SENATE BILL NO. 2709 (As Sent to Governor)

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 27-19-56, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT AN APPLICANT FOR A SPECIAL LICENSE PLATE FOR 3 DISABLED PERSONS $\underline{\text{MUST HAVE}}$ A DISABILITY THAT WILL IMPAIR HIS ABILITY TO WALK FOR AT LEAST FIVE YEARS; TO PROVIDE THAT REMOVABLE WINDSHIELD PLACARDS FOR DISABLED PERSONS SHALL BE VALID FOR THE 4 5 PERIOD OF TIME THAT THE LICENSE TAG ATTACHED ON A MOTOR VEHICLE IS 6 ISSUED; TO PROVIDE THAT SUCH PLACARDS MUST BE DISPLAYED ON THE 7 LEFT SIDE OF THE VEHICLE DASHBOARD OR BY HANGING IT FROM THE REARVIEW MIRROR OF THE VEHICLE; TO AUTHORIZE ANY OWNER OF PROPERTY TO TOW AWAY A VEHICLE PARKED ON PRIVATE PROPERTY IN 8 9 10 VIOLATION OF THE DISABLED PARKING RESTRICTIONS ESTABLISHED UNDER 11 THIS SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 12 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:

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- SECTION 1. Section 27-19-56, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 14
- 27-19-56. (1) Upon application by any legal resident of the 16
- State of Mississippi with a disability which limits or impairs the 17
- ability to walk, the State Tax Commission shall prepare and issue 18
- through the county tax collectors a special license plate bearing 19
- the International Symbol of Access adopted by Rehabilitation 20
- International in 1969 at its Eleventh World Congress on 21
- Rehabilitation of the Disabled for not more than one (1) vehicle 22
- that is registered in the applicant's name. The initial 23
- application shall be accompanied by the certification of a 24
- licensed physician that (a) the applicant meets the definition of 25
- persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to 26
- walk; and (b) that the physician has determined that the applicant 27
- will have the disability for at least five (5) years. The State 28
- Tax Commission shall prepare and issue to the tax collectors of 29
- 30 the various counties, decals for placement on the special license
- plates. The decals shall bear thereon the month in which the 31
- license plate was issued and the year in which the special license 32

- 33 plate will expire. The special license plate issued under this
- 34 section is valid for the period of time that the license tag
- 35 attached upon a motor vehicle is issued pursuant to Section
- 36 27-19-31(1). A person to whom the special license plate is issued
- 37 may retain the special license plate and may renew it by
- 38 submitting to the county tax collector, on or before its
- 39 expiration, the certification of a licensed physician that the
- 40 physician has determined (a) that the applicant meets the
- 41 definition of a person with a disability which limits or impairs
- 42 the ability to walk; and (b) that the applicant will have the
- 43 disability for at least five (5) years. If an applicant fails to
- 44 renew the special license plate before its date of expiration,
- 45 then he shall surrender the special license plate to the county
- 46 tax collector and the tax collector shall issue to such person a
- 47 regular license plate to replace the special license plate.
- The terms "vehicle" and "motor vehicle," as used in this
- 49 section, includes motorcycles.
- The term "persons with disabilities which limit or impair the
- 51 ability to walk" when used in this section means those persons
- 52 who, as determined by a licensed physician:
- 53 (a) Cannot walk two hundred (200) feet without stopping
- 54 to rest; or
- (b) Cannot walk without the use of, or assistance from,
- 56 a brace, cane, crutch, another person, prosthetic device,
- 57 wheelchair, or other assistive device; or
- (c) Are restricted by lung disease to such an extent
- 59 that the person's forced (respiratory) expiratory volume for one
- 60 (1) second, when measured by spirometry, is less than one (1)
- 61 liter, or the arterial oxygen tension is less than sixty (60)
- 62 mm/hg on room air at rest; or
- (d) Use portable oxygen; or
- (e) Have a cardiac condition to the extent that the
- 65 person's functional limitations are classified in severity as

- 66 Class III or Class IV according to standards set by the American
- 67 Heart Association; or
- (f) Are severely limited in their ability to walk due
- 69 to an arthritic, neurological or orthopedic condition.
- 70 An applicant for a special license plate bearing the
- 71 International Symbol of Access shall not be required to pay any
- 72 fee or charge for the issuance of such license plate separate from
- 73 or in addition to the road and bridge privilege taxes, ad valorem
- 74 taxes and registration fees otherwise required by law to be paid
- 75 for the issuance of a regular license plate for such vehicle.
- 76 (2) The State Tax Commission shall prepare removable
- 77 windshield placards and such placards shall be issued and
- 78 periodically renewed upon the applications of persons with
- 79 disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The
- 80 placards shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through
- 81 the offices of the tax collectors of the counties. The initial
- 82 application shall be accompanied by the certification of a
- 83 licensed physician that the applicant meets the definition of
- 84 persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to
- 85 walk. These placards shall be valid for the period of * * * time
- 86 that the license tag attached upon a motor vehicle is issued
- 97 pursuant to Section 27-19-31(1) and may be renewed in the same
- 88 manner as provided for the renewal of the special license plates
- 89 under subsection (1) of this section. The removable windshield
- 90 placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle
- 91 <u>dashboard</u> or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle.
- 92 The State Tax Commission shall prescribe the placement for
- 93 motorcycles.
- 94 (3) The State Tax Commission shall provide for the issuance
- 95 of a temporary removable windshield placard, upon the application
- 96 of a person with a disability which limits or impairs the ability
- 97 to walk. Temporary removable windshield placards authorized by
- 98 this subsection shall be prepared by the State Tax Commission and

