A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE 1 RUST COLLEGE A'CAPPELLA CHOIR UPON ITS RECEIPT OF THE 2003 2 3 GOVERNOR'S EXCELLENCE IN THE ARTS AWARD IN THE CATEGORY OF 4 CULTURAL AMBASSADORS.

5 WHEREAS, internationally known Rust College A'Cappella Choir from Holly Springs, Mississippi, is the recipient of the 2003 6 Governor's Excellence in the Arts Award in the category of 7 Cultural Ambassadors; and 8

9 WHEREAS, for nearly 70 years the Rust College A'Cappella 10 Choir has been a dynamic premiere choral ensemble and a living Mississippi folk tradition with a record of outstanding 11 performances. With its richly textured and tightly harmonized 12 sound, the Choir has achieved international acclaim performing and 13 recording its eclectic repertoire of classical music, gospel and 14 Negro spirituals, and show and pop tunes. The Choir has toured 15 extensively throughout the United States, Africa and Europe, 16 performing at major concert halls, churches and conferences, two 17 world's fairs, international choral festivals and high-profile and 18 19 social events; and

WHEREAS, the Choir was founded in 1934 by Natalie Doxey, a 20 native Mississippian and one-time piano accompanist of singer 21 Marian Anderson. She remained director until her retirement in 22 1967. Subsequent directors included Lassaye Homes, Dr. Eddie 23 Jones, Vernon Robinson and Dr. Barbara S. Ricks. Since 1990, 24 Zebedee Reynolds Jones has conducted the Choir; and 25 26 WHEREAS, for much of the 20th Century, the Choir was able to

promote better racial understanding between northern whites and 27 African-Americans and Mississippi's African-American and white 28

The Choir and its various male and female ensembles 29 30 were among the first singing groups featured at predominantly white churches in Mississippi, as well as at mixed civic social 31 The 1968 concert given at the Mississippi Coliseum in 32 events. 33 Jackson by Leontyne Price on behalf of Rust College and the Choir 34 was a sellout performance and a major accomplishment in breaking down segregated seating and mixed concert attendance at a major 35 venue in the state; and 36

37 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the 38 contributions of this national and internationally known musical 39 group which has brought honor to its college, its community and to 40 the State of Mississippi:
