**AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO**

**Senate Bill NO. 2384**

**By Representative(s) Committee**

**Amend by striking all after the enacting clause and inserting in lieu thereof the following:**

5           **SECTION 1.** Section 45-6-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is  
6 amended as follows:

7           45-6-5. (1) There is hereby created the Board on Law  
8 Enforcement Officer Standards and Training, which shall consist of  
9 seventeen (17) members.

10           (2) The Governor shall appoint five (5) members of the board  
11 from the following specified categories:

12           (a) Two (2) members, each to be a chief of police of a  
13 municipality in this state, with one (1) of such municipalities  
14 having a population of less than one thousand two hundred (1,200)  
15 according to the latest federal decennial census.

16           (b) One (1) member shall be a sheriff in this state.

17           (c) One (1) member shall be a district attorney in this  
18 state.

19           (d) One (1) member shall be a representative of higher  
20 education.

21           The initial appointments to the board shall be made by the  
22 Governor no later than twenty (20) days after the effective date  
23 of this chapter, as follows: the chief of police and the  
24 representative of higher education each shall be appointed for a

25 term of two (2) years; and the sheriff and the district attorney  
26 each shall be appointed for a term of three (3) years. Upon the  
27 expiration of the terms of the initial appointees to the board,  
28 each subsequent appointment shall be made for a term of three (3)  
29 years, beginning on the date of the expiration of the previous  
30 term. A vacancy in any appointed position on the board prior to  
31 the expiration of a term shall be filled by appointment of the  
32 Governor only for the balance of the unexpired term.

33 (3) The remaining twelve (12) members of the board shall be  
34 the following:

35 (a) The Attorney General.

36 (b) The Director of the Mississippi Highway Safety  
37 Patrol.

38 (c) The President of the Mississippi Municipal  
39 Association or his designee.

40 (d) The President of the Mississippi Association of  
41 Supervisors or his designee.

42 (e) The President of the Mississippi Constable  
43 Association or his designee and such member shall be a certified  
44 law enforcement officer.

45 (f) The President of the Mississippi Police Benevolent  
46 Association or his designee.

47 (g) The President of the Mississippi Law Enforcement  
48 Officers Association or his designee.

49 (h) The President of the Central State Troopers  
50 Coalition or his designee.

51 (i) A nonsupervisory, rank and file, law enforcement  
52 officer appointed by the Lieutenant Governor.

53 (j) A nonsupervisory, rank and file, law enforcement  
54 officer appointed by the Speaker of the House of Representatives.

55 (k) The President of the Mississippi Campus Law  
56 Enforcement Officers Association or his designee.

57 (l) The President of the Fraternal Order of Police or  
58 his designee.

59 The Attorney General, the Director of the Mississippi Highway

60 Safety Patrol and the respective presidents of the foregoing  
61 associations shall serve only for their respective terms of  
62 office.

63 (4) Members of the board shall serve without compensation,  
64 but shall be entitled to receive reimbursement for any actual and  
65 reasonable expenses incurred as a necessary incident to such  
66 service, including mileage, as provided in Section 25-3-41.

67 (5) There shall be a chairman and a vice chairman of the  
68 board, elected by and from the membership of the board. The board  
69 shall adopt rules and regulations governing times and places for  
70 meetings and governing the manner of conducting its business, but  
71 the board shall meet at least every three (3) months.

72 (6) The Governor shall call an organizational meeting of the  
73 board not later than thirty (30) days after the effective date of  
74 this chapter.

75 (7) The board shall report annually to the Governor and the  
76 Legislature on its activities, and may make such other reports as  
77 it deems desirable.

78 (8) The training officers of all police academies in the  
79 state whose curricula are approved by the board shall be advisors  
80 to the board. They shall be entitled to all privileges of the  
81 board members, including travel expenses and subsistence, but  
82 shall not be eligible to vote at board meetings.

83 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from  
84 and after July 1, 2003.

**Further, amend by striking the title in its entirety and  
inserting in lieu thereof the following:**
