7	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
8	SECTION 1. Section 37-19-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
9	amended as follows:
10	37-19-7. (1) This section shall be known and may be cited
11	as the Mississippi "Teacher Opportunity Program (TOP)." The
12	allowance in the minimum education program and the Mississippi
13	Adequate Education Program for teachers' salaries in each county
14	and separate school district shall be determined and paid in
15	accordance with the scale for teachers' salaries as provided in

For teachers holding a Class AAAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Seventy Dollars (\$770.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

For teachers holding a Class AAA license, the minimum base pay specified in this subsection shall be increased by the sum of Seven Hundred Five Dollars (\$705.00) for each year of teaching experience possessed by the person holding such license until such person shall have twenty-five (25) years of teaching experience.

completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement 193 194 for any employee of the school district described under paragraph 195 (a), and the State Department of Education shall reimburse the 196 school district for such cost, regardless of whether or not the 197 process resulted in the award of the certificate or endorsement. 198 If a private individual or entity has paid the cost of completing the process of acquiring the certificate or endorsement for an 199 employee, the local school district may agree to directly 200 201 reimburse the individual or entity for such cost on behalf of the 202 employee.

- reimbursement authorized under this subsection shall be paid directly by the State Department of Education to the local school district and shall be in addition to its minimum education program allotments and not a part thereof in accordance with regulations promulgated by the State Board of Education, and subject to appropriation by the Legislature. Local school districts shall not reduce the local supplement paid to any employee receiving such salary supplement, and the employee shall receive any local supplement to which employees with similar training and experience otherwise are entitled.
- 214 (d) The State Department of Education may not pay any 215 process reimbursement to a school district for an employee who 216 does not complete the certification or endorsement process 217 required to be eligible for the certificate or endorsement. employee for whom such cost has been paid in full or in part by a 218 219 local school district or private individual or entity fails to 220 complete the certification or endorsement process, the employee 221 shall be liable to the school district or individual or entity for 222 all amounts paid by the school district or individual or entity on 223 behalf of that employee toward his or her certificate or 224 endorsement.
