- A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING DR. 1
- WALLACE CONERLY, VICE CHANCELLOR AND DEAN OF THE SCHOOL OF 2
- MEDICINE AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MISSISSIPPI MEDICAL CENTER, UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AFTER MANY YEARS OF DEDICATED PUBLIC 3

- WHEREAS, Dr. A. Wallace (Wally) Conerly, M.D., has announced 6
- 7 he will retire from his position as Vice Chancellor for Health
- Affairs and Dean of the School of Medicine at the University of 8
- 9 Mississippi Medical Center in Jackson, Mississippi, effective June
- 30, 2003; and 10
- WHEREAS, a member of the Medical Center faculty since 1973, 11
- Dr. Conerly served for 13 years as Assistant Vice Chancellor for 12
- 13 Health Affairs before he assumed his current appointment on August
- 14 2, 1994. A professor of medicine, he served as Medical Director
- at the Department of Respiratory Therapy at the University 15
- Hospital for 21 years and as Director of the Medical Center 16
- Division of Continuing Health Professional Education from 1979 to 17
- 1993. His medical practice is in the field of chest medicine and 18
- 19 critical care; and
- WHEREAS, as the Chief Executive Officer of the state's only 20
- Academic Health Science Center, he leads an institution with an 21
- 22 annual budget of more than \$609,000,000.00 and a yearly payroll
- for its 7,200 employees of \$303,870,606.00. He is the Chief 23
- Architect of the Medical Center's ongoing expansion program, the 24
- largest in the history of state higher education. Phase I, 25
- completed in 1999 and totaling \$211,000,000.00 included a new 26
- 27 children's hospital, a new women and infant's hospital, a building
- for the School of Health Related Professions, an addition to the 28

- 29 School of Nursing, a student union, two parking garages and an
- 30 imaging center. A second \$124,000,000.00 construction phase is
- 31 now underway. It includes a critical care hospital already
- 32 operational, a new 256-bed adult hospital, a classroom addition, a
- 33 children's hospital addition and an expansion to the Arthur C.
- 34 Guyton Research Complex; and
- 35 WHEREAS, a native of Tylertown, Dr. Conerly received his
- 36 Bachelor of Science degree with honors in 1957 at Millsaps College
- 37 and his Master's degree in 1960 at Tulane University. He did
- 38 special training at the U.S. Air Force School of Aerospace
- 39 Medicine at Brooks Air Force Base, Texas, did a fellowship in
- 40 medicine in the Section of Cardiology at Ochsner Foundation
- 41 Hospital in New Orleans and took a residency in Internal Medicine
- 42 at the University of Mississippi Medical Center. He was the
- 43 institution's Mississippi Lung Association Fellow in Pulmonary
- 44 Disease from 1972-1974; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly served in the U.S. Air Force for more
- 46 than six years as Director of the Aerospace Medicine Division for
- 47 the 3350th United States Air Force Hospital at Moody Air Force
- 48 Base, Georgia, and Director of Base Medical Services at Vance Air
- 49 Force Base, Oklahoma. Recipient of the United States Air Force
- 50 Flight Surgeon of the Year Award in 1962, the United States Air
- 51 Force Commendation Medal in 1963, and he was honorably discharged
- 52 from the United States Air Force in 1966 at the rank of Major; and
- 53 WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly is a Fellow of the American College of
- 54 Chest Physicians. His past and present professional memberships
- 55 also include the American Medical Association, Mississippi State
- 56 Medical Association, Central Medical Society of Mississippi,
- 57 American Academy of General Practice, Aerospace Medical
- 58 Association, American and Mississippi Thoracic Societies, American
- 59 Society of Internal Medicine, Association of American Medical
- 60 Colleges and the Mississippi Academy of Sciences. Dr. Conerly
- 61 served a three-year term as the American College of Chest

- 62 Physicians' Commissioner on the Commission on Accreditation of
- 63 Allied Health Education Programs. He is a former examiner and
- 64 member of the Board of Trustees for the National Board for
- 65 Respiratory Care and has served on the Mississippi State Medical
- 66 Association Council on Medical Education, the Professional
- 67 Education Committee of the American Heart Association, Mississippi
- 68 Affiliate, and the Journal of Respiratory Diseases Editorial
- 69 Review Board. He is also the state health contact for the
- 70 Southern Regional Educational Board; and
- 71 WHEREAS, Dr. Conerly has served on the Board of Directors of
- 72 the American Red Cross, Mississippi Chapter and the Capital Area
- 73 United Way. He is past President of the Rotary Club of Jackson
- 74 and past Chairman of the Board of Governors of the University
- 75 Club. He is on the boards of the Metro Jackson Chamber of
- 76 Commerce, Junior Achievement, the Jackson Medical Education
- 77 District, the Community Bank, and is a member of the Community
- 78 Advisory Council of the Junior League of Jackson. The Mississippi
- 79 Division of the Multiple Sclerosis Society honored Dr. Conerly and
- 80 the Medical Center with its 2001 Hope Award. The award is given
- 81 annually for outstanding community contributions. He received
- 82 Millsaps College's "Alumnus of the Year" Award in 2002, and he and
- 83 his wife were recognized as the 2002 People of Vision by Preserve
- 84 Sight Mississippi; and
- WHEREAS, Dr. and Mrs. Conerly, the former Frances Bryan
- 86 (Bachelor of Science degree, Millsaps, 1958), are the parents of
- 87 two sons, Al and Charlie; and
- WHEREAS, we are grateful for Dr. Conerly's legacy of service
- 89 in his profession and in Mississippi state government:
- 90 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
- 91 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
- 92 we do hereby commend and congratulate Dr. Wallace Conerly, Vice
- 93 Chancellor and Dean of the School of Medicine at the University of
- 94 Mississippi Medical Center, upon the occasion of his retirement

- 95 after many years of dedicated public service, and wish him and his
- 96 wife, Frances, the best as he returns to private life.
