## HOUSE BILL NO. 715

1 2 3 4	AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 73-25-14 AND 73-27-12, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO AUTHORIZE THE RENEWAL OF LICENSES TO PRACTICE MEDICINE OR OSTEOPATHY AND PODIATRY BY ELECTRONIC MEANS; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.
5	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
6	SECTION 1. Section 73-25-14, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
7	amended as follows:
8	73-25-14. (1) The license of every person licensed to
9	practice medicine or osteopathy in the State of Mississippi shall
10	be renewed annually.
11	On or before May 1 of each year, the State Board of Medical
12	Licensure shall mail <u>a notice of</u> renewal of license to every
13	physician or osteopath to whom a license was issued or renewed
14	during the current licensing year. The notice shall provide
15	instructions for obtaining and submitting applications for
16	renewal. The State Board of Medical Licensure is authorized to
17	make applications for renewal available via electronic means. The
18	applicant shall obtain and complete the application and submit it
19	to the board in the manner prescribed by the board in the notice
20	before June 30 with the renewal fee of an amount established by
21	the board, but not to exceed Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), a
22	portion of which fee shall be used to support a program to aid
23	impaired physicians and osteopaths. The payment of the annual
24	license renewal fee shall be optional with all physicians over the
25	age of seventy (70) years. Upon receipt of the application and
26	fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the application and
27	issue to applicant a certificate $\underline{\text{of}}$ renewal for the ensuing year,

beginning July 1 and expiring June 30 of the succeeding calendar

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- 29 year. That renewal shall render the holder thereof a legal
- 30 practitioner as stated on the renewal form.
- 31 (2) Any physician or osteopath practicing in Mississippi who
- 32 allows his license to lapse by failing to renew the license as
- 33 provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on
- 34 satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion
- 35 of a reinstatement form, and upon payment of the renewal fee for
- 36 the current year, and shall be assessed a fine of Twenty-five
- 37 Dollars (\$25.00) plus an additional fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00)
- 38 for each month thereafter that the license renewal remains
- 39 delinquent.
- 40 (3) Any physician or osteopath not practicing in Mississippi
- 41 who allows his license to lapse by failing to renew the license as
- 42 provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on
- 43 satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion
- 44 of a reinstatement form and upon payment of the arrearages for the
- 45 previous five (5) years and the renewal fee for the current year.
- 46 (4) Any physician or osteopath who allows his license to
- 47 lapse shall be notified by the board within thirty (30) days of
- 48 such lapse.
- 49 (5) Any person practicing as a licensed physician or
- 50 osteopath during the time his license has lapsed shall be
- 51 considered an illegal practitioner and shall be subject to
- 52 penalties provided for violation of the Medical Practice Act,
- 53 provided he had not submitted the required reinstatement form and
- 54 fee within fifteen (15) days after notification by the board of
- 55 the lapse.
- 56 (6) Any physician or osteopath practicing in the State of
- 57 Mississippi whose license has lapsed and is deemed an illegal
- 58 practitioner under subsection (5) of this section may petition the
- 59 board for reinstatement of his license on a retroactive basis, if
- 60 the physician or osteopath was unable to meet the June 30 deadline
- 61 due to extraordinary or other legitimate reasons, and retroactive

- 62 reinstatement of licensure shall be granted or may be denied by
- 63 the board only for good cause. Failure to advise the board of
- 64 change of address shall not be considered a basis of
- 65 reinstatement.
- 66 (7) None of the fees or fines provided for in this section
- 67 shall be applicable to the renewal of a special volunteer medical
- 68 license authorized under Section 73-25-18.
- 69 (8) Fees collected under the provisions of this section
- 70 shall be used by the board to defray expenses of administering the
- 71 licensure provisions of the Medical Practice Act (Title 73,
- 72 Chapter 25, Mississippi Code of 1972) and to support a program to
- 73 aid impaired physicians and osteopaths in an amount determined by
- 74 the board.
- 75 **SECTION 2.** Section 73-27-12, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 76 amended as follows:
- 77 73-27-12. (1) The license of every person licensed to
- 78 practice podiatry in the State of Mississippi shall be renewed
- 79 annually.
- On or before May 1 of each year, the board shall mail a
- 81 notice of renewal of license to every podiatrist to whom a license
- 82 was issued or renewed during the current licensing year. The
- 83 notice shall provide instructions for obtaining and submitting
- 84 applications for renewal. The State Board of Medical Licensure is
- 85 authorized to make applications for renewal available via
- 86 electronic means. The applicant shall obtain and complete the
- 87 application and submit it to the board in the manner prescribed by
- 88 the board in the notice before June 30 with the renewal fee of an
- 89 amount established by the board, but not to exceed Two Hundred
- 90 Dollars (\$200.00), a portion of which fee shall be used to support
- 91 a program to aid impaired podiatrists. Upon receipt of the
- 92 application and fee, the board shall verify the accuracy of the
- 93 application and issue to applicant a certificate of renewal for
- 94 the ensuing year, beginning July 1 and expiring June 30 of the

- 95 succeeding calendar year. That renewal shall render the holder 96 thereof a legal practitioner as stated on the renewal form.
- 97 (2) Any podiatrist practicing in Mississippi who allows his
  98 license to lapse by failing to renew the license as provided in
  99 subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on satisfactory
  100 explanation for the failure to renew, by completion of a
  101 reinstatement form, and upon payment of the renewal fee for the
  102 current year, and shall be assessed a fine of Twenty-five Dollars
  103 (\$25.00) plus an additional fine of Five Dollars (\$5.00) for each

month thereafter that the license renewal remains delinquent.

- (3) Any podiatrist not practicing in Mississippi who allows his license to lapse by failing to renew the license as provided in subsection (1) may be reinstated by the board on satisfactory explanation for the failure to renew, by completion of a reinstatement form and upon payment of the arrearages for the previous five (5) years and the renewal fee for the current year.
- 111 (4) Any podiatrist who allows his license to lapse shall be 112 notified by the board within thirty (30) days of such lapse.
- 113 (5) Any person practicing as a licensed podiatrist during
  114 the time his license has lapsed shall be considered an illegal
  115 practitioner and shall be subject to penalties set forth in
  116 Section 73-27-17, provided he has not submitted the required
  117 reinstatement form and fee within fifteen (15) days after
  118 notification by the board of the lapse.
- 119 Any podiatrist practicing in the State of Mississippi whose license has lapsed and is deemed an illegal practitioner 120 121 under subsection (5) of this section may petition the board for reinstatement of his license on a retroactive basis, if the 122 podiatrist was unable to meet the June 30 deadline due to 123 124 extraordinary or other legitimate reasons, and retroactive 125 reinstatement of licensure shall be granted or may be denied by 126 the board only for good cause. Failure to advise the board of

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- 127 change of address shall not be considered a basis for
- 128 reinstatement.
- 129 (7) Fees collected under the provisions of this section
- 130 shall be used by the board to defray expenses of administering the
- 131 licensure provisions of Title 73, Chapter 27, Mississippi Code of
- 132 1972, and to support a program to aid impaired podiatrists in an
- 133 amount determined by the board.
- 134 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from
- 135 and after its passage.
