 the Ayers Settlement Agreement becoming final and effective 472 according to its terms (including, but not limited to, the 473 exhaustion of all rights to appeal), funds necessary to comply 474 with the Ayers Settlement Agreement shall be appropriated in the 475 next Legislative Session.

SECTION 19. It is the intent of the Legislature that the 476 477 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall allocate funds to the off-campus centers based on a minimum rate 478 479 of sixty-five percent (65%) of the on-campus cost of a full-time equivalent student. The on-campus distribution is to be 480 481 determined without regard to the costs incurred by any one or more 482 of them in the operation of off-campus degree completing centers' classes. Off-campus centers which are operated jointly by two (2) 483 484 or more institutions, the amount allocated to such centers shall be prorated among the institutions jointly operating such centers 485 486 based on the full-time equivalent enrollment of such centers.

The board of trustees shall insure that the off-campus centers are not charged with any indirect or overhead cost prorated from any on-campus activity. It is the intent of the Legislature that the on-campus operations charge the off-campus centers with only actual direct charges.

492 SECTION 20. Of the State General Funds provided herein to 493 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for 494 the general support and maintenance of the state-supported 495 institutions, the amount of One Hundred Fifty-seven Thousand Five 496 Hundred Dollars (\$157,500.00) shall be used for the promotion and 497 expenses of the Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted and 498 Talented.

Provided, however, that the Board of Trustees of State 499 Institutions of Higher Learning shall develop the governing policy 500 for faculty, course content and facilities selection on a 501 502 competitive basis from all Mississippi senior colleges and universities. The Mississippi Governor's School for the Gifted 503 504 and Talented shall accept not less than one (1) high school 505 student nominee from each accredited high school in Mississippi. 506 The nominees, selected under criteria developed and adopted by the 507 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, shall 508 be provided a three-week tuition-free program.

The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall compile and publish the report of the statewide evaluation committee on the leadership impact of graduates of this school. This report is to be a continuing study on the youthful leadership of the state.

514 SECTION 21. Of the State General Funds provided herein to 515 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for 516 the general support and maintenance of the state-supported 517 institutions, the amount of Two Hundred Twenty-five Thousand 518 Dollars (\$225,000.00) shall be used for the promotion and expenses 519 of the Teacher Corps.

520 SECTION 22. Of the State General Funds provided herein to 521 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for 522 the general support and maintenance of the state-supported 523 institutions, the following amounts shall be used as set forth: 524 (a) For Mississippi State University as interest

540	SECTION 23. Of the funds provided herein for support of the
541	Gulf Coast Research Laboratory, the Board of Trustees of State

543	matching One Hundred Seventy-five Thousand Dollars (\$175,000.00)

544 for the Fiscal Year 2004.

Provided further, it is the intention of the Legislature, in 545 the event budget reductions are imposed on the Gulf Coast Research 546 Laboratory by the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 547 Higher Learning, as a result of the Governor ordering budget 548 549 reductions under the provisions of Section 27-104-13 or 31-17-123, 550 Mississippi Code of 1972, the same percent reduction will be applied to those state funds identified in this section for Sea 551 552 Grant match.

553 **SECTION 24**. It is the intention of the Legislature that 554 after the Mississippi State Chemical Laboratory has provided the 555 maximum amount of services which may be provided free of charge 556 under the provisions of Section 57-21-11(c), Mississippi Code of 557 1972, the laboratory shall not provide any additional services

from the funds provided herein for the laboratory's support if any charges for such services previously provided are more than ninety (90) days past due. After all such delinquent charges have been paid by a client, the laboratory may provide additional services to the client.

563 SECTION 25. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 564 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall 565 ensure that none of the funds apportioned in this act for the 566 Out-of-State Educational Program shall be paid to or for the 567 benefit of any student who enters a school outside the State of 568 Mississippi for the first time, subsequent to July 1, 1982, in any 569 discipline in the fields of medicine or dentistry.

570 SECTION 26. It is the intention of the Legislature that of 571 the State General Funds provided herein for financial aid programs authorized by law, the Board of Trustees of the State Institutions 572 573 of Higher Learning shall expend from the support of the out-of-state graduate and professional studies program an amount 574 575 not exceeding the funding necessary, contingent upon the availability of qualified applicants, for ten (10) new entering 576 577 optometry students and the number of returning optometry students who received funding under the program during the preceding school 578 579 year; for ten (10) new entering chiropractic students, with not more than twenty-five (25) chiropractic students overall; and 580 seven (7) new entering osteopathic medical students and the number 581 582 of returning osteopathic medical students who received funding under the program during the preceding school year, for these 583 584 courses of study.

