## REPORT OF CONFERENCE COMMITTEE

## MR. SPEAKER AND MADAM PRESIDENT:

We, the undersigned conferees, have had under consideration the amendments to the following entitled BILL:

H. B. No. 1551: Appropriation; Department of Human Services-Consolidated.

We, therefore, respectfully submit the following report and recommendation:

- 1. That the Senate recede from its Amendment No. 1.
- 2. That the House and Senate adopt the following amendment:

Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 4 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 5 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, to the Department of 6 Human Services for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and 7 8 ending June 30, 2004.....\$ 76,096,200.00. 9 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in any special 10 fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Department of 11 Human Services which is comprised of special source funds 12 collected by or otherwise available to the department for the 13 support of the various divisions of the department, for the 14 purpose of defraying the expenses of the department for the fiscal 15 16 year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004...... .....\$ 375,349,150.00. 17 18 **SECTION 3.** None of the funds appropriated by this act shall be expended for any purpose that is not actually required or 19 necessary for performing any of the powers or duties of the 20 Department of Human Services that are authorized by the 21 Mississippi Constitution of 1890, state or federal law, or rules 22 23 or regulations that implement state or federal law.

SECTION 4. With the funds appropriated under the provisions

of Sections 1 and 2, the following positions are authorized:

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## AUTHORIZED POSITIONS: 26 2.7 Permanent: Full Time 3,367 28 Part Time 8 29 Time-Limited: Full Time 702 Part Time 30 Any person within the Office of Youth Services classified as 31 Youth Services Counselor Aide I, Youth Services Counselor Aide II, 32 Youth Services Counselor Aide III, Security Officer I, Security 33 Officer II, Security Officer III, Recreation Supervisor, General 34 35 Services Employee I, General Services Employee II, Youth Services Counselor I, Youth Services Counselor II, and Youth Services 36 Counselor III, who must work on a statutory holiday or any holiday 37 proclaimed by the Governor, may at the discretion of the 38 superintendents of the institutions and the Executive Director of 39 the Office of Youth Services and within available personnel funds, 40 be paid "call back pay" in lieu of "compensatory time credit." 41 42 It is the intent of the Legislature that the Office of Youth 43 Services shall have the authority to accept from any source including, but not limited to, proceeds from sale of vehicles, 44 equipment or any other property which becomes obsolete or is no 45 It is the intent that such funds will be approved longer needed. 46 47 for allocation and expenditure in a manner consistent with the rules and regulations of the Department of Finance and 48 49 Administration. 50 With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to 51 52 make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2004 53 funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions 54 are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2005 budget by the 55 Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the 56 57 Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall

- 63 Services" when annualized. If, at the end of any calendar month,
- 64 the State Personnel Board determines that the agency has taken
- 65 action(s) which would cause the agency to exceed this projected
- 66 annual cost or the Fiscal Year 2004 "Personal Services"
- 67 appropriated level, when annualized, then only those actions which
- 68 reduce the projected annual cost and/or the appropriation
- 69 requirement will be processed by the State Personnel Board until
- 70 such time as the requirements of this provision are met.
- 71 It is the intention of the Legislature that the Executive
- 72 Director of the Department of Human Services may transfer between
- 73 the various divisions authorized herein both funds and positions
- 74 not to exceed ten percent (10%) of the receiving division
- 75 consistent with the provisions of Section 1 of this act.
- 76 Provided, however, that no county office positions shall be
- 77 transferred to any regional office or to the state office. The
- 78 Executive Director of the Department of Human Services shall
- 79 submit written justification for the transfer to the Legislative
- 80 Budget Office and the Department of Finance and Administration on
- 81 or before the fifteenth of the month prior to the effective date
- 82 of the transfer. It is further the intention of the Legislature
- 83 that any transfers made under the provisions of this paragraph
- 84 shall be of an emergency nature and that in no case shall the
- 85 transfers be made which substantially alter the legislative intent
- 86 for the various divisions or offices as set forth in the original
- 87 appropriations made under this act.
- Any transfers within major object of expenditure within each
- 89 specific budget or escalations shall be made in accordance with
- 90 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.
- No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be
- 92 used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are
- 93 being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this
- 94 act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.
- 95 **SECTION 5.** It is the intention of the Legislature that the
- 96 Department of Human Services shall maintain complete accounting
- 97 and personnel records related to the expenditure of all funds

