HOUSE BILL NO. 516

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-203, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 1 TO PROVIDE THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF MUNICIPAL 2 3 SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS SHALL BE ELECTED FROM SPECIAL TRUSTEE ELECTION DISTRICTS BY THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF THOSE DISTRICTS; 4 TO PROVIDE THAT THE ELECTION SHALL BE HELD EVERY FOUR YEARS IN THE 5 б SAME MANNER AND AT THE SAME TIME AS ELECTIONS ARE HELD FOR OTHER MUNICIPAL OFFICERS; TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-703, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE THAT THE MEMBERS OF THE BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF 7 8 SPECIAL MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS THAT INCLUDE THE 9 ENTIRE COUNTY SHALL BE ELECTED IN THE SAME MANNER AS TRUSTEES OF 10 11 MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS AT THE SAME TIME AS GENERAL STATE AND COUNTY ELECTIONS ARE HELD; TO AMEND SECTION 37-7-713, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELECTION OF MEMBERS OF THE BOARDS OF TRUSTEES OF SPECIAL MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL 12 13 14 DISTRICTS IN THE SAME MANNER AND AT THE SAME TIME AS MUNICIPAL 15 ELECTIONS AND TO ESTABLISH A TERM OF FOUR YEARS FOR THAT OFFICE; 16 TO REPEAL SECTIONS 37-7-204, 37-7-209 AND 37-7-213 THROUGH 37-7-219, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDE CERTAIN METHODS 17 18 FOR ELECTING TRUSTEES OF MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS FROM 19 20 ADDED TERRITORY; TO REPEAL SECTIONS 37-7-705, 37-7-707, 37-7-709, 37-7-711, 37-7-715 AND 37-7-717, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH 21 PROVIDE CERTAIN METHODS FOR SELECTING TRUSTEES OF SPECIAL 22 23 MUNICIPAL SEPARATE SCHOOL DISTRICTS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES. 24 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 25 SECTION 1. Section 37-7-203, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 26 amended as follows: 37-7-203. (1) The boards of trustees of all municipal 27 28 separate school districts created under the provisions of Article 1 of this chapter, either with or without added territory, shall 29 30 consist of five (5) members. On the first Tuesday after the first 31 Monday in June 2005, and every four (4) years thereafter, an

32 election shall be held in each municipal separate school district

33 in this state, in the same manner and at the same time as the

34 regular municipal elections are held, for the purpose of electing

35 the members of the boards of trustees established under the

36 provisions of this article. All members of the boards of trustees

37 as constituted in this section shall take office on the first

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Monday of July following the date of their election and shall 38 serve for a term of four (4) years. The five (5) members of the 39 40 board of trustees shall be elected from trustee election districts 41 by the qualified electors of the district, as provided in this 42 section. The governing authorities of the municipality shall 43 apportion the municipal separate school district, including added territory, into five (5) trustee election districts as nearly 44 equal as possible according to population, incumbency and other 45 factors pronounced by the courts before the effective date of 46 ____, 2004 Regular Session. The municipal 47 House Bill No. _ 48 governing authorities shall place upon their minutes the boundaries determined for the five (5) new trustee election 49 50 districts. The municipal governing authorities shall thereafter 51 publish the same in a newspaper having general circulation within the school district for at least three (3) consecutive weeks; and 52 after having given notice of publication and recording the same 53 54 upon the minutes of the municipal governing authorities, the new 55 district lines shall be effective thereafter. The term of each incumbent trustee serving on the date that House Bill No. 56 _ / 57 2004 Regular Session, becomes effective that otherwise would expire after the first Monday of July 2005, shall expire on the 58 first Monday of July 2005. Each incumbent trustee whose term 59 60 expires after the effective date of House Bill No. , 2004 Regular Session, but before the first Monday of July 2005, shall 61 62 continue to serve for the remainder of the unexpired term, at which time the vacancy shall be filled in the manner provided by 63 64 subsection (2) of this section. 65 Vacancies in the membership of the board of trustees of (2) any municipal separate school district shall be filled by 66 appointment, within sixty (60) days after the vacancy occurs, by 67 68 the governing authorities of the municipality. 71 governing authorities shall certify to the Secretary of State the 72 fact of the appointment, and the Governor shall commission the person appointed. If the unexpired term is longer than six (6) 73 74 months, the appointee shall serve until a successor is elected as 75 provided in this section, unless the vacancy occurs ninety (90) or 76 fewer days before the general election in a year in which an election would normally be held for that office as provided by 77 law, in which case the person appointed shall serve the unexpired 78 79 portion of the term. The vacancies shall be filled for the unexpired term by the qualified electors at the next regular 80 81 special election day occurring more than ninety (90) days after the occurrence of the vacancy. The president of the municipal 82 83 governing authorities, within ten (10) days after the occurrence of the vacancy, shall make an order, in writing, directed to the 84 commissioners of election, directing an election to be held on the 85 next regular special election day to fill the vacancy. The 86 87 election commissioners shall require each candidate to qualify at 88 least sixty (60) days before the date of the election, and shall give a certificate of election to the person elected, and shall 89 90 return to the Secretary of State a copy of the order of holding the election and the results of the election, certified by the 91 president of the municipal governing authorities. The Governor 92 shall commission the person elected. The election shall be held 93 in the same manner provided for other municipal office vacancies. 94 95 However, where only one (1) person has qualified with the commissioners of election to be a candidate within the time 96 97 provided by law, the commissioners of election shall certify to the municipal governing authorities that there is only one (1) 98 candidate. The municipal governing authorities shall dispense 99 100 with the election and shall appoint the certified candidate to fill the unexpired term. The president of the municipal governing 101 102 authorities shall certify to the Secretary of State the candidate 103 so appointed to serve in the office and the Governor shall *HR40/R528* H. B. commission the candidate. If no person has qualified at least 104 105 sixty (60) days before the date of the election, the commissioners of election shall certify that fact to the municipal governing 106 107 authorities, which shall dispense with the election and fill the 108 vacancy by appointment. The president of the municipal governing 109 authorities shall certify to the Secretary of State the fact of the appointment, and the Governor shall commission the appointed 110 111 person. SECTION 2. Section 37-7-703, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 112 113 amended as follows: 114 37-7-703. The boards of trustees of all * * * special municipal separate school districts which embrace the entire 115 116 county regardless of whether a majority of the inhabitants of the county reside within or outside the corporate limits of the 117 municipality, shall consist of five (5) members. On the first 118 Tuesday after the first Monday in November 2007 and every four (4) 119 years thereafter, an election shall be held in the same manner and 120 121 at the same time as general state and county elections are held and conducted, for the purpose of electing the members of the 122 123 boards of trustees in all special municipal separate school districts that embrace the entire county. All members of the 124 125 boards of trustees of special municipal separate school districts 126 as constituted in this section shall take office on the first Monday of January following the date of their election and shall 127 128 serve for a term of four (4) years. Vacancies in the membership of the board of trustees of any special municipal separate school 129 130 district shall be filled in the manner provided in subsection (2) of Section 37-7-203. The five (5) members of the board of 131 trustees shall be elected from trustee election districts by the 132 133 qualified electors of the district, as provided in this section. The governing authorities of the municipality shall apportion the 134 135 municipal separate school district, including added territory, 136 into five (5) trustee election districts as nearly equal as *HR40/R528* H. 153 January 2008 shall continue to serve for the remainder of the

