SECTION 1. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 5 necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any money in the State 6 7 General Fund not otherwise appropriated, for payment of the 8 expenses of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics of the Mississippi Department of Public Safety, created by Section 41-29-101 et seq., 9 Mississippi Code of 1972, for the fiscal year beginning 10 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004.....\$ 9,765,382.00. 11 SECTION 2. The following sum, or so much thereof as may be 12 13 necessary, is hereby authorized for expenditure out of any money 14 in the special fund in the State Treasury to the credit of the Mississippi Bureau of Narcotics of the Mississippi Department of 15 Public Safety which is comprised of special source funds collected 16 by or otherwise available to the agency, for the support and 17 maintenance of the agency for the fiscal year beginning 18 July 1, 2003, and ending June 30, 2004..... \$ 1,538,702.00. 19 SECTION 3. 44	With the funds herein appropriated, it is the intention of
45	the Legislature that it shall be the agency's responsibility to
46	make certain that funds required to be appropriated for "Personal
47	Services" for Fiscal Year 2005 do not exceed Fiscal Year 2004
48	funds appropriated for that purpose, unless programs or positions
49	are added to the agency's Fiscal Year 2005 budget by the
50	Mississippi Legislature. Based on data provided by the
51	Legislative Budget Office, the State Personnel Board shall
52	determine and publish the projected annual cost to fully fund all

65 Any transfers or escalations shall be made in accordance with 66 the terms, conditions and procedures established by law.

No general funds authorized to be expended herein shall be used to replace federal funds and/or other special funds which are being used for salaries authorized under the provisions of this act and which are withdrawn and no longer available.

SECTION 4. Of the funds appropriated under the provisions of Section 2, funds are included to defray the costs of clothing for sworn law enforcement officers in an amount not to exceed One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00) annually per officer.

75 **SECTION 5.** The Director of the Bureau of Narcotics shall 76 have the authority to transfer any funds between any major objects 77 of expenditure, including but not limited to Salaries, Wages, and 78 Fringe Benefits, up to ten percent (10%).

79 SECTION 6. It is the intention of the Legislature that Fair Labor Standards Act (FLSA) non-exempt sworn officers may 80 81 accumulate and/or receive monetary compensation for compensatory time not to exceed 300 Hours in any fiscal year. FLSA exempt 82 83 sworn officers may accumulate and/or receive monetary compensation for compensatory time not to exceed 300 hours in any fiscal year. 84 Further, an FLSA exempt sworn officer having more than 300 hours 85 86 of compensatory time on record as of passage of this bill shall 87 exhaust through usage the excess compensatory time by December 31, 2003. Any compensatory time in excess of 300 hours of exempt 88 sworn officers as of January 1, 2004, shall be forfeited and the 89 balance shall be reduced to 300 hours. However, the Bureau of 90 91 Narcotics Director shall have the authority to authorize compensatory time in excess of 300 hours for exempt and non-exempt 92 sworn officers to carry out the duties and functions of the 93 94 Department of Public Safety during times of extraordinary or HR05\SB2951A.J

95 unusual public safety risks, or for federally funded call back 96 details, or for full or part time assignments to federally funded 97 task forces. However, at no time will compensation of FLSA non-98 exempt or exempt sworn officers exceed in total the compensation 99 of the agency head pursuant to Section 25-3-39(2), Mississippi 100 Code of 1972.

101 SECTION 7. The money herein appropriated shall be paid by the State Treasurer out of any money in the State Treasury to the 102 credit of the proper fund or funds as set forth in this act, upon 103 warrants issued by the State Fiscal Officer; and the State Fiscal 104 105 Officer shall issue his warrants upon requisitions signed by the proper person, officer or officers, in the manner provided by law. 106 SECTION 8. This act shall take effect and be in force from 107 and after July 1, 2003. 108
