SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 19

A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING JAMES W. HILL, 1 SR., UPON THE OCCASION OF HIS RETIREMENT AS DIRECTOR OF THE 2 3 LAWRENCE COUNTY TECHNOLOGY AND CAREER CENTER. WHEREAS, longtime Lawrence County educator, James W. Hill, 4 Sr., has announced his retirement as Director of the Lawrence 5 County Technology and Career Center; and 6 WHEREAS, James Walter Hill, Sr., is a native of Vicksburg 7 (Warren County), Mississippi, the son of the late Genora and Mamie 8 Burks Hill. He received his early education in the Warren 9 County-Vicksburg Public Schools, where he graduated from Rosa A. 10 Temple High School in 1959; and 11 WHEREAS, he graduated from Alcorn State University (Alcorn 12 13 A&M) in 1963 with a Bachelor of Science Degree in Agriculture Education. He received a Master's Degree in Agriculture Education 14 from Tuskegee Institute in 1972, an Endorsement in School 15 Administration from Alcorn State University, with further studies 16 at Mississippi State University and University of Southern 17 18 Mississippi; and WHEREAS, James began his teaching career with the Lawrence 19 20 County School District in July 1964 as an agriculture teacher. 21 While working as an agriculture teacher, he was honored as Vocational Agriculture Teacher of the Year by the Magnolia 22 Vocational Agriculture Teachers Association. The district 23 promoted him from teacher to Title XX Coordinator in 1977, and he 24 was appointed Assistant Superintendent of Education in 1980, where 25

29 WHEREAS, he was the first Black elected Alderman for the Town 30 of Monticello and served in that position for twelve years. He 31 has served on many political committees and received a Political 32 Award from the Lawrence County Branch of the NAACP in 1986; and

WHEREAS, James is a lifetime member of the Alcorn State 33 University National Alumni Association. He organized and served 34 as President of the Monticello Alcorn Alumni Chapter for 20 years. 35 Over the years of recruitment for the University, he has sent many 36 37 worthy and deserving students to Alcorn State University. He has also driven many of our state representatives to the campus, 38 emphasizing some of the needs of the University. He was selected 39 "Distinguished Alumni," Presidential Citation, National Conference 40 on Blacks in Higher Education in 1990; member of the sixth class 41 of inductees into the Alcorn State University Hall of Honor in 42 1995; received the 2000 Matthew "Matt" Thomas Outstanding Service 43 Award and Outstanding Service Award by the Monticello Alcorn 44 Alumni Chapter; and was elected Alcornite of the Year (2001) by 45 46 the Alcorn National Alumni Association; and

WHEREAS, his community/professional activities and honors 47 48 include: Advisory Board Member, AmSouth Bank; Chairman of the Board, Family Health Care Clinics/Monticello, New Hebron, 49 Prentiss, Pelahatchie, Mendenhall and Brandon; Recipient of Family 50 Health Care Leadership Award; Chairman, Lawrence County Habitat 51 for Humanity; Honoree, E.M. Graham Award of Excellence, Lawrence 52 County Chamber of Commerce (1999-2000); Lifetime Member, NAACP; 53 Past Vice President, Lawrence County Branch; served on the 54 Resolution Committee of the National NAACP; one of the founders 55 and Secretary, Board of Directors for the Lawrence County 56 Educational and Recreational Association; Area Director's Award, 57 58 State of Mississippi, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Inc.; Head Start Award, Five County Child Development; Past Worshipful Master of 59