- 98 appropriated under this act and that such records shall be in the
- 99 same format and level of detail as maintained for Fiscal Year
- 100 2003. It is further the intention of the Legislature that the
- 101 agency's budget request for Fiscal Year 2005 shall be submitted to
- 102 the Joint Legislative Budget Committee in a format and level of
- 103 detail comparable to the format and level of detail provided
- 104 during the Fiscal Year 2004 budget request process.
- 105 **SECTION 6.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Two
- 106 Million Eighty-six Thousand Six Hundred Eighty-three Dollars
- 107 (\$2,086,683.00) is provided for the support of a contract with the
- 108 State Board of Community and Junior Colleges Industrial Training
- 109 Program for the training of TANF clients.
- These funds shall be transferred to the State Board of
- 111 Community and Junior Colleges Industrial Training budget and shall
- 112 be expended in accordance with Sections 37-31-103 through
- 113 37-31-111, Mississippi Code of 1972. Training will be conducted
- in the areas outlined in Section 37-31-103(2) for TANF recipients.
- 115 The terms and provisions for program operation will be
- 116 established through a nonfinancial agreement between the State
- 117 Board of Community and Junior Colleges and the Mississippi
- 118 Department of Human Services. This nonfinancial agreement will be
- initiated by the State Board of Community and Junior Colleges in
- 120 accordance with current laws, rules and regulations as approved by
- 121 the State Board of Community and Junior Colleges.
- 122 Identification, eligibility, certification, enrollment,
- 123 follow-up, performance standards and sanction liabilities of the
- 124 TANF clients will be the sole responsibility of the Department of
- 125 Human Services.
- 126 **SECTION 7.** None of the funds appropriated under the
- 127 provisions of Sections 1 and 2 shall be used to pay any contractor
- 128 that is not a successful bidder for genetic paternity testing
- 129 services bid by the Department of Human Services.
- 130 **SECTION 8.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, One
- 131 Million Dollars (\$1,000,000.00) shall be transferred to the
- 132 Department of Health, Child Care Licensure Program from the Child
- 133 Care Development Fund or other appropriate special fund. These

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funds are to be transferred to the Board of Health no later than
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     July 31, 2003. The Department of Health shall make a complete
     accounting to the Department of Human Services detailing the uses
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     of these funds in accordance with federal and state regulations.
          SECTION 9. It is the intention of the Legislature that the
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     Department of Human Services contract with the Department of
     Health to operate the School Nurse Teen Pregnancy Prevention Pilot
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     Program as described in House Bill No. 766 of the 1997 Legislative
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     Session, in compliance with all applicable TANF federal and state
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     regulations.
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          SECTION 10.
                       It is the intent of the Legislature that the
     Department of Human Services have authority to escalate the
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     various budgets only in the major objects of Contractual Services
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     and Subsidies and only with the approval of the State Fiscal
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     Officer, from special funds collected or available from the TANF
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     (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) Grant, in the current or
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     any prior fiscal year, not to exceed Seventy-one Million Dollars
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     ($71,000,000.00). Upon such approval, the Department of Human
     Services may expend such funds in the manner authorized by law.
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          The Executive Director of the Department of Human Services
     shall submit to the Department of Finance and Administration a
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     certified statement providing a detailed explanation for any
     escalation and an assessment of the impact on the agency's General
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     Fund budget for the three (3) fiscal years following the fiscal
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     year in which the escalation is requested. A copy of this
     submission shall be sent to the Legislative Budget Office.
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          SECTION 11. Of the funds appropriated in Section 2, Four
     Million Five Hundred Thousand Dollars ($4,500,000.00) of TANF
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     (Temporary Assistance for Needy Families) federal funds shall be
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     transferred to the Office of the Attorney General for the purpose
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     of subgranting with entities which will develop and implement
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     programs that serve unmet needs of "at risk" youth in the state,
     including but not being limited to, Boys and Girls Clubs, Big
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     Brothers Big Sisters of America, Communities in Schools, and the
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     State Coalition of Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA).
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the funds authorized in this Section, not more than Two Million

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- 170 Five Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$2,500,000.00) shall be allocated
- 171 among Boys and Girls Clubs, Big Brothers Big Sisters of America,
- 172 and Communities in Schools, and not more than Two Million Dollars
- 173 (\$2,000,000.00) shall be allocated to the State Coalition of Young
- 174 Men's Christian Association (YMCA). The Attorney General shall
- 175 administer the transferred TANF funds.
- 176 **SECTION 12.** Of the funds appropriated in Section 2 and
- 177 allocated in Section 4, Three Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 178 (\$300,000.00) shall be used to defray the cost of the Amer-I-Can
- 179 Program as established in House Bill No. 1109, 2001 Regular
- 180 Session.
- 181 **SECTION 13.** None of the above funds shall be used to hire
- 182 employees under Personal Service Contracts except for Personal
- 183 Service Contracts for the Office for Children and Youth Child
- 184 Care and Office for Children and Youth Child Care Managers.
- 185 **SECTION 14.** The following sum, or so much thereof as may be
- 186 necessary, is hereby reappropriated out of any money in the State
- 187 Treasury to the credit of the Department of Human Services for
- 188 expenditures pursuant to Senate Bill No. 2327, 2003 Regular
- 189 Session, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2003, and ending
- 190 June 30, 2004.....\$ 900,000.00.
- 191 Notwithstanding the amount reappropriated under the
- 192 provisions of this section, in no event shall the amount expended
- 193 exceed the balance as of June 30, 2003, or change the purpose for
- 194 which the funds were originally authorized.
- 195 The department is authorized to escalate, budget and expend
- 196 special funds received from any source to carry out the provisions
- 197 of this section and is authorized to establish full-time permanent
- 198 Department of Human Services protective service Social Worker
- 199 positions as necessary.
- 200 **SECTION 15.** The money herein appropriated shall be paid by
- 201 the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the
- 202 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon
- 203 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal
- 204 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the
- 205 proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law.

**SECTION 16.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 207 and after July 1, 2003.
