A RESOLUTION COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING SUE GUNTER,

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL HALL OF FAME COACH FROM WALNUT GROVE,

3 MISSISSIPPI, UPON HER INDUCTION INTO THE MISSISSIPPI SPORTS HALL 4 OF FAME CLASS OF 2003. WHEREAS, the Jackson Touchdown Club and Mississippi Sports 5 Hall of Fame has unveiled the Class of 2003 of the Mississippi 6 Sports Hall of Fame, which features Sue Gunter, Women's Basketball 7 Hall of Fame Coach from Walnut Grove, Mississippi, who led teams 8 9 at Middle Tennessee State, Stephen F. Austin and LSU and is the fourth winningest women's basketball coach in NCAA history; and 10 WHEREAS, Sue Gunter was a star shooting guard for Walnut 11 Grove High and East Central Community College at Decatur, 12 Mississippi; she attended Peabody College in Nashville, Tennessee, 13 where she played for the Nashville Business College AAU team that 14 won two National AAU Tournaments, was named All America quard in 15 1960 and played for U.S. National Team that played the Soviet 16 Union from 1960-1962; and 17 WHEREAS, she coached Middle Tennessee State to two unbeaten 18 seasons before launching a 15-year stint at Stephen F. Austin, led 19 the Ladyjacks to four top 20 rankings, four state titles, a 20 regional crown and five AIAW Tournament appearances with a record 21 of 266-87; and 22 WHEREAS, Sue is an active coach for LSU Lady Tigers, where 23 she has coached for 20 seasons; she has guided LSU women's hoops 24 teams to 12 NCAA Tournament appearances, 2 NCAA Elite Eight 25 26 appearances, 6 Sweet Sixteen appearances, an SEC tournament title, a WNIT championship, she has coached the Lady Tigers to a mark of 27 385-209 and is the winningest basketball coach in LSU history; and 28 96 N1/2S. 35 WHEREAS, it is with great pride that we recognize this 36 outstanding athlete who has brought honor to her community and to 37 the State of Mississippi:
