AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-19-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 1 DELETE THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES SCHOOL COUNSELORS TO 2 3 COMPLETE A CERTIFICATION PROCESS ESTABLISHED BY THE NATIONAL BOARD 4 FOR PROFESSIONAL TEACHING STANDARDS FOR A MASTER TEACHER 5 CERTIFICATE FOR SCHOOL COUNSELORS IN ORDER TO CONTINUE RECEIVING A б SALARY SUPPLEMENT; TO DELETE THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT REQUIRES 7 SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS AND AUDIOLOGISTS TO COMPLETE A CERTIFICATION PROCESS ESTABLISHED BY THE NATIONAL BOARD FOR PROFESSIONAL TEACHING STANDARDS FOR A MASTER TEACHER CERTIFICATE 8 9 10 FOR SCHOOL SPEECH-LANGUAGE PATHOLOGISTS AND AUDIOLOGISTS IN ORDER 11 TO CONTINUE RECEIVING A SALARY SUPPLEMENT; AND FOR RELATED 12 PURPOSES

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is amended as follows:

16 37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The State Board of Education shall have the authority 77 to adopt and amend rules and regulations as are necessary to 78 establish, administer and maintain the system.

79 All teachers employed on a full-time basis shall be paid a minimum salary in accordance with the above scale. However, no 80 school district shall receive any funds under this section for any 81 82 school year during which the local supplement paid to any 83 individual teacher shall have been reduced to a sum less than that paid to that individual teacher for performing the same duties 84 85 from local supplement during the immediately preceding school year. The amount actually spent for the purposes of group health 86 87 and/or life insurance shall be considered as a part of the aggregate amount of local supplement but shall not be considered a 88 part of the amount of individual local supplement. 89

Such teacher shall 149 submit documentation to the State Department of Education that the certificate was received prior to October 15 in order to be 150 151 eligible for the full salary supplement in the current school year, or the teacher shall submit such documentation to the State 152 153 Department of Education prior to February 15 in order to be 154 eligible for a prorated salary supplement beginning with the second term of the school year. 155

156 (ii) Any licensed school counselor who has met the requirements and acquired a National Certified School Counselor 157 158 (NCSC) endorsement from the National Board of Certified Counselors and who is employed by a local school board or the State Board of 159 160 Education as a counselor and not as an administrator. 169 (iii) Any licensed speech-language pathologist and 170 audiologist who has met the requirements and acquired a Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American 171 172 Speech-Language-Hearing Association and who is employed by a local school board. Such licensed speech-language pathologist and 173 174 audiologist shall submit documentation to the State Department of 175 Education that the certificate or endorsement was received prior to October 15 in order to be eligible for the full salary 176 177 supplement in the current school year, or the licensed 178 speech-language pathologist and audiologist shall submit such 179 documentation to the State Department of Education prior to 180 February 15 in order to be eligible for a prorated salary 181 supplement beginning with the second term of the school 182 year. * * *

An employee shall be reimbursed one (1) time for 183 (b) 184 the actual cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement, excluding any costs incurred for 185 186 postgraduate courses, not to exceed Five Hundred Dollars (\$500.00) 187 for a school counselor or speech-language pathologist and audiologist, regardless of whether or not the process resulted in 188 189 the award of the certificate or endorsement. A local school district or any private individual or entity may pay the cost of 190 191 completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for any employee of the school district described under paragraph 192 (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the 193 194 school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the 195 process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. 196 If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing 197 the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an *HR40/R952CS*

H. B. No. 636 04/HR40/R952CS PAGE 6 (CTE\BD) employee, the local school district may agree to directly reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the employee.

(C) 201 All salary supplements, fringe benefits and process 202 reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid 203 directly by the State Department of Education to the local school 204 district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program 205 allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations 206 promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to 207 appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall 208 not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving 209 such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local 210 supplement to which employees with similar training and experience 211 otherwise are entitled.

212 (d) The State Department of Education may not pay any 213 process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who 214 does not complete the certification or endorsement process 215 required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. If an 216 employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a 217 local school district or private individual or entity fails to 218 complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee 219 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for 220 all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on 221 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or 222 endorsement.

223 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 224 and after July 1, 2004.
