2	Sections 15 and 16 and renumbering succeeding sections:
3	SECTION 15. (1) Each elector shall present valid
4	identification to an election manager, or the circuit clerk or
5	deputy circuit clerk in the case of absentee voting, before he
6	shall be allowed to vote. Valid identification shall consist of
7	any one of the following:
8	(a) A valid Mississippi driver's license;
9	(b) A valid identification card issued by a branch,
10	department, agency or entity of the State of Mississippi;
11	(c) A valid United States passport;
12	(d) A valid employee identification card containing a
13	photograph of the elector and issued by any branch, department,
14	agency or entity of the United States government, the State of
15	Mississippi, or any county, municipality, board, authority or
16	other entity of this state;
17	(e) A valid employee identification card containing a
18	photograph of the elector and issued by any employer of the
19	elector in the ordinary course of the employer's business;
20	(f) A valid student identification card containing a
21	photograph of the elector from any public or private college,
22	university, or postgraduate, technical or professional school
23	located within the State of Mississippi;

A valid Mississippi license to carry a pistol or 24 (g) 25 revolver; A valid pilot's license issued by the Federal 26 (h) Aviation Administration or other authorized agency of the United 27 28 States; (i) A valid United States military identification card; 29 A certified copy of the elector's birth 30 (j) certificate; 31 A valid social security card; 32 (k) 33 (1) Certified naturalization documentation; Official voter registration card; or 34 (m) 35 Any other generally recognized form of photographic (n) identification. 36 If an elector is unable to produce any of the items of (2) 37

identification listed in subsection (1) of this section, he or she 38 shall sign a statement under oath in a form approved by the State 39 40 Board of Election Commissioners, swearing or affirming that he or she is the person identified on the pollbooks. One (1) of the 41 election managers, or the circuit clerk or deputy circuit clerk in 42 the case of absentee voting, shall sign the statement as a witness 43 to the oath taken by the elector. The person shall be allowed to 44 vote without undue delay. Any elector who falsely swears or 45 affirms the statement prescribed in this subsection shall be 46 47 quilty of a felony and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than Five Thousand Dollars (\$5,000.00) or imprisoned not less than 48 one (1) year, but not more than five (5) years, or both. 49

50 **SECTION 16.** Section 23-15-541, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 51 amended as follows:

52 [Until Laws of 1993, Chapter 528, is effectuated under 53 Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, this section reads as 54 follows:]

23-15-541. At all elections, the polls shall be opened at seven o'clock in the morning and be kept open until seven o'clock in the evening and no longer. Upon the opening of the polls, and not before, the managers of the election shall designate two (2)

of their number, other than the manager theretofore designated to 59 60 receive the blank ballots, who shall thereupon be known 61 respectively as the initialing manager and the alternate initialing manager. The alternate initialing manager, in the 62 absence of the initialing manager, shall perform all of the duties 63 and undertake all of the responsibilities of the initialing 64 65 manager. When any person entitled to vote shall appear to vote, the managers shall first identify the voter by requiring the voter 66 to present valid identification as provided in Section 15 of this 67 act; and then the person shall * * * sign his name in a receipt 68 book or booklet provided for that purpose and to be used at that 69 election only and said receipt book or booklet shall be used in 70 71 lieu of the list of voters who have voted formerly made by the managers or clerks; whereupon and not before, the initialing 72 manager or, in his absence, the alternate initialing manager shall 73 indorse his initials on the back of an official blank ballot, 74 prepared in accordance with law, and at such place on the back of 75 76 the ballot that the initials may be seen after the ballot has been marked and folded, and when so indorsed he shall deliver it to the 77 78 voter, which ballot the voter shall mark in the manner provided by law, which when done the voter shall deliver the same to the 79 80 initialing manager or, in his absence, to the alternate initialing manager, in the presence of the others, and the manager shall see 81 82 that the ballot so delivered bears on the back thereof the genuine initials of the initialing manager, or alternate initialing 83 manager, and if so, but not otherwise, the ballot shall be put 84 85 into the ballot box; and when so done one (1) of the managers or a duly appointed clerk shall make the proper entry on the pollbook. 86 If the voter is unable to write his name on the receipt book, a 87 manager or clerk shall note on the back of the ballot that it was 88 89 receipted for by his assistance.

When any person entitled to vote shall appear to vote, 104 the managers shall identify the voter * * * by requiring the voter to submit * * * valid * * * identification as provided in Section 105 106 15 of this act; and then such person shall sign his name in a receipt book or booklet provided for that purpose and to be used 107 at that election only and said receipt book or booklet shall be 108 used in lieu of the list of voters who have voted formerly made by 109 110 the managers or clerks; whereupon and not before, the initialing 111 manager or, in his absence, the alternate initialing manager shall indorse his initials on the back of an official blank ballot, 112 113 prepared in accordance with law, and at such place on the back of the ballot that the initials may be seen after the ballot has been 114 115 marked and folded, and when so indorsed he shall deliver it to the voter, which ballot the voter shall mark in the manner provided by 116 law, which when done the voter shall deliver the same to the 117 118 initialing manager or, in his absence, to the alternate initialing manager, in the presence of the others, and the manager shall see 119 120 that the ballot so delivered bears on the back thereof the genuine 121 initials of the initialing manager, or alternate initialing manager, and if so, but not otherwise, the ballot shall be put 122 into the ballot box; and when so done one (1) of the managers or a 123 duly appointed clerk shall make the proper entry on the pollbook. 124 125 If the voter is unable to write his name on the receipt book, a manager or clerk shall note on the back of the ballot that it was 126 127 receipted for by his assistance.
