HOUSE BILL NO. 665

- AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 37-11-55, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH PROVIDES THAT LOCAL SCHOOL BOARDS SHALL ADOPT AND MAKE AVAILABLE A CODE OF STUDENT CONDUCT, TO DELETE THE REPEALER ON THE PARAGRAPH RECOGNIZING THE TEACHER AS THE AUTHORITY IN CLASSROOM
- 5 MATTERS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 7 **SECTION 1.** Section 37-11-55, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 8 amended as follows:
- 9 37-11-55. The local school board shall adopt and make
- 10 available to all teachers, school personnel, students and parents
- 11 or guardians, at the beginning of each school year, a code of
- 12 student conduct developed in consultation with teachers, school
- 13 personnel, students and parents or guardians. The code shall be
- 14 based on the rules governing student conduct and discipline
- 15 adopted by the school board and shall be made available at the
- 16 school level in the student handbook or similar publication. The
- 17 code shall include, but not be limited to:
- 18 (a) Specific grounds for disciplinary action under the
- 19 school district's discipline plan;
- 20 (b) Procedures to be followed for acts requiring
- 21 discipline, including suspensions and expulsion, which comply with
- 22 due process requirements;
- 23 (c) An explanation of the responsibilities and rights
- 24 of students with regard to: attendance; respect for persons and
- 25 property; knowledge and observation of rules of conduct; free
- 26 speech and student publications; assembly; privacy; and
- 27 participation in school programs and activities;

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- 28 Policies and procedures recognizing the teacher as 29 the authority in classroom matters, and supporting that teacher in 30 any decision in compliance with the written discipline code of Such recognition shall include the right of the teacher 31 32 to remove from the classroom any student who, in the professional 33 judgment of the teacher, is disrupting the learning environment, to the office of the principal or assistant principal. 34 principal or assistant principal shall determine the proper 35 placement for the student, who may not be returned to the 36 classroom until a conference of some kind has been held with the 37 38 parent, quardian or custodian during which the disrupting behavior is discussed and agreements are reached that no further disruption 39 40 will be tolerated. If the principal does not approve of the determination of the teacher to remove the student from the 41 classroom, the student may not be removed from the classroom, and 42 the principal, upon request from the teacher, must provide 43
- (e) Policies and procedures for dealing with a student who causes a disruption in the classroom, on school property or vehicles, or at school-related activities;

justification for his disapproval; * *

- (f) Procedures for the development of behavior

 modification plans by the school principal, reporting teacher and

 student's parent for a student who causes a disruption in the

 classroom, on school property or vehicles, or at school-related

 activities for a second time during the school year; and
- (g) Policies and procedures specifically concerning gang-related activities in the school, on school property or vehicles, or at school-related activities.
- 56 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 57 and after July 1, 2004.

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
