HOUSE BILL NO. 146

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 63-1-47, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REQUIRE EVERY PERSON SEVENTY YEARS OF AGE OR OLDER, UPON EACH 2 RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE, EXCEPT UPON RENEWAL OF A DRIVER'S LICENSE BY ELECTRONIC MEANS, TO TAKE AND PASS A VISION SCREENING 3 4 EXAMINATION TO BE ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY; 5 6 AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 63-1-47, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 8 9 amended as follows: 10 63-1-47. (1) Except as otherwise provided in this section, each applicant for an original license issued pursuant to this 11 article, who is entitled to issuance of same, and who is eighteen 12 13 (18) years of age or older, shall be issued a four-year license which will expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. 14 (a) Except as otherwise provided in this section, all 15 renewal licenses of operators eighteen (18) years of age or older 16 shall be for four-year periods and may be renewed any time within 17 six (6) months before the expiration of the license upon 18 application and payment of the required fee, unless required to be 19 20 reexamined. Every person seventy (70) years of age or older, 21 (b) 22 upon each renewal of a driver's license, except upon renewal of a driver's license by electronic means as authorized under Section 23 24 63-1-35, in addition to complying with all other requirements for 25 the renewal of a driver's license, must take and pass a vision

26 screening examination to be administered by the Department of

27 Public Safety. No additional fee shall be charged by the

28 department for administering such examination.

(c) From and after January 1, 1990, no commercial 29 30 driver's license shall be issued under the provisions of this article for any commercial motor vehicle, the lawful operation of 31 32 which requires the driver to obtain a Class A, B or C commercial 33 driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; however, from 34 time to time, the holder of a commercial license may apply for a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this chapter; and, 35 if he fails to pass the required test for such license, he shall 36 be entitled to an extension of his license that shall be valid for 37 one hundred twenty (120) days or until he again is tested under 38 39 Article 2 of this chapter, whichever occurs first. The extension shall entitle the license holder to operate all vehicles which 40 41 such license authorized him to operate prior to taking the The first extension shall be without charge; 42 required test. however, a fee of Fifteen Dollars (\$15.00) shall be imposed for 43 any subsequent extension. No extension shall be valid past March 44 31, 1992. 45

46 Any commercial driver's license issued under this (2)article before January 1, 1990, which expires after March 31, 47 48 1992, shall be void on April 1, 1992, for the operation of any commercial vehicle requiring a commercial license to be issued 49 50 under Article 2 of this chapter; however, if the holder of any such license applies for a commercial driver's license under 51 Article 2 of this chapter, passes the required tests for such 52 53 license, pays all applicable fees under Article 2 of this chapter except the Forty Dollars (\$40.00) license fee and otherwise meets 54 55 all requirements for the issuance of such license, then such person shall be issued a license under Article 2 of this chapter 56 57 which shall expire on the expiration date of the commercial driver's license being replaced. 58

59 (3) The fee for the issuance of an original and renewals of 60 a Class D commercial driver's license under this article to an 61 applicant who is not a United States citizen and who does not H. B. 65 (4) The Commissioner of Public Safety shall notify, by 66 United States mail addressed to the last known address of record 67 with the Department of Public Safety, all holders of a commercial driver's license issued under this article before January 1, 1990, 68 and which expire after March 31, 1992, that such license will be 69 70 void on and after April 1, 1992, for the operation of any vehicle for which a commercial driver's license is required to be issued 71 72 under Article 2 of this chapter.

73 (5) Any person holding a valid commercial driver's license 74 issued under this article before January 1, 1990, shall continue 75 thereafter, until expiration of such license, to be entitled to 76 operate all vehicles which such license authorized him to operate 77 immediately before January 1, 1990, except that from and after 78 April 1, 1992, such license shall not entitle the licensee to 79 operate a commercial motor vehicle the lawful operation of which requires a commercial driver's license under Article 2 of this 80 81 chapter.

Except as otherwise provided in this article, each 82 (6) 83 applicant for an original driver's license issued pursuant to this article, who is entitled to issuance of same, being under eighteen 84 (18) years of age, shall be issued a one-year license which will 85 86 expire at midnight on the licensee's birthday. Renewal drivers' licenses of operators under the age of eighteen (18) shall be for 87 88 one-year periods and may be renewed any time within two (2) months before the expiration of the license upon application and payment 89 of the required fee, unless required to be reexamined. 90 An intermediate license shall be valid for one (1) year from its date 91 92 of issue and may be renewed any time within fourteen (14) days 93 before expiration of the license. All applications by an operator 94 under the age of eighteen (18) must be accompanied by *HR03/R687*

96 education requirements of Section 63-1-9(1)(g), and the

97 documentation must be dated no more than thirty (30) days prior to

98 the date of application.

99 (7) Any license issued under this article to a person who is not a United States citizen and who does not possess a social 100 101 security number issued by the United States government shall 102 expire one (1) year from the date of issuance and may be renewed, if such person is otherwise qualified to renew such license, 103 within thirty (30) days of expiration. The fee for any such 104 105 license and for renewal shall be as prescribed in Section 63-1-43. 106 SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2004. 107
