## HOUSE BILL NO. 662

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-159-11, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, 2 TO DELETE THE REPEALER ON THE PROVISION OF LAW THAT ESTABLISHES 3 THE MISSISSIPPI EMPLOYER-ASSISTED HOUSING TEACHER PROGRAM; AND FOR 4 RELATED PURPOSES.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 6 SECTION 1. Section 37-159-11, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 7 amended as follows:

8 37-159-11. (1) There is established the Mississippi 9 Employer-Assisted Housing Teacher Program, which shall be a 10 special home loan program for eligible licensed teachers who render service to the state in a geographical area of the state 11 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated 12 by the State Board of Education. The home loan program shall be 13 administered by the State Department of Education in conjunction 14 with the Federal National Mortgage Association (Fannie Mae). 15 The 16 department may contract with one or more public or private entities to provide assistance in implementing and administering 17 the program. The State Board of Education shall adopt rules and 18 19 regulations regarding the implementation and administration of the 20 program.

21 Participation in the loan program shall be available to (2) any licensed teacher who renders service in a geographical area of 22 23 the state where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education. Any person who 24 receives a loan under the program shall be required to purchase a 25 26 house and reside in a county in which the school district for which the teacher is rendering service, or any portion of the 27 school district, is located. 29 may be made under the program to any person shall be Six Thousand 30 Dollars (\$6,000.00).

31 (3) Any loan made under the program to a person who actually 32 renders service as a teacher in a geographical area of the state 33 where there exists a critical shortage of teachers, as designated 34 by the State Board of Education, shall be converted to an interest-free grant on the basis of one (1) year's service for 35 one-third (1/3) of the amount of the loan. Any person who does 36 not render three (3) years' service as a teacher in a geographical 37 area of the state where there exists a critical shortage of 38 39 teachers, as designated by the State Board of Education, shall be liable to the State Department of Education for one-third (1/3) of 40 the amount of the loan for each year that he does not render such 41 service, plus interest accruing at the current Stafford Loan rate 42 at the time the person discontinues his service. If a claim for 43 repayment under this subsection is placed in the hands of an 44 45 attorney for collection, the obligor shall be liable for an additional amount equal to a reasonable attorney's fee. 46

47 (4) All funds received by the State Department of Education
48 as repayment of loans by program participants shall be deposited
49 in the Mississippi Critical Teacher Shortage Fund.

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51 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 52 and after July 1, 2004.
