- 6 Professor Emerita at Mississippi State University, Dr. Jorja Pound
- 7 Turnipseed of Starkville, Mississippi, has announced her
- 8 retirement after many years of dedicated service to people with
- 9 disabilities; and

- 11 Expression"; the national organization was founded in 1974 as an
- 12 affiliate of The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts,
- 13 and is an international organization that creates learning

- organization serves 4.3 million Americans by offering arts-based
- 16 programs in creative writing, dance, drama, music and the visual
- 17 arts implemented primarily through a vast network in 39 states,
- 18 which includes VSA Arts of Mississippi; and

- 20 dedicated service are a matter of record: for many years she
- 21 taught the only teacher-training component dealing with
- 22 music-based arts education for special learners in the state;

- 24 Washington, D.C. (1985-1988); Chairman of the Advisory Board for
- 25 the Governor's Office of Handicapped Services (1981-1984);
