8	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
9	SECTION 1. (1) There is hereby created the statewide task
10	force on local government information systems. The task force
11	shall consist of the following members:
12	(a) The Executive Director of the Department of
13	Information Technology Services;
14	(b) The Executive Director of the Administrative Office
15	of Courts;
16	(c) The Executive Director of the Department of
17	Environmental Quality;
18	(d) The Secretary of State, or his designee;
19	(e) The Chairman of the State Tax Commission, or his
20	designee;
21	(f) The Executive Director of the Mississippi Automated
22	Resource Information System;
23	(g) The State Auditor, or his designee;
24	(h) The Commissioner of Public Safety;
25	(i) The Executive Director of the Emergency Management
26	Agency;
27	(j) One (1) member of the Mississippi Chancery Clerks'
28	Association, appointed by the president of the association;

(k) One (1) member of the Mississippi Circuit Clerks' 29 30 Association, appointed by the president of the association; (1) One (1) member of the Mississippi Association of 31 32 Supervisors, appointed by the president of the association; 33 (m) One (1) member of the Tax Assessors' and Collectors' Association, appointed by the president of the 34 association; 35 One (1) member appointed by the Mississippi 36 (n) Sheriffs' Association, appointed by the presiding officer of the 37 38 association; 39 (o) Two (2) citizen members, appointed by the Governor; One (1) member of the Mississippi House of 40 (p) 41 Representatives, appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives; 42 One (1) member of the Mississippi State Senate, (q) 43 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor; 44 One (1) member appointed by the Mississippi 45 (r) 46 Association of Planning and Development Districts; and The Executive Director of the Local Government 47 (g)48 Records Office, Department of Archives and History. (2)The Executive Director of the Administrative Office of 49 Courts shall serve as the chairman of the task force. No 50 appointed member shall have a material financial interest in any 51 business that sells, distributes or manufactures computer 52 53 software, hardware or any telecommunications services. Nonlegislative members shall serve without salary or per 54 (3) diem compensation; however, all members shall be entitled to 55 actual travel expenses as provided for in Section 25-3-41. 56 Legislative members shall be entitled to per diem as 57 (4) authorized in Section 25-3-69 and a mileage and expense allowance 58 as authorized in Section 5-1-47. 59

S. B. No. 2736 03/SS02/R607CS PAGE 2 60 <u>SECTION 2.</u> (1) The task force shall develop a report to the 61 Department of Information Technology Services to be delivered no 62 later than October 1, 2003. This report shall address at minimum:

(a) A description of the current condition of
information technology services available to the public in the
offices of the chancery clerks, circuit clerks, tax assessors and
tax collectors of the State of Mississippi;

(b) Recommendations on the hardware and software needs
to create user-friendly, uniform systems for public access to
court records, land records, tax records and all other public
documents maintained by chancery clerks, circuit clerks, tax
assessors and tax collectors in all counties of the state;

(c) Recommendations or comments regarding system compatibility and economy of those systems being developed under the Secretary of State's authority to develop and implement a statewide voter registration system, as required by Congress in PL-107-252;

(d) Recommendations or comments on any initiative to
establish and implement a uniform Geographic Information System
(GIS) in each county of the state;

80 (e) Recommendations on methods of funding software,
81 hardware and telecommunications acquisitions necessary for each
82 county to comply with the task force recommendations; and

83 (f) Recommendations for the use of world wide web-based
84 systems for accessing the public information systems recommended
85 in paragraph (b).

86 (2) To carry out the responsibilities for in this act, the
87 task force shall have the authority to cooperate and establish a
88 liaison with the Advisory Committee created to assist the
89 Secretary of State in development statewide voter registration
90 systems. The task force shall also have the authority to
91 cooperate and establish a liaison with any statewide task force

No. 2736 03/SS02/R607CS PAGE 3 that may be established to devise or recommend standards for the 92 implementation of statewide Geographic Information Systems (GIS). 93 Upon receipt of the task force's report, the Department 94 (3) of Information Technology Services shall review the report and 95 96 make recommendations to the Legislature no later than December 15, 2003, regarding legislation that would be necessary to implement 97 the recommendations of the task force.

The chairman of the task force shall have the authority (4) 99 to request staff support from any state agency enumerated in 100 Section 1 of this act to assist the task force in carrying out its 101 102 responsibilities under this act.

SECTION 3. Sections 1 through 3 of this act shall stand 103 repealed from and after June 30, 2004. 104

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105 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 106 and after its passage.
