HOUSE BILL NO. 445

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 41-59-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 REVISE THE DEFINITION OF "FIRST RESPONDER" IN THE EMERGENCY 2 3 MEDICAL SERVICES LAW BY DELETING THE REQUIREMENT FOR CERTIFICATION BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO REPEAL SECTION 41-59-79, 4 MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH REQUIRES FIRST RESPONDERS TO BE 5 б CERTIFIED BY THE STATE DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH; TO REPEAL SECTION 7 41-59-81, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH AUTHORIZES THE STATE 8 BOARD OF HEALTH TO PROMULGATE RULES AND REGULATIONS REGARDING THE CERTIFICATION OF FIRST RESPONDERS; TO BRING FORWARD SECTION 9 41-59-83, WHICH AUTHORIZES CERTAIN EMERGENCY MEDICAL PERSONNEL TO 10 11 CARRY AND ADMINISTER EPINEPHRINE; TO REPEAL SECTION 5, CHAPTER 623, LAWS OF 2002, AS AMENDED BY CHAPTER 3, 2002 FIRST 12 EXTRAORDINARY SESSION, WHICH DELAYS UNTIL JULY 1, 2004, THE EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE FIRST RESPONDER PROVISIONS; AND FOR RELATED 13 14 15 PURPOSES. BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 16 SECTION 1. Section 41-59-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 17 18 amended as follows: 19 41-59-3. As used in this chapter, unless the context otherwise requires, the term: 20 21 (a) "Ambulance" shall mean any privately or publicly 2.2 owned land or air vehicle that is especially designed, constructed, modified or equipped to be used, maintained and 23 24 operated upon the streets, highways or airways of this state to assist persons who are sick, injured, wounded, or otherwise 25 incapacitated or helpless; 26 27 (b) "Auto-injector" means a spring-loaded needle and syringe with a single dose of medicine that will automatically 28 29 release and inject the medicine; (c) "Permit" shall mean an authorization issued for an 30 ambulance vehicle and/or a special use EMS vehicle as meeting the 31 32 standards adopted pursuant to this chapter;

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33 (d) "License" shall mean an authorization to any 34 person, firm, corporation, or governmental division or agency to 35 provide ambulance services in the State of Mississippi;

(e) "Emergency medical technician" shall mean an
 individual who possesses a valid emergency medical technician's
 certificate issued pursuant to the provisions of this chapter;

39 (f) "Certificate" shall mean official acknowledgment 40 that an individual has successfully completed the recommended 41 basic emergency medical technician training course referred to in 42 this chapter which entitles that individual to perform the 43 functions and duties of an emergency medical technician;

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(g) "Board" shall mean the State Board of Health;(h) "Department" means the Mississippi State Departmentof Health, Division of Emergency Medical Services;

47 (i) "Executive officer" shall mean the Executive
48 Officer of the State Board of Health, or his designated
49 representative;

50 "First Responder" means a person who uses a limited (i) amount of equipment to perform the initial assessment of and 51 52 intervention with sick, wounded or otherwise incapacitated persons, who (i) is trained to assist other EMS personnel by 53 54 successfully completing, within the previous two (2) years, an approved "First Responder: National Standard Curriculum" training 55 56 program, as developed and promulgated by the United States 57 Department of Transportation and (ii) is nationally registered as a First Responder by the National Registry of Emergency Medical 58 59 Technicians; * * *

60 (k) "Invalid vehicle" shall mean any privately or 61 publicly owned land or air vehicle which is maintained, operated 62 and used only to transport persons routinely who are convalescent 63 or otherwise nonambulatory and do not require the service of an 64 emergency medical technician while in transit;

publicly owned land, water or air emergency vehicle used to
support the provision of emergency medical services. These
vehicles shall not be used routinely to transport patients;

69 (m) "Trauma care system" or "trauma system" means a 70 formally organized arrangement of health care resources that has 71 been designated by the department by which major trauma victims 72 are triaged, transported to and treated at trauma care facilities;

(n) "Trauma care facility" or "trauma center" means a hospital located in the State of Mississippi or a Level I trauma care facility or center located in a state contiguous to the State of Mississippi that has been designated by the department to perform specified trauma care services within a trauma care system pursuant to standards adopted by the department. Participation in this designation by each hospital is voluntary;

(o) "Trauma registry" means a collection of data on
patients who receive hospital care for certain types of injuries.
Such data are primarily designed to ensure quality trauma care and
outcomes in individual institutions and trauma systems, but have
the secondary purpose of providing useful data for the
surveillance of injury morbidity and mortality.

86 **SECTION 2.** Section 41-59-79, Mississippi Code of 1972, which 87 requires first responders to be certified, is repealed.

88 **SECTION 3.** Section 41-59-81, Mississippi Code of 1972, which 89 authorizes the State Board of Health to promulgate rules and 90 regulations regarding the certification of first responders, is 91 repealed.

92 SECTION 4. Section 41-59-83, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 93 brought forward as follows:

94 41-59-83. When authorized by medical direction, a first 95 responder, an emergency medical technician-basic, an emergency 96 medical technician-intermediate or an emergency medical 97 technician-paramedic may carry and administer, or aid in the H. B. No. 445 *HR03/R895*

100 **SECTION 5.** Section 5, Chapter 623, Laws of 2002, as amended 101 by Chapter 3, 2002 First Extraordinary Session, which delays until 102 July 1, 2004, the effective date of the first responder 103 provisions, is repealed.

104 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 105 and after July 1, 2004.
