SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 583

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING STATE TREASURER MARSHALL BENNETT FOR HIS OUTSTANDING RECORD AND DEDICATED SERVICE TO THE PEOPLE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI.

WHEREAS, Marshall G. Bennett, first elected as Mississippi's

5 51st State Treasurer in 1987, is completing his fourth term in

6 office, and is viewed by colleagues around America with a measure

7 of respect for his ability; and

8 WHEREAS, Bennett has earned more than \$1 Billion of interest

9 for the State of Mississippi, investing the state's funds through

10 professional methods. He has saved over \$40 Million in debt

11 payment by refinancing state bonds for lower interest rates. He

12 has helped Mississippi families by creating the MPACT and MACS

13 College Savings Programs which will pay over \$100 Million in

14 college tuition payments for Mississippi students. Bennett has

15 worked to make the state's financial management safe and secure.

16 Mississippi's credit rating has been upgraded to AA, the first

17 upgrade since 1974. He has recently set up a statewide Collateral

18 Pool to protect all public funds invested and deposited in banks

19 under a more efficient centralized system; and

20 WHEREAS, as Trustee for Mississippi's Public Employees'

21 Retirement System, he has helped accumulate \$17 Billion of

22 retirement benefits for 154,000 families. Bennett created the

23 Mississippi Women's Money Conference to help inform women and

24 families of ways to save, invest, reduce debt and become

25 financially secure. As Chairman of the Health Care Trust Fund,

26 Bennett invested the \$700 Million tobacco settlement fund, which

27 has improved health care for all citizens. As a Director of the
