- when he was three years of age; he is the son of Alfred Clark 13
- Marble, Sr., and Charlotte Elizabeth Humbarger. His father was a 14
- well-known musician in Vicksburg; and 15
- WHEREAS, he was nurtured in the Christian faith at St. 16
- Alban's Episcopal Church in Bovina, Mississippi, where he had his 17
- first job as janitor of the church; he graduated from the 18
- Vicksburg Public Schools, attended the University of Mississippi, 19
- from which he graduated with a Bachelor of Arts Degree in 20
- Psychology in 1958, where he was a member of the "Ole Miss Hall of 21
- Fame"; after graduating from Ole Miss, he was commissioned as an 22
- officer in the United States Navy, where he served four years, two 23
- years aboard the Destroyer U.S. Hawkins (DDR-873); he entered the 24
- School of Theology at the University of the South in Sewanee, 25
- Tennessee, to begin seminary education and received his Bachelor 26
- of Divinity Degree in 1967; he studied at the Theological College 27
- 28 of Edinburgh, Scotland; and

         WHEREAS, he served as Assistant to the Bishop in the Diocese

    of the Episcopal Diocese of Mississippi on February 23, 1991, by a
