Mississippi, except for a member of the Legislature, shall deliver 98 99 to his successor in office, or to the joint committee if there is no successor, the set of the Mississippi Code of 1972 provided the 100 101 officeholder under this section. Before the joint committee delivers or provides for delivery 102 103 of a copy of the Mississippi Code of 1972 to an individual officeholder, the joint committee shall prepare and submit a 104 written agreement to the officeholder. The agreement shall, among 105 other provisions, state that the code is the property of the State 106 107 of Mississippi, that it shall be transferred to the officeholder's 108 successor in office, that the officeholder has an obligation to make such transfer and that the officeholder shall be responsible 109 110 for the failure to deliver the code and for any damage or destruction to the code, normal wear and tear excepted. The joint 111 committee shall execute the agreement and forward it to the 112 officeholder for execution. The joint committee shall not deliver 113 114 or provide for delivery of the code to the officeholder until the executed agreement is received by the committee. The joint 115 116 committee may include in the agreement such other provisions as it 117 may deem reasonable and necessary. In addition to damages or any other remedy for not transferring a set of the code to his 118 successor, an officeholder who does not transfer his set of the 119 code shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall, upon conviction, 120 pay a fine of One Thousand Dollars (\$1,000.00). Upon request of 121 122 the joint committee, the Attorney General shall assist the joint committee in taking such actions as necessary to require an 123 124 officeholder to transfer the set of code provided under this section to his successor, or to the joint committee if there is no 125 successor, and to recover reimbursement or damages from any 126 officeholder for the loss of or damage or destruction to any 127 128 volumes of the set of the code provided under this section, other 129 than normal wear and tear. Replacement of missing, damaged or destroyed sets or volumes 130 of the code provided by this chapter may be obtained from the code 131