585 SECTION 27. In the allocation of funds provided herein to 586 the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning for 587 financial aid programs authorized by law, it is the intention of 588 the Legislature that priority shall be given and funds shall be 589 first allocated to all students eligible for financial aid under

590 the provisions of Sections 37-107-1 through 37-107-7 and Sections 591 37-108-1 through 37-108-5, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 28. It is the intention of the Legislature that all 592 593 funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State 594 Institutions of Higher Learning for financial aid programs authorized by law shall be accounted for in a detailed statement 595 showing when, to whom, and for what purpose applied, and this 596 statement shall be submitted at the next regular session of the 597 Legislature within ten (10) days after the convening thereof. A 598 report of loans made and receipt of repayment of loans to the fund 599 600 shall be reported. The amount of repayment that is in arrears shall also be included. Such report shall include the number of 601 602 students at each institution receiving financial assistance and 603 the amount of such assistance, and an estimate of the financial requirement of the various loan programs for the next year. 604 No 605 public or private institution of higher learning receiving funds under the respective provisions of this act, for the purpose of 606 607 issuing scholarship grants or loans, shall issue any official transcripts for any persons who have any amount of repayment in 608 609 arrears on that date such official transcript is requested.

Furthermore, all such funds received and expended shall be reported and otherwise accounted for in accordance with the provisions of Section 37-143-21, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 29. It is the intention of the Legislature that all 613 614 fees charged and collected by the University Research Center for services provided by the Mississippi Automated Resource 615 Information System (MARIS) shall be deposited in a special fund to 616 be known as the "Mississippi Automated Resource Information System 617 (MARIS) Revolving Fund." All monies in the revolving fund shall 618 be used by MARIS exclusively for the support of MARIS projects and 619 620 activities.

621 **SECTION 30.** With the funds provided herein for the support 622 of the University of Mississippi Medical Center, the following

623 shall be maintained: the School of Medicine, the School of 624 Dentistry, the School of Nursing, the School of Health Related 625 Professions, the Teaching Hospital and the Medical Center Service 626 Area. The University of Mississippi Medical Center shall prepare 627 and make available to the Legislature an accounting of 628 expenditures for each of the divisions listed in this section at 629 the beginning of the legislative session.

630 **SECTION 31.** Due to critical nurse shortages and staffing, it 631 is the intent of the Legislature to enhance recognition of 632 excellence and expand the experience factor in attracting 633 gualified registered nurses.

SECTION 32. Of the funds provided herein for the University 634 635 of Mississippi Medical Center, none may be used to provide medical services on behalf of any state agency, institution or political 636 subdivision, except to the extent that such agency, institution or 637 political subdivision reimburses the hospital for the cost of the 638 services provided. Upon the rendering of medical services to any 639 640 such agency, institution or political subdivision, the hospital 641 shall issue an invoice for the charges which shall be paid within 642 ninety (90) days. In the event that payment is not made within 643 ninety (90) days, the hospital shall discontinue providing 644 services to that agency, institution, or political subdivision until all outstanding charges have been paid. 645

646 **SECTION 33.** With the funds provided herein to the 647 Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service, it is the intention of 648 the Legislature that the Mississippi Cooperative Extension Service 649 provide programs in the emphasis areas of Agriculture, Home 650 Economics, 4-H, and Community Resource Development in each county.

651 SECTION 34. It is the intention of the Legislature that of 652 the funds provided herein for the Alcorn State University 653 Agricultural Programs, none shall be used for the purpose of 654 defraying the expenses of the Agribusiness Council.

655 **SECTION 35.** It is the intention of the Legislature that of 656 the funds provided herein for the Alcorn State University 657 Agricultural Programs, an amount of Two Hundred Thousand Dollars 658 (\$200,000.00) shall be used for the Mississippi Natural Products 659 Association, Incorporated.

660 **SECTION 36.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 661 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall 662 first use special funds to the greatest extent possible to defray 663 the costs of providing remediation at the state-supported 664 institutions of higher learning.

665 SECTION 37. It is the intention of the Legislature that none 666 of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State 667 Institutions of Higher Learning shall be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or necessary for performing any of 668 the powers or duties of the Board of Trustees of State 669 Institutions of Higher Learning, or any of the powers or duties of 670 any institution under the jurisdiction of the board of trustees, 671 672 that are authorized by the Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules or regulations that implement state or 673 674 federal law.

675 SECTION 38. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 676 Higher Learning shall submit to the Committee on Appropriations of 677 both houses of the Mississippi Legislature by January 1, 2004, a consolidated report for all the several institutions under its 678 679 jurisdiction, on forms and in a manner to be prescribed by the Legislative Budget Committee, which reflects the anticipated 680 current restricted fund revenues for the 2004 fiscal year, and the 681 budgeted use of such current restricted funds by major object 682 category. For purposes of this section, the term "current 683 684 restricted funds" shall be defined as those public funds available for financing university operations which are limited by the 685 686 donor, or by an agency external to the Board of Trustees of State 687 Institutions of Higher Learning, to specific purposes, programs,

691 SECTION 39. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 692 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning 693 continue to review, and eliminate when possible, duplicating 694 programs and degrees in the existing institutions of higher 695 learning in this state.