154 <u>unexpired term, at which time the vacancy shall be filled in the</u> 155 manner provided in subsection (2) of Section 37-7-203.

156 SECTION 3. Section 37-7-713, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 157 amended as follows:

158 37-7-713. (1) In all special municipal separate school 159 districts where the district embraces less than the entire area of the county and where the majority of the educable children of such 160 161 district reside outside the limits of the municipality, * * * the * * * special municipal separate school district shall be 162 163 governed by a board of trustees consisting of five (5) members, to be elected by the qualified electors of such municipal separate 164 school district * * * in the manner provided by this section. 165 166 On the first Tuesday after the first Monday in June 2005, and 167 every four (4) years thereafter, an election shall be held in each 168 special municipal separate school district as constituted in this 169 section, in the same manner and at the same time as the regular *HR40/R528* H. B. No. 516 04/HR40/R528

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170 municipal elections are held and conducted, for the purpose of 171 electing the members of the boards of trustees established under the provisions of this section. All members of the boards of 172 173 trustees as constituted in this section shall take office on the 174 first Monday of July following the date of their election and shall serve for a term of four (4) years. The five (5) members of 175 the board of trustees shall be elected from trustee election 176 districts by the qualified electors of the district, as provided 177 178 in this section. The governing authorities of the municipality shall apportion the special municipal separate school district 179 180 into five (5) special trustee election districts as nearly equal as possible according to population, incumbency and other factors 181 182 pronounced by the courts before the effective date of House Bill , 2004 Regular Session. The municipal governing 183 No. authorities shall place upon their minutes the boundaries 184 185 determined for the five (5) new trustee election districts. The municipal governing authorities shall thereafter publish the same 186 187 in a newspaper having general circulation within the school district for at least three (3) consecutive weeks; and after 188 189 having given notice of publication and recording the same upon the 190 minutes of the municipal governing authorities, the new district lines shall be effective thereafter. The term of each incumbent 191 192 trustee serving on the date that House Bill No. __, 2004 Regular Session, becomes effective that otherwise would expire after the 193 194 first Monday of July 2005, shall expire on the first Monday of July 2005. Each incumbent trustee whose term expires after the 195 196 effective date of House Bill No. ____, 2004 Regular Session, but before the first Monday of July 2005, shall continue to serve for 197 the remainder of the unexpired term, at which time the vacancy 198 199 shall be filled in the manner provided by subsection (2) of 200 Section 37-7-203. 201 (2) Vacancies in the membership of the board of trustees of 202 any special municipal separate school district as constituted in

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203 this section shall be filled in the manner provided by subsection

204 (2) of Section 37-7-203.

SECTION 4. Sections 37-7-204, 37-7-209, 37-7-213, 37-7-215, 37-7-217 and 37-7-219, Mississippi Code of 1972, which provide certain methods for electing trustees of municipal separate school districts from added territory, are repealed.

SECTION 5. Sections 37-7-705, 37-7-707, 37-7-709, 37-7-711, 37-7-715 and 37-7-717, Mississippi Code of 1972, which provide certain methods for selecting trustees of special municipal separate school districts, are repealed.

SECTION 6. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.

SECTION 7. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after July 1, 2004, or the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended, whichever is later.
