WHEREAS, "VSA" stands for "Vision, Strength and Artistic 10 Expression"; the national organization was founded in 1974 as an 11 affiliate of The John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, 12 13 and is an international organization that creates learning opportunities through the arts for people with disabilities. 14 The 15 organization serves 4.3 million Americans by offering arts-based programs in creative writing, dance, drama, music and the visual 16 arts implemented primarily through a vast network in 39 states, 17 which includes VSA Arts of Mississippi; and 18

WHEREAS, Dr. Turnipseed's professional activities and 19 20 dedicated service are a matter of record: for many years she 21 taught the only teacher-training component dealing with music-based arts education for special learners in the state; 22 member of the first Advisory Board for Very Special Arts, 23 Washington, D.C. (1985-1988); Chairman of the Advisory Board for 24 the Governor's Office of Handicapped Services (1981-1984); 25 26 teacher-training programs listed as "Exemplary Training Program 27 Activities/Mississippi State University" in the Arts Resource and
