SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 608

1 A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE
2 JACKSON STATE UNIVERSITY "LADY TIGERS" BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD
3 COACH DENISE TAYLOR FOR WINNING THE SWAC CO-CHAMPIONSHIP FOR THE
4 2002-2003 SEASON.

5 WHEREAS, the Jackson State University "Lady Tigers"
6 Basketball Team has finished the 2002-2003 season with a 23-6
7 overall record and 15-3 conference record, and has been named
8 Southwestern Athletic Conference Co-Champions for the 2002-2003
9 season; and

10 WHEREAS, JSU Lady Tigers 2002-2003 highlights include the
11 following: ranked first in the conference in scoring offense
12 (68.4 ppg), scoring defense (55.0 ppg), scoring margin (+13.4),
13 field goal defense (.322), rebounding offense (43.4 pg), blocked
14 shots (8.34 pg), assists (16.41 pg) and defensive rebounds (28.72
15 pg); led the nation in blocked shots; No. 2 in the nation in field
16 goal percentage defense, ranked ninth in the NCAA in scoring
17 defense; Junior Center Amie Williams led the nation and the league
18 in blocked shots, averaging 5.1 blocks a game, she was also ranked
19 ninth in the nation and first in the conference in rebounding
20 (11.0 pg); Junior Point Guard Latesha Lee was ranked third in the
21 nation and first in the conference in assists (7.38 pg), she was
22 also second in the league in steals (3.41 pg); Senior Forward
23 Genina "GG" Johnson was ranked second in the NCAA and first in
24 SWAC in three-point field goals made (3.31 pg); Amie Williams was
25 named SWAC Player of the Week three times this season; Senior
26 Guard Sonia "Elise" Washington became a member of the Lady Tigers
27 1,000-point club on January 25, 2003; Amie Williams received first
28 team All-SWAC honors and was named Newcomer of the Year and



29 Defensive Player of the Year; Latesha Lee received first team
30 All-SWAC honors and Genina Johnson and Sonia Washington were named
31 second team All-SWAC; Coach Denise Taylor's career record is
32 113-82 and her JSU record stands at 39-19; and

33 WHEREAS, Coach Denise Taylor, affectionately called "Coach T"
34 by her players, is former Head Coach of the Utah Starzz of the
35 WNBA, is completing her second season as Lady Tigers Head Coach
36 and is the Lady Tigers third Head Coach since 1975. A native of
37 Cleveland, Mississippi, and a graduate of Texas Southern
38 University, she has made her mark in the conference by turning the
39 program around in one year. Coach Taylor is a motivational,
40 dynamic, hard-working, focused coach whose career spans 16 years.
41 She was one of eight coaches selected to launch the inaugural
42 season of the WNBA in 1997. She serves as a color analyst of the
43 Tiger Network, covering men's basketball games and SWAC
44 tournaments, and is in demand as a speaker at civic events; and

45 WHEREAS, the 2002-2003 Lady Tigers Roster is as follows:

52 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize the
53 accomplishments of this team of fine student-athletes who have
54 brought honor to their university, their community and to the
55 State of Mississippi:

56 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF
57 MISSISSIPPI, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN, That
58 we do hereby commend and congratulate the Jackson State University
59 "Lady Tigers" Basketball Team and Coach Denise Taylor for winning
60 the SWAC Co-Championship for the 2002-2003 season, and wish them
61 continued success in their future athletic and academic endeavors.
