SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 523

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE  
2 D'IBERVILLE HIGH SCHOOL "WARRIORS" FOOTBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH  
3 LOUIS SMITH FOR THEIR FIRST CLASS AAAA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP AND FOR  
4 THEIR IMPRESSIVE 2002 SEASON.

5 WHEREAS, Carlton Cotten ran for 233 yards on 33 carries and  
6 three touchdowns as the D'Iberville High School "Warriors"  
7 Football Team turned a close contest into a rout, winning their  
8 first Class AAAA State Football Championship with a 33-7 victory  
9 over West Point High School in the championship game in Jackson,  
10 Mississippi; and

11 WHEREAS, this D'Iberville "Warriors" team was the first  
12 school from Harrison County to claim a state football title since  
13 the inception of the present playoff system in 1981; and

14 WHEREAS, the Warriors had to bounce back from a  
15 season-opening loss to Harrison Central and had to prove  
16 themselves week after week, as they finished the 2002 season with  
17 a 13-game winning streak and set a school record with 13  
18 victories; and

19 WHEREAS, this excellent team won their Class AAAA Division  
20 and Class AAAA South State Regional Tournament championships on  
21 their way to the state title, and reached the title game with a  
22 heart-stopping 20-17 victory against George County; and
