HOUSE BILL NO. 922

1 AN ACT TO AMEND SECTION 25-3-25, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO 2 AUTHORIZE THE BOARD OF SUPERVISORS OF TUNICA COUNTY TO PAY AN 3 ADDITIONAL \$10,000 IN SALARY; AND FOR RELATED PURPOSES.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI:
SECTION 1. Section 25-3-25, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
amended as follows:

25-3-25. (1) Except as otherwise provided in subsections
(2) through (9), the salaries of sheriffs of the various counties
are hereby fixed as full compensation for their services.

From and after October 1, 1998, the annual salary for each sheriff shall be based upon the total population of his county according to the latest federal decennial census in the following categories and for the following amounts; however, no sheriff shall be paid less than the salary authorized under this section to be paid the sheriff based upon the population of the county according to the 1980 federal decennial census:

17 (a) For counties with a total population of more than
18 two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy-five Thousand
19 Dollars (\$75,000.00).

(b) For counties with a total population of more than one hundred thousand (100,000) and not more than two hundred thousand (200,000), a salary of Seventy Thousand Dollars (\$70,000.00).

(c) For counties with a total population of more than
forty-five thousand (45,000) and not more than one hundred
thousand (100,000), a salary of Sixty-five Thousand Dollars
(\$65,000.00).

(d) For counties with a total population of more than thirty-four thousand (34,000) and not more than forty-five thousand (45,000), a salary of Sixty Thousand Dollars (\$60,000.00).

34 thousand (34,000), a salary of Fifty-two Thousand Dollars
35 (\$52,000.00).

36 (f) For counties with a total population of more than

thousand five hundred (9,500), a salary of Forty-five Thousand
Dollars (\$45,000.00).

48 than seven thousand five hundred (7,500), a salary of Forty-two
49 Thousand Dollars (\$42,000.00).

50 (2) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 51 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Leflore County may, 52 in its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 53 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars 54 (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 55 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 56 county for the following reasons:

57 (a) The Mississippi Department of Corrections operates58 and maintains a restitution center within the county;

The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:

(h) The patrolling of the state properties located within the county has imposed additional duties on the sheriff; and

(i) The sheriff, in addition to providing security to
the nearly one hundred thousand (100,000) residents of the county,
has the duty to investigate, solve and assist in the prosecution
of any misdemeanor or felony committed upon any state property
located in Rankin County.

(4) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1)
of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Neshoba County shall
pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount
equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00).

(5) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County may, in its discretion, pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county an amount equal to Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00), payable beginning April 1, 1997.

(6) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Hinds County shall pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount equal to Fifteen Thousand Dollars (\$15,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such county for the following reasons:

The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 176 177 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 178 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 179 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 180 correctional facility within the county.

181 (8) In addition to the salary provided for in subsection (1) 182 of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Marshall County, in 183 its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the 184 county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual 185 supplement authorized by this subsection is justified in such 186 county because the Mississippi Department of Corrections contracts 187 188 for the private incarceration of state inmates at a private 189 correctional facility within the county.

207 (10)The salaries herein provided shall be payable monthly 208 on the first day of each calendar month by chancery clerk's 209 warrant drawn on the general fund of the county; however, the 210 board of supervisors, by resolution duly adopted and entered on 211 its minutes, may provide that such salaries shall be paid 212 semimonthly on the first and fifteenth day of each month. If a pay date falls on a weekend or legal holiday, salary payments 213 214 shall be made on the workday immediately preceding the weekend or legal holiday. 215

(11) In addition to the salary provided in subsection (1) of this section, the Board of Supervisors of Tunica County, in its discretion, may pay an annual supplement to the sheriff of the county in an amount not to exceed Ten Thousand Dollars (\$10,000.00). The Legislature finds and declares that the annual

(a) The substantial economic growth relating to the 223 casino and tourism industry that has developed in Tunica County; 224 225 and 226 (b) There are currently nine (9) casinos operating in 227 Tunica County which employ in excess of fifteen thousand (15,000) persons and generate over ten million (10,000,000) visitors 228 229 annually to the county; and 230 (c) The growth in tourism in the county has resulted in over 6,000 hotel rooms being constructed in Tunica County which 231 have an occupancy rate in excess of seventy-five percent (75%); 232 233 and 234 (d) The budget of the county's sheriff department has 235 increased significantly over the past ten (10) years in order to 236 provide the necessary funding to allow effective and efficient law enforcement in Tunica County, Mississippi; and 237 238 (e) The county currently employs in excess of one hundred thirty (130) persons which include over fifty (50) 239 240 deputies; and 241 (f) The duties and responsibilities of the sheriff 242 relating to providing law enforcement have grown and increased given the gaming and tourism market that has developed in Tunica 243 244 County. SECTION 2. The Attorney General of the State of Mississippi 245 shall submit this act, immediately upon approval by the Governor, 246 247 or upon approval by the Legislature subsequent to a veto, to the 248 Attorney General of the United States or to the United States District Court for the District of Columbia in accordance with the 249 250 provisions of the Voting Rights Act of 1965, as amended and 251 extended. 252 SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the date it is effectuated under Section 5 of the Voting 253 254 Rights Act of 1965, as amended and extended.
