SENATE RESOLUTION NO. 61

1 A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING THE JACKSON STATE 2 UNIVERSITY "LADY TIGERS" BASKETBALL TEAM AND HEAD COACH DENISE 3 TAYLOR FOR WINNING THE SWAC CO-CHAMPIONSHIP FOR THE 2002-2003 4 SEASON.

5 WHEREAS, the Jackson State University "Lady Tigers" 6 Basketball Team has finished the 2002-2003 season with a 23-6 7 overall record and 15-3 conference record, and has been named 8 Southwestern Athletic Conference Co-Champions for the 2002-2003 9 season; and

WHEREAS, JSU Lady Tigers 2002-2003 highlights include the 10 following: ranked first in the conference in scoring offense 11 (68.4 ppg), scoring defense (55.0 ppg), scoring margin (+13.4), 12 field goal defense (.322), rebounding offense (43.4 pg), blocked 13 shots (8.34 pg), assists (16.41 pg) and defensive rebounds (28.72 14 pq); led the nation in blocked shots; No. 2 in the nation in field 15 goal percentage defense, ranked ninth in the NCAA in scoring 16 defense; Junior Center Amie Williams led the nation and the league 17 in blocked shots, averaging 5.1 blocks a game, she was also ranked 18 ninth in the nation and first in the conference in rebounding 19 (11.0 pg); Junior Point Guard Latesha Lee was ranked third in the 20 nation and first in the conference in assists (7.38 pg), she was 21 also second in the league in steals (3.41 pg); Senior Forward 22 Genina "GG" Johnson was ranked second in the NCAA and first in 23 SWAC in three-point field goals made (3.31 pg); Amie Williams was 24 named SWAC Player of the Week three times this season; Senior 25 26 Guard Sonia "Elise" Washington became a member of the Lady Tigers 1,000-point club on January 25, 2003; Amie Williams received first 27 team All-SWAC honors and was named Newcomer of the Year and 28 61 S. 29 Defensive Player of the Year; Latesha Lee received first team 30 All-SWAC honors and Genina Johnson and Sonia Washington were named 31 second team All-SWAC; Coach Denise Taylor's career record is 32 113-82 and her JSU record stands at 39-19; and

33 WHEREAS, Coach Denise Taylor, affectionately called "Coach T" 34 by her players, is former Head Coach of the Utah Starzz of the WNBA, is completing her second season as Lady Tigers Head Coach 35 and is the Lady Tigers third Head Coach since 1975. A native of 36 Cleveland, Mississippi, and a graduate of Texas Southern 37 University, she has made her mark in the conference by turning the 38 program around in one year. Coach Taylor is a motivational, 39 dynamic, hard-working, focused coach whose career spans 16 years. 40 41 She was one of eight coaches selected to launch the inaugural season of the WNBA in 1997. She serves as a color analyst of the 42 Tiger Network, covering men's basketball games and SWAC 43 tournaments, and is in demand as a speaker at civic events; and 44
