HOUSE BILL NO. 710

1	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 73-34-7, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO
2	CLARIFY THE NUMBER OF MEMBERS FROM THE SAME PROFESSIONAL APPRAISAL
3	ORGANIZATION WHO MAY BE APPOINTED BY THE GOVERNOR TO THE
4	MISSISSIPPI REAL ESTATE COMMISSION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 6 **SECTION 1.** Section 73-34-7, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 7 amended as follows:
- 8 73-34-7. (1) (a) There is hereby established, as an
- 9 adjunct board to the Mississippi Real Estate Commission, a board
- 10 to be known as the Mississippi Real Estate Appraiser Licensing and
- 11 Certification Board, which shall consist of six (6) members. Five
- 12 (5) members shall be appointed by the Governor, with the advice
- 13 and consent of the Senate, one (1) from each congressional
- 14 district as such district existed on January 1, 1989; the
- 15 Administrator of the Mississippi Real Estate Commission shall be
- 16 an ex officio, nonvoting member.
- 17 (b) The initial appointments made by the Governor shall
- 18 be in compliance with guidelines issued by the Federal Financial
- 19 Institutions Examination Council or its designee; and the
- 20 appointees shall serve for terms ending on December 31, 1991. Not
- 21 more than two (2) positions on the board shall be filled with
- 22 appointees who hold membership in the same professional appraisal
- 23 organization.
- 24 (c) From and after January 1, 1992, gubernatorial
- 25 appointments shall be made pursuant to the procedure established
- 26 in this paragraph (c). The five (5) members shall be appointed by
- 27 the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Senate, one (1)
- from each congressional district as such district existed on H. B. No. 710 *HR07/R1051*

- 29 January 1, 1992. At least three (3) members shall be certified
- 30 general real estate appraisers or at least two (2) members shall
- 31 be certified general real estate appraisers and one (1) member may
- 32 be a certified residential real estate appraiser. Not more than
- 33 two (2) positions on the board shall be filled with appointees who
- 34 hold membership in the same professional appraisal organization.
- 35 Of the initial appointments made pursuant to this paragraph (c),
- 36 two (2) shall serve for three (3) years, two (2) shall serve for
- 37 two (2) years and one (1) shall serve for one (1) year.
- 38 Thereafter, each member shall serve for a term of four (4) years.
- 39 Upon the expiration of a member's term, such member shall continue
- 40 to serve until the appointment and qualification of a successor.
- 41 Commencing with appointments made in 1992, no person shall be
- 42 appointed as a member of the board for more than two (2)
- 43 consecutive terms. The Governor may remove an appointed member
- 44 for cause.
- 45 (2) The board shall meet not less than twice a calendar
- 46 year. Written notice shall be given to each member of the time
- 47 and place of each meeting of the board at least ten (10) days
- 48 prior to the scheduled date of the meeting.
- 49 (3) A quorum of the board shall be three (3) voting members;
- 50 commencing January 1, 1992, at least one (1) present must be a
- 51 licensed certified general real estate appraiser or a certified
- 52 residential real estate appraiser. Appointed members of the board
- 53 are entitled to mileage and actual expenses as authorized by
- 54 Section 25-3-41 and per diem as provided by Section 25-3-69; ex
- officio members are entitled to mileage and actual expenses only.
- 56 (4) The board shall elect a chairman and such other officers
- 57 as it deems necessary. Such officers shall serve as such for
- 58 terms established by the board.
- 59 **SECTION 2.** This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 60 and after July 1, 2004.
