COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 906

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 43-1-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO CREATE THE HUMAN SERVICES PROFESSIONAL MONITORING BOARD TO MONITOR THE POLICIES AND ACTIVITIES OF THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES; TO PROVIDE FOR THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD; TO PROVIDE THAT ONCE EVERY THREE MONTHS, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL PRESENT THE BOARD WITH THE STATE OF AFFAIRS OF THE DEPARTMENT, AND THE BOARD SHALL REPORT BACK TO THE DEPARTMENT AND TO THE LEGISLATURE WITH AN EVALUATION OF HOW WELL THE LONG-TERM OBJECTIVES OF THE DEPARTMENT ARE BEING MET; TO EXTEND THE REPEALER ON THAT SECTION; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
- 12 **SECTION 1.** Section 43-1-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
- 13 amended as follows:
- 14 43-1-2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of
- 15 Human Services, whose offices shall be located in Jackson,
- 16 Mississippi, and which shall be under the policy direction of the
- 17 Governor.

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- 18 (2) The chief administrative officer of the department shall
- 19 be the Executive Director of Human Services. The Governor shall
- 20 appoint the Executive Director of Human Services with the advice
- 21 and consent of the Senate, and he or she shall serve at the will
- 22 and pleasure of the Governor, and until his or her successor is
- 23 appointed and qualified. The Executive Director of Human Services
- 24 shall possess the following qualifications:
- 25 (a) A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
- of higher learning and ten (10) years' experience in management,
- 27 public administration, finance or accounting; or
- 28 (b) A master's or doctoral degree from an accredited
- 29 institution of higher learning and five (5) years' experience in
- 30 management, public administration, finance or accounting.

Those qualifications shall be certified by the State
Personnel Board.

There shall be a Joint Oversight Committee of the 33 (3) 34 Department of Human Services composed of the respective chairmen 35 of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the Senate 36 Appropriations Committee, the House Public Health and Human 37 Services Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, two (2) members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor to 38 serve at the will and pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor, and two 39 40 (2) members of the House of Representatives appointed by the 41 Speaker of the House to serve at the will and pleasure of the Speaker. The chairmanship of the committee shall alternate for 42 43 twelve-month periods between the Senate members and the House members, with the Chairman of the Senate Public Health and Welfare 44 Committee serving as the first chairman. The committee shall meet 45 once each month, or upon the call of the chairman at such times as 46 he deems necessary or advisable, and may make recommendations to 47 the Legislature pertaining to any matter within the jurisdiction 48 of the Mississippi Department of Human Services. The appointing 49 50 authorities may designate an alternate member from their 51 respective houses to serve when the regular designee is unable to 52 attend the meetings of the oversight committee. For attending meetings of the oversight committee, those legislators shall 53 receive per diem and expenses, which shall be paid from the 54 55 contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same amounts as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is 56 57 not in session; however, no per diem and expenses for attending meetings of the committee will be paid while the Legislature is in 58 59 No per diem and expenses will be paid except for session. attending meetings of the oversight committee without prior 60 61 approval of the proper committee in their respective houses. 62 The State Department of Human Services shall provide the

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- 64 eligible therefor, and in carrying out the purposes of the
- 65 department, the executive director is authorized:
- 66 (a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding
- 67 human services within the jurisdiction of the department;
- (b) To adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due
- 69 notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal
- 70 or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and
- 71 variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing
- 72 or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any
- 73 and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of
- 74 which shall be binding upon the county departments of human
- 75 services;
- 76 (c) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or
- 77 state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds
- 78 from any other source;
- 79 (d) Except as limited by Section 43-1-3, to enter into
- 80 and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any
- 81 federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or
- 82 private institution located inside or outside the State of
- 83 Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in
- 84 connection with carrying out the programs of the department; and
- 85 (e) To discharge such other duties, responsibilities
- 86 and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the
- 87 department.
- 88 (5) (a) There is created the Human Services Professional
- 89 Monitoring Board, which shall be composed of nine (9) members as
- 90 follows:
- 91 (i) The Chair of the Infant Mortality Task Force,
- 92 ex officio;
- 93 (ii) One (1) licensed social worker, to be
- 94 appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;

95	(iii) One (1) licensed attorney who is experienced
96	in children's issues, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House
97	of Representatives;
98	(iv) One (1) representative of an organization
99	that advocates for children's health issues, to be appointed by
100	the Governor;
101	(v) One (1) representative of an organization that
102	advocates for foster children, to be appointed by the Governor;
103	(vi) One (1) representative of a senior citizens'
104	advocacy group, to be appointed by the Governor;
105	(vii) One (1) consumer of services of the
106	department, to be appointed by the Lieutenant Governor;
107	(viii) One (1) consumer of services of the
108	department, to be appointed by the Speaker of the House of
109	Representatives; and
110	(ix) One (1) consumer of services of the
111	department, to be appointed by the Governor.
112	(b) The initial appointed members of the board shall be
113	appointed for staggered terms as follows: The members described
114	in subparagraphs (ii), (iii) and (iv) of paragraph (a) shall be
115	appointed for terms that end on June 30, 2006; the members
116	described in subparagraphs (v) and (vi) of paragraph (a) shall be
117	appointed for terms that end on June 30, 2008; and the members
118	described in subparagraphs (vii), (viii) and (ix) of paragraph (a)
119	shall be appointed for terms that end on June 30, 2010. All
120	appointments to the board after the expiration of the original
121	terms shall be made by the original appointing authorities for
122	terms of six (6) years from the expiration date of the previous
123	term. Any vacancy on the board before the expiration of a term
124	shall be filled by appointment of the original appointing
125	authority. The person appointed to fill the vacancy shall serve
126	for the remainder of the unexpired term.

127	(c) The Human Services Professional Monitoring Board
128	shall meet monthly to monitor the policies and activities of the
129	department. Once every three months, the department shall present
130	the board with the state of affairs of the department, and the
131	board shall report back to the department and to the Legislature
132	with an evaluation of how well the long-term objectives of the
133	department are being met.
134	(6) The executive director shall establish the
135	organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human
136	Services, which shall include the creation of any units necessary
137	to implement the duties assigned to the department and consistent
138	with specific requirements of law, including, but not limited to:
139	(a) Office of Family and Children's Services;
140	(b) Office of Youth Services;
141	(c) Office of Economic Assistance;
142	(d) Office of Child Support Enforcement.
143	(7) The Executive Director of Human Services shall appoint
144	heads of offices, bureaus and divisions, as defined in Section
145	7-17-11, who shall serve at the pleasure of the executive
146	director. The salary and compensation of $\underline{\text{those}}$ office, bureau and
147	division heads shall be subject to the rules and regulations
148	adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created
149	under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The executive director shall have
150	the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry
151	out the responsibilities of the department. The organization
152	charts of the department shall be presented annually with the
153	budget request of the Governor for review by the Legislature.
154	(8) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2006 .
155	SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from
156	and after July 1, 2004.
