## **REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE**

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

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We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL: H. B. No. 1532: Appropriation; Department of Marine Resources. We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1. 1.

2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for the support and maintenance of the Department of Marine Resources for the fiscal 8 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004..... 9 10 .....\$ 1,928,625.00. SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 11 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 12 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of 13 Marine Resources for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and 14 ending June 30, 2004..... \$ 8,105,903.00. 15 Of the funds appropriated in this section, Three Million 16 17 Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$3,050,000.00) is derived from the state excise taxes upon gasoline, oil and other petroleum products. 18 SECTION 3. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of 19 Sections 1 and 2, not more than the amounts set forth below shall 20 21 be expended for the respective major objects or purpose of 22 expenditure: MAJOR OBJECTS OF EXPENDITURE: 23 Personal Services: 2.4 Salaries, Wages and Fringe Benefits.. \$ 6,015,768.00 25 Travel and Subsistence..... 100,000.00

Each Marine Conservation Officer and Supervisor shall be furnished an allowance for uniforms not to exceed Four Hundred Fifty Dollars (\$450.00) per annum.

With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of 46 the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 47 48 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2004 49 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 50 51 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2005 budget by the Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 52 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall 53 determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all 54 appropriated positions in compliance with the provisions of this 55 It shall be the responsibility of the agency head to insure 56 act. that no single personnel action increases this projected annual 57 58 cost and/or the Fiscal Year 2004 appropriation for "Personal Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month, 59 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken 60 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected 61 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2004 "Personal Services" 62

appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until such time as the requirements of this provision are met.

67 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 68 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

73 SECTION 4. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 74 Department of Marine Resources shall have the authority to 75 receive, budget and expend funds from any source that may become 76 available to the department in accordance with the rules and 77 regulations of the Department of Finance and Administration in a 78 manner consistent with the escalation of federal funds.

SECTION 5. In addition to all other sums heretofore
appropriated, the following sum, or so much thereof as may be
necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State
Treasury to the credit of the Tidelands Fund No. 3452 to the
Department of Marine Resources for the purpose of defraying the
expenses of the Tidelands projects for the fiscal year beginning
July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004...... \$ 5,819,273.00.

It is the intention of the Legislature that any political 137 138 subdivision seeking to qualify for tidelands funds for the subsequent fiscal year shall submit a proposal to the Department 139 140 of Marine Resources no later than July 1, 2003. All proposals submitted will be reviewed and evaluated by the Department of 141 Marine Resources in accordance to department plans and procedures. 142 Multiphased projects, multiyear projects, proposed projects with 143 144 high dollar value and projects that have a record of stacking 145 funds shall be considered as low priority projects when evaluated.

146 It is the intention of the Legislature that if the amount of 147 the Tidelands funds appropriated in this act exceed the actual 148 amount of Tidelands funds available, the available funds shall be 149 allocated on a pro rata basis between projects listed in this 150 section.

SECTION 6. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of Marine Resources, Tidelands Fund, which is comprised of special source funds available to the department, for expenditures pursuant to House Bill No. 1756, 2002 Regular Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004...... \$5,500,000.00.

Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended exceed the balance as of June 30, 2003, or change the purpose for which the funds were originally authorized except as otherwise stated in this bill.

SECTION 7. It is the intention of the Legislature that the 163 commission shall place any special trust funds appropriated to the 164 department in a special trust fund and the interest earned on the 165 166 principal shall be credited to the special trust fund. Monies in the fund at the end of the fiscal year shall be retained in the 167 special trust fund for use in the next succeeding fiscal year. 168 The department may use the interest earned on the fund to pay 169 reasonable costs for administering the fund and related projects. 170

SECTION 8. It is the intention of the Legislature that 171 Tidelands Funds not otherwise appropriated shall be used for 172 additional funding of tideland projects and the administration 173 174 thereof by the Department of Marine Resources. Expenditures of excess Tidelands Funds by the Department of Marine Resources for 175 supplemental and additional funding and administration of 176 tidelands projects heretofore or hereafter proposed is authorized 177 and approved. The Department of Marine Resources may escalate the 178 Tidelands Fund in an amount not to exceed Eight Hundred Thousand 179 Dollars (\$800,000.00) for the purposes outlined in this section. 180

181 SECTION 9. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 182 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 183 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 184 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the 185 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 186 187 SECTION 10. This act shall take effect and be in force from 188 and after July 1, 2003.
