Adopted AMENDMENT No. 1 PROPOSED TO

AMEND by inserting the following after line 669 and renumber 1 2 subsequent section(s) accordingly: SECTION *. Section 23-15-631, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 3 amended as follows: 4 23-15-631. (1) The registrar shall enclose with each ballot 5 provided to an absent elector separate printed instructions 6 7 furnished by him containing the following: All absentee voters, excepting those with temporary 8 (a) or permanent physical disabilities or those who are sixty-five 9 10 (65) years of age or older, who mark their ballots in the county of the residence shall use the registrar of that county as the 11 12 witness. Said absentee voter shall come to the office of the 13 registrar and neither the registrar nor his deputy shall be required to go out of the registrar's office to serve as an 14 attesting witness. 15 Upon receipt of the enclosed ballot, you will not 16 (b) mark same except in view or sight of the attesting witness. 17 In the sight or view of the attesting witness, mark the ballot 18 according to instructions. 19 After marking the ballot, fill out and sign the 20 (C) 21 "ELECTOR'S CERTIFICATE" on back of the envelope so that the signature shall be across the flap of the envelope so as to insure 22 23 the integrity of the ballot. All absent electors shall have the

attesting witness sign the "ATTESTING WITNESS CERTIFICATE" across 24 25 the flap on back of the envelope. Place necessary postage on the 26 envelope and deposit it in the post office or some government receptacle provided for deposit of mail so that the absent 27 elector's ballot, excepting presidential absentee ballots, will 28 reach the registrar in which your precinct is located not later 29 than 5:00 p.m. on the day preceding the date of the election, or 30 by personally delivering such ballot to the registrar's office not 31 later than 12:00 noon on the Saturday immediately preceding 32 33 elections held on Tuesday, the Thursday immediately preceding elections held on Saturday, and the second day immediately 34 preceding elections held on other days. 35

36 Any notary public, United States postmaster, assistant United States postmaster, United States postal supervisor, clerk in 37 charge of a contract postal station, or any officer having 38 authority to administer an oath or take an acknowledgment may be 39 40 an attesting witness; provided, however, that in the case of an absent elector who is temporarily or permanently physically 41 42 disabled, the attesting witness may be any person eighteen (18) years of age or older and such person is not required to have the 43 authority to administer an oath. If a postmaster, assistant 44 postmaster, postal supervisor, or clerk in charge of a contract 45 postal station acts as an attesting witness, his signature on the 46 47 elector's certificate must be authenticated by the cancellation stamp of their respective post offices. If one or the other 48 49 officers herein named acts as attesting witness, his signature on 50 the elector's certificate, together with his title and address, but no seal, shall be required. Any affidavits made by an absent 51 52 elector who is in the Armed Forces may be executed before a commissioned officer, warrant officer, or noncommissioned officer 53 54 not lower in grade than sergeant rating or any person authorized 55 to administer oaths.

(d) When the application accompanies the ballot it
shall not be returned in the same envelope as the ballot but shall
be returned in a separate preaddressed envelope provided by the

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59 registrar.

(e) A person who is a candidate for public office may
not be an attesting witness for any absentee ballot upon which the
person's name appears.

Any voter casting an absentee ballot who declares 63 (f) that he requires assistance to vote by reason of blindness, 64 temporary or permanent physical disability or inability to read or 65 write, shall be entitled to receive assistance in the marking of 66 his absentee ballot and in completing the affidavit on the 67 68 absentee ballot envelope. The voter may be given assistance by anyone of the voter's choice other than a candidate whose name 69 appears on the absentee ballot being marked, or the voter's 70 71 employer, or agent of that employer. In order to ensure the integrity of the ballot, any person who provides assistance to an 72 absentee voter shall be required to sign and complete the 73 "Certificate of Person Providing Voter Assistance" on the absentee 74 75 ballot envelope.

(2) <u>The Secretary of State shall prepare instructions on how</u>
 <u>absent voters may comply with the Help America Vote Act of 2002</u>
 <u>which shall be provided to the registrar and enclosed with each</u>
 <u>absent ballot.</u>

80 <u>(3)</u> The foregoing instructions required to be provided by 81 the registrar to the elector shall also constitute the substantive 82 law pertaining to the handling of absentee ballots by the elector 83 and registrar.

84 SECTION *. Section 23-15-639, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 85 amended as follows:

23-15-639. (1) At the close of the regular balloting and at 86 the close of the polls, the election managers of each voting 87 precinct shall first take the envelopes containing the absentee 88 ballots of such electors from the box, and the name, address and 89 90 precinct inscribed on each such envelope shall be announced by the election managers. The signature on the application shall then be 91 compared with the signature on the back of the envelope. If it 92 93 corresponds and the affidavit, if one is required, is sufficient

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94 and the election managers find that the applicant is a registered 95 and qualified voter or otherwise qualified to vote, and that he has not appeared in person and voted at such election, the 96 envelope shall then be opened and the ballot removed from the 97 envelope, without its being unfolded, or permitted to be unfolded 98 99 or examined. Having observed and found the ballot to be regular as far as can be observed from its official endorsement, the 100 election managers shall deposit it in the ballot box with the 101 other ballots before counting any ballots and enter the voter's 102 103 name in the receipt book provided for that purpose and mark 104 "VOTED" in the pollbook or poll list as if he had been present and If voting machines are used, all absentee 105 voted in person. 106 ballots shall be placed in the ballot box before any ballots are counted, and the election managers in each precinct shall 107 immediately count such absentee ballots and add them to the votes 108 cast in the voting machine or device. 109

110 (2) The election managers shall also take such action as may
 111 be prescribed by the Secretary of State to ensure compliance with
 112 the provisions of the Help America Vote Act of 2002.

113 SECTION *. Section 23-15-719, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
114 amended as follows:

115 23-15-719. (1) Immediately upon completion of an application filed pursuant to the provisions of paragraph (a) of 116 Section 23-15-715, the registrar shall deliver the necessary 117 118 ballots to the applicant. The registrar shall only deliver the ballots to the applicant by mail or to the applicant in the 119 120 registrar's office. The registrar shall not personally hand deliver ballots to voters, unless he delivers the ballots in the 121 office of the registrar. The elector shall fill in his ballot in 122 secret. After the applicant has properly marked the ballot and 123 properly folded it, he shall deposit it in the envelope furnished 124 125 him by the registrar. The registrar shall take such action as may be prescribed by the Secretary of State to ensure compliance with 126 127 the provisions of the Help America Vote Act of 2002.

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After he has sealed the envelope, he shall subscribe and

swear to an affidavit in the following form, which shall be printed on the back of the envelope containing the applicant's ballot:

After the completion of the requirements of this section, the lector shall deliver the envelope containing the ballot to the registrar.

(2) If the voter has received assistance in marking his ballot, the person providing the assistance shall complete the following form which shall be printed on the back of the envelope containing the applicant's ballot:

157 "CERTIFICATE OF PERSON PROVIDING VOTER ASSISTANCE (To be completed only if the voter has received assistance in 159 marking the enclosed ballot.) I hereby certify that the 160 above-named voter declared to me that he or she is blind, 161 temporarily or permanently physically disabled, or cannot read or 162 write, and that the voter requested that I assist the voter in 163 marking the enclosed absentee ballot. I hereby certify that the