SECTION 40. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 696 Board of Trustees of State Institutions shall ensure that no state 697 698 appropriations or student tuition and fee receipts, except those specifically charged for the provision of the services, shall be 699 700 used to support auxiliary enterprises, with the exception of 701 intercollegiate athletics at a level designated by the board of trustees. It is the intent of the Legislature that auxiliary 702 703 enterprises shall be self-supporting; and that deficits not be 704 taken from funds intended for instruction and academic programs.

705 SECTION 41. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State 706 707 Institutions of Higher Learning shall be spent to defray tuition 708 cost or subsidize in any way the direct cost of education, 709 ordinarily paid by the student, of any nonresident alien enrolled in any state-supported institution of higher learning in the State 710 of Mississippi. However, this will not apply to any nonresident 711 712 alien student if the United States has a reciprocal agreement with their country on subsidizing the education of a United States 713 714 citizen student.

715 SECTION 42. The Board of Trustees of State Institutions of 716 Higher Learning shall report yearly to the Legislature the 717 institution compliance with Section 97-11-51, Mississippi Code of 718 1972, which prohibits deficit spending.

719 **SECTION 43.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the 720 Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall

ensure that any funds appropriated pursuant to this act and paid as a fee to or deposited in a financial institution shall be in compliance with Section 109 of the Constitution of the State of Mississippi and Section 25-4-103, Mississippi Code of 1972.

SECTION 44. It is the intention of the Legislature that none of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended for increased charges for State Employee and Teacher Health Insurance premium rates assessed by the Department of Finance and Administration in excess of the Fiscal Year 2003 premium rates for the health insurance plan.

731 **SECTION 45.** It is the intention of the Legislature that no 732 State General Funds authorized to be expended in this act shall be 733 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are 734 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this 735 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

736 SECTION 46. It is the intention of the Legislature that the State Board for Community and Junior Colleges and the Board of 737 738 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning shall maintain complete accounting and personnel records related to the 739 740 expenditure of all funds appropriated under the provisions of this act and that such records shall be in the same format and level of 741 details as maintained for Fiscal Year 2003. It is further the 742 743 intention of the Legislature that the budget requests for Fiscal Year 2005 shall be submitted to the Joint Legislative Budget 744 745 Committee in a format and level of detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided during the Fiscal Year 2004 budget 746 747 request process.

748 SECTION 47. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 749 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following 750 amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be expended 751 to defray the costs of the Center for Advanced Vehicular Studies 752 at Mississippi State University......\$ 3,500,000.00.

SECTION 48. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be provided to the Mississippi Military Communities Council to assist in consulting efforts associated with Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC)......\$ 200,000.00.

SECTION 49. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated equally to Jackson State University, Mississippi State University, the University of Mississippi, and the University of Southern Mississippi for economic development, reorganization, and reallocation efforts at those universities..... \$ 2,000,000.00.

SECTION 50. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated to Mississippi State University - Meridian Branch......\$ 200,000.00.

771 SECTION 51. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 772 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following 773 amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be allocated 774 to the University of Southern Mississippi for economic development 775 initiatives.....\$ 100,000.00.

SECTION 52. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, it is the intention of the Legislature that the following amount, or so much thereof as may be necessary, shall be provided to establish a Director of Nursing and Health Care Programs at the Executive Office of the Board of Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning...... \$ 150,000.00.

783 **SECTION 53.** Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 784 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, it is the 785 intention of the Legislature that the following amount, or so much

thereof as may be necessary, shall be provided to Jackson State
University for transfer to the Mississippi Technology Alliance,
and this amount shall be in addition to any amount allocated to
Jackson State University for the support of on-campus and offcampus operations......\$ 500,000.00.

791 SECTION 54. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 792 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, it is the 793 intention of the Legislature that the following amount, or so much 794 thereof as may be necessary, shall be provided to the Delta State 795 University Department of Commercial Aviation...... \$ 50,000.00.

796 SECTION 55. Of the funds provided herein to the Board of 797 Trustees of State Institutions of Higher Learning, the following 798 amount shall be allocated to the Greenville Higher Education 799 Center......\$ 250,000.00.

SECTION 56. It is the intention of the Legislature that the Presidents of Jackson State University, Mississippi State University, the University of Mississippi, and the University of Southern Mississippi may transfer funds of the subsidiary budgets at each university in an amount not to exceed five percent (5%) of the authorized budgets of each subsidiary budget to another subsidiary budget or to the general support of the university.

SECTION 57. In addition to all other sums heretofore appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of the Budget Contingency Fund for the purpose of assisting the Mississippi Military Communities Council in consulting efforts for Base Realignment and Closure (BRAC) for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003....... 813\$ 83,333.00.

814 **SECTION 58**. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by 815 the State Treasurer out of any money in the proper fund or funds 816 as set forth in this act, upon warrants issued by the State Fiscal 817 Officer; and the State Fiscal Officer shall issue his warrants

818 upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers 819 in the manner provided by law.

820 **SECTION 59**. This act shall take effect and be in force from 821 and after July 1, 2003, except that Section 57 shall take effect 822 and be in force from and after its passage.
