SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 588

A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION HONORING THE LIFE AND DEDICATED 1 SERVICE OF WORLD WAR II VETERAN SHELBY E. NASSAR. 2 3 WHEREAS, during World War II many young American men and women went to war and devoted their service and offered their 4 lives to protect our country, our freedom and our way of life; and 5 WHEREAS, Shelby E. Nassar of Clarksdale, Mississippi, and his 6 7 two brothers were three of those young men who served in the 8 United States Armed Forces during those eventful years; and 9 WHEREAS, Shelby Nassar was born to Joe and Wydia Ferris Nassar in Shelby, Mississippi, on October 5, 1922; and 10 WHEREAS, Shelby Nassar enlisted in the U.S. Coast Guard as an 11 Apprentice Seaman on September 29, 1942, and received his training 12 in New Orleans, Louisiana; St. Augustine, Florida; and Groton, 13 Connecticut; and 14 WHEREAS, Shelby Nassar served aboard the Coast Guard Cutter 15 U.S.S. Tallapoosa on submarine patrol in the Atlantic Ocean 16 protecting U.S. convoy ships sailing to Britain, Russia and other 17 parts of the world from submarine attacks; and 18 WHEREAS, Shelby Nassar further served aboard the U.S. Army 19 20 Ship FS314 until he completed his tour of duty and was honorably discharged as a Yeoman Third Class on November 24, 1945; and 21 WHEREAS, on April 13, 1946, Shelby Nassar married Mary Jane 22 McCombs and their 53-year marriage (until Mary Jane's death in 23 1999) was blessed with three children; namely, Shelby Thomas 24 25 Nassar, Sheryl Ann Nassar and Joseph Frank Nassar; and WHEREAS, as a World War II Veteran, Shelby Nassar has always 26 supported and promoted the recognition of the patriotic services 27 S. of all Veterans and in particular the Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor; and

WHEREAS, in 1999, Shelby Nassar contacted his State Senator, provided him with research and documentation, and requested legislation to construct and dedicate a monument recognizing Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor, which subsequently resulted in the introduction and passage of Senate Bill No. 3024 in the 2000 Regular Session which authorized the construction and dedication of such monument; and

37 WHEREAS, the Mississippi Veterans Monument Commission readily 38 supported including the proposed monument in their on-going plans 39 for a Mississippi Veterans Monument; and

WHEREAS, at 10:00 a.m. on Saturday, November 10, 2001, a special ceremony was held on the grounds of the Woolfolk Building located West of the Capitol in downtown Jackson dedicating the Mississippi Veterans Monument and the Mississippi recipients of the Congressional Medal of Honor Monument; and

45 WHEREAS, during that special ceremony, Shelby Nassar was 46 recognized for his role and untiring effort in support of the 47 construction and dedication of the Congressional Medal of Honor 48 Monument; and

WHEREAS, it is the policy of the Legislature to recognize and honor the accomplishments and achievements of citizens of this state, and especially our Veterans who have given so much for our state and our country:

53 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF 54 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That 55 we do hereby recognize and honor the life and dedicated service of 56 World War II Veteran Shelby Nassar and also express our 57 appreciation for his role and support in the construction and 58 dedication of the Mississippi recipients of the Congressional 59 Medal of Honor Monument.
