SENATE BILL NO. 2854

AN ACT TO ESTABLISH A MISSISSIPPI COMMISSION ON DISABILITY 1 AND PROVIDE FOR ITS MEMBERSHIP; TO PRESCRIBE THE POWERS AND DUTIES 2 3 OF THE COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. SECTION 1. The following terms shall have the meaning 4 ascribed herein, unless the context shall otherwise require: 5 (a) "Commission" means the Mississippi Commission on 6 Disability (MCD). 7 8 (b) "Director" means the Director of the Mississippi Commission on Disability. 9 "People with disabilities" means individuals who (C) 10 have physical, sensory, cognitive or mental characteristics such 11 as those listed under the definition of "handicapped person" in 12 13 regular 28CFR 41.31(b) for the implementation of Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended (Public Law 93-112). 14 15 SECTION 2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Commission on Disability (MCD) to promote and facilitate the full 16 participation of, an the creation and assurance of equal 17 18 opportunities for, all people with disabilities. The goals and objectives of the Mississippi Commission 19 (2) on Disability shall include, but are not limited to or provided in 20 21 any priority order, the following: (a) To be a comprehensive clearinghouse of information 22 for people with disabilities related to potential service programs 23 (including contact points, eligibility criteria, service scope, 24 budgets, waiting list), disability rights and relevant events. 25 26 (b) To serve as a disability minority advocate to 27 identify the issues and concerns pertaining to the rights, needs

31 (c) To collect, analyze and synthesize 32 disability-related data (e.g., numbers and types of disability, in 33 the state, their economic/school/employment/long-term care status) 34 for use by state agencies, universities and colleges, disability 35 organizations and private citizens.

(d) To advise the Governor, the Legislature, the
Mississippi congressional delegation, state agencies, the business
community, organized labor and other public and private groups and
the general public on disability issues and concerns, and to make
recommendations to address those identified matters, with emphasis
on increasing opportunities for independence and employment.

42 (e) To coordinate and conduct public relations
43 activities to spotlight the skills and capabilities of people with
44 disabilities to emphasize the actual and potential contributions
45 of people with disabilities.

(f) To establish such relationship with state agencies,
especially those that serve the disability community,
consumer/advocacy groups, local governments, private industry,
educational institutions, labor and other private organizations,
as may be needed to enhance equal opportunities for persons with
disabilities.

52 (g) To submit an annual report to the Governor and the 53 Legislature which will provide:

54 (i) Recommendations to address the unmet needs of55 people with disabilities in Mississippi;

56 (ii) An overall state government/private sector
57 service overview of programs and services for people with
58 disabilities in Mississippi;

(iii) Information on public and private groups
which are providing equal opportunities for persons with
disabilities.

(h) To carry out activities assigned by the Commission,
to further the mission of the Mississippi Commission on Disability
and the quality of life of citizens with disabilities.

SECTION 3. The Mississippi Commission on Disability 65 (1) shall consist of eleven (11) members: (a) five (5) members 66 appointed by the Governor, one (1) from each Mississippi 67 congressional district and one (1) from the state at large; (b) 68 69 three (3) members appointed by the Lieutenant Governor from the state at large; and (c) three (3) members appointed by the Speaker 70 71 of the House of Representatives from the state at large. The membership of the Commission on Disability shall at all times 72 constitute at least a majority of people with disabilities. 73 Members who are disabled shall be diversed in terms of race, 74 geography, and disability characteristics. Two (2) members of the 75 76 full commission membership shall be the immediate family members of persons with disabilities, at least one (1) of which shall be a 77 78 parent.

79 The members of the Mississippi Commission on Disability shall 80 serve terms of office as follows:

81 (a) The term of the member from the First Congressional
82 District shall expire on July 1, 2005;

(b) The term of the member from the Second
Congressional District shall expire on July 1, 2006;

85 (c) The term of the member from the Third Congressional86 District shall expire on July 1, 2007;

87 (d) The term of the member from the Fourth
88 Congressional District shall expire on July 2008; and
89 (e) The term of the members from the state at large

90 shall expire on July 1, 2008.

Any appointment to a vacancy shall be for the 93 unexpired term in question, and from the congressional district in 94 which such vacancy occurred. No member shall, during his term of 95 office, serve as an officer or committee member of any political 96 party organization.

The Mississippi Commission on Disability shall elect a 97 (2) chair person from its membership at the first meeting of the 98 original commission members and every two (2) years thereafter on 99 July 15 of the year. A majority of the membership of the 100 101 commission shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of any business, and the commission shall meet at least quarterly and 102 103 hold other meetings as are necessary for the purpose of conducting required business. All meetings of the commission shall be called 104 by the chairperson, except the first meeting of the original 105 106 commission members, which shall be called by the Governor.

107 (3) The appointed members of the commission shall be
108 compensated at a per diem rate as authorized by Section 25-3-69,
109 plus actual and necessary expenses as authorized by Section
110 25-3-41.

(4) The Mississippi Commission on Disability shall include a 111 112 director appointed by the Governor and confirmed by the Senate, who shall employ necessary support staff not to exceed four (4) 113 The staffing of the Commission on Disabilities may also 114 persons. 115 be supplemented by use of interns and volunteers from the community. The Commission staff will use the following 116 classifications for selection: The Director shall meet the 117 qualifications and be paid per the job classification of a 118 Division Director II per the Mississippi State Personnel Board. 119 Any administration staff shall meet the qualifications and be paid 120 per the job classification of a Division Director I per the 121 122 Mississippi State Personnel Board. Any secretarial staff shall meet the qualifications and be paid per the job classification of 123

(5) The State Department of Rehabilitation Services, the 126 127 Department of Human Services, the State Department of Education, 128 the State Department of Health, the State Department of Mental Health, the Department of Medicaid and advocates necessary to 129 130 enable the Mississippi Commission on Disability to carry out the work of this entity may participate on the commission as nonvoting 131 These representatives may provide the commission, with 132 members. data, input and resources to facilitate their planning and 133 134 coordinating efforts. It shall be the duty of the commission to maintain open communication and active cooperation among state 135 136 agencies, persons with disabilities and appropriate advocacy 137 groups.

138 SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from 139 and after January 1, 2004.