- shall be issued, free of charge, to applicants through the offices 99 100 of the tax collectors of the counties. Application for a temporary removable windshield placard must be accompanied by the 101 102 certification of a licensed physician that the applicant meets the 103 definition of persons with disabilities which limit or impair the ability to walk. The certification shall also include the period 104 of time that the physician determines the applicant will have the 105 disability, not to exceed six (6) months. The temporary removable 106 107 windshield placard must be displayed on the left side of the vehicle dashboard or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the 108 109 The temporary removable windshield placard shall be valid for a period of time for which the physician has determined 110 111 that the applicant will have the disability, not to exceed six (6) months from the date of issuance. The State Tax Commission shall 112 prescribe the placement for motorcycles. 113
- 114 (4) The removable windshield placard and the temporary 115 removable windshield placard shall be two-sided and shall include:
- 116 (a) The International Symbol of Access, which is at
 117 least three (3) inches in height, centered on the placard (the
 118 color of the removable windshield placard shall be white on a blue
 119 shield; and the temporary removable windshield placard shall be
 120 white on a red shield);
- 121 (b) An identification number and, on the reverse side, 122 the name of the individual to whom the placard is issued;
- 123 (c) A date of expiration * * *; and
- 124 (d) The seal of the State of Mississippi.
- 125 (5) (a) It shall be unlawful to park a motor vehicle in an area set aside for persons who are disabled if the motor vehicle does not (i) have displayed the removable windshield placard authorized in this section, (ii) have the special license plate issued under this section properly displayed upon the motor vehicle, or (iii) have the disabled American veteran tag or plate
- issued under Section 27-19-53 properly displayed upon the motor

vehicle. Any person who unlawfully parks a motor vehicle in such 132 133 areas, or who blocks such spaces or access thereto, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction thereof, shall be 134 135 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00) for each such 136 violation. For the third and subsequent offenses under this section, the offender's driver's license shall be suspended for 137 ninety (90) days by the Commissioner of Public Safety in 138 accordance with Section 63-1-53 in addition to any fine imposed. 139 140 The court shall not suspend or reduce any fine required to be imposed under this subsection. 141

- 142 A person who is charged with a violation of this section by parking a motor vehicle in an area set aside for 143 144 persons who are disabled and failing properly to display (i) a 145 removable windshield placard on the dash of the vehicle or by hanging it on the rearview mirror of the vehicle, (ii) a special 146 147 license plate issued under this section upon the vehicle or (iii) a disabled American veteran tag or plate issued under Section 148 149 27-19-53 upon the vehicle shall not be convicted and shall have the charge dismissed upon presentation to the court of proof by 150 151 means of sworn oral testimony or sworn affidavit that at the time of the charged violation he or a passenger in the vehicle 152 153 possessed a valid removable windshield placard issued under this 154 section.
- 155 (6) Any person who, for the purpose of obtaining a special
 156 license plate or windshield placard under this section, files with
 157 the county tax collector a physician's certification, knowing the
 158 certification to be false or to have been fraudulently obtained,
 159 shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be
 160 fined not more than Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00).
- (7) All law enforcement officers are authorized to enforce
 this section on public and private property. Provision of spaces
 restricted to handicapped parking and proper marking of such
 spaces shall be considered as intent and permission to enforce
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such designated parking on private property. Any owner of private 165 property may tow away a vehicle that is parked on the owner's 166 private property in violation of the disabled parking restrictions 167 168 set forth in this section at the vehicle owner's expense. In 169 addition, the vehicle owner may be subject to any fines or other 170 penalties provided in this section. Only areas marked in accordance with the Americans with Disabilities Act Accessibility 171 Guidelines or equivalent standards shall be enforced. Spaces 172 173 shall bear the International Symbol of Access.

- (8) Motor vehicles displaying a special license plate, license plate decal, placard or parking certificate or permit bearing the International Symbol of Access issued to a person with a disability by any other state or district subject to the laws of the United States shall be allowed the special parking privileges under this section provided the license plate, decal, placard, permit or certificate bears the International Symbol of Access and is displayed in a prominent place on the vehicle.
- (9) Parking in any area set aside for persons who are
 disabled is limited to vehicles which, immediately before or after
 the utilization of such an area, are used to transport a person
 with a disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk.

 The identification required to park in such an area, except as
 provided in subsection (8) of this section, is as follows:
 - (a) For a vehicle used to transport a person with a permanent disability, that person's permanent windshield placard must be displayed or the vehicle must have a special license tag issued under this section or Section 27-19-53 properly displayed.
- 192 (b) For a vehicle being used by a person who has a

 193 temporary disability which limits or impairs the ability to walk,

 194 or which is being used to transport such a person, a temporary

 195 windshield placard must be displayed.



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196	Any person who parks in an area set aside for persons who are
197	disabled in violation of this subsection shall be punished as
198	provided for in subsection (5) of this section.
199	(10) Upon application by a nursing home, retirement home or
200	other institution that transports disabled persons, the State Tax
201	Commission may issue the special license plate authorized pursuant
202	to this section for not more than one (1) vehicle that is
203	registered in the applicant's name that is used to transport
204	disabled residents of the institution. Such institution shall
205	comply with all other laws regarding the registration of such
