## HOUSE BILL NO. 212

AN ACT TO CREATE A TASK FORCE TO STUDY THE TAX SYSTEM OF THIS 1 STATE AND TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS THEREON TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND 2 3 FOR RELATED PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 4 (1) There is created a task force to study the 5 SECTION 1. tax system of Mississippi. The task force shall make a report of 6 its findings and recommendations to the Legislature during the 7 8 2005 Regular Legislative Session and each regular legislative session thereafter, including any recommended legislation. 9 (2) The task force shall be composed of the following 10 twenty-five (25) members: 11 12 (a) Ten (10) members appointed by the Speaker of the 13 Mississippi House of Representatives as follows: (i) The Speaker Pro Tempore of the House; 14 15 (ii) The Chairman of the House Ways and Means 16 Committee; (iii) The Chairman of the House Appropriations 17 18 Committee; (iv) Two (2) certified public accountants from a 19 20 list of twenty (20) certified public accountants submitted by the 21 State Board of Public Accountancy; 22 (v) A representative of the Mississippi Supervisors Association; 23 (vi) A representative of the Mississippi Municipal 24 League; and 25 26 (vii) Three (3) representatives of the general 27 public; \*HR03/R131\* H. 28 Ten (10) members appointed by the Lieutenant (b) 29 Governor of the State of Mississippi as follows: 30 (i) The President Pro Tempore of the Senate; 31 (ii) The Chairman of the Senate Finance Committee; 32 (iii) The Chairman of the Senate Appropriations 33 Committee; 34 (iv) Two (2) certified public accountants from a list of twenty (20) certified public accountants submitted by the 35 State Board of Public Accountancy; 36 37 (v) A representative of the Mississippi 38 Manufacturers Association; (vi) A representative of the Taxation Section of 39 40 The Mississippi Bar; 41 (vii) Three (3) representatives of the general public; and 42 Five (5) members appointed by the Governor of the 43 (C) 44 State of Mississippi as follows: 45 (i) The Chairman of the Mississippi State Tax Commission; 46 47 (ii) The Executive Director of the Mississippi 48 Development Authority; and 49 (iii) Three (3) representatives of the general 50 public. Appointments shall be made within thirty (30) days after 51 (3) 52 the effective date of this act, and, within fifteen (15) days thereafter on a day to be designated jointly by the Speaker of the 53 54 House and the Lieutenant Governor, the task force shall meet and 55 organize by selecting from its membership a chairman and a vice 56 chairman. The vice chairman shall also serve as secretary and 57 shall be responsible for keeping all records of the task force. Α majority of the members of the task force shall constitute a 58 59 quorum. of the task force shall be required. All members shall be notified in writing of all meetings, such notices to be mailed at least fifteen (15) days before the date on which a meeting is to be held.

65 (4) The task force shall study and make recommendations 66 regarding the imposition of state taxes and the granting of tax 67 exemptions in all areas of taxation including, but not limited to, 68 sales taxes, income taxes, privilege taxes, fuel taxes, diversions 69 of taxes and the relationship between state and local taxes.

70 (5) Members of the task force who are not legislators, state 71 officials or state employees shall be compensated at the per diem rate authorized by Section 25-3-69 and shall be reimbursed in 72 73 accordance with Section 25-3-41 for mileage and actual expenses 74 incurred in the performance of their duties. Legislative members 75 of the task force shall be paid from the contingent expense funds 76 of their respective houses in the same manner as provided for 77 committee meetings when the Legislature is not in session. 78 However, no per diem or expense for attending meetings of the task force will be paid to legislative members of the task force while 79 80 the Legislature is in session. No task force member may incur per 81 diem, travel or other expenses unless previously authorized by 82 vote, at a meeting of the task force, which action shall be recorded in the official minutes of the meeting. Nonlegislative 83 84 members shall be paid from any funds made available to the task 85 force for that purpose.

The task force shall use clerical and legal staff 86 (6)87 already employed by the Legislature and any other staff assistance made available to it. To effectuate the purposes of this section, 88 any department, division, board, bureau, commission or agency of 89 the state or of any political subdivision thereof shall, at the 90 91 request of the chairman of the task force, provide to the task 92 force such facilities, assistance and data as will enable the task 93 force properly to carry out its task.
