COMMITTEE SUBSTITUTE FOR HOUSE BILL NO. 931

AN ACT TO AMEND SECTIONS 43-1-1, 43-1-2, 43-1-3, 43-1-5 AND 1 43-1-6, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, WHICH CREATE THE DEPARTMENT OF 2 3 HUMAN SERVICES, PRESCRIBE ITS DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES, PROVIDE FOR THE APPOINTMENT OF AN EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF HUMAN SERVICES, 4 PROVIDE FOR THE AUTHORITY AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE EXECUTIVE 5 DIRECTOR, PROVIDE FOR A JOINT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE OF THE 6 7 DEPARTMENT, PROVIDE THE STRUCTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT AND TRANSFER THE PROGRAMS WITHIN THE DIVISION OF FEDERAL-STATE PROGRAMS TO THE 8 DEPARTMENT, TO EXTEND THE REPEAL DATES ON THOSE SECTIONS; TO 9 FURTHER AMEND SECTION 43-1-2, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO EXPAND 10 THE MEMBERSHIP OF THE JOINT OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE; TO FURTHER AMEND 11 SECTION 43-1-3, MISSISSIPPI CODE OF 1972, TO DELETE THE AUTHORITY 12 OF THE DEPARTMENT TO OPERATE ITS CHILD SUPPORT COLLECTION PROGRAM 13 WITH A PRIVATE ENTITY ON A PILOT PROGRAM BASIS; AND FOR RELATED 14 15 PURPOSES.

16 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MISSISSIPPI: 17 SECTION 1. Section 43-1-1, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 18 amended as follows:

19 43-1-1. (1) The Department of Human Services shall be the State Department of Public Welfare and shall retain all powers and 20 duties as granted to the State Department of Public Welfare. 21 Wherever the term "State Department of Public Welfare" or "State 22 Board of Public Welfare" appears in any law, the same shall mean 23 24 the Department of Human Services. The Executive Director of the Department of Human Services may assign to the appropriate offices 25 such powers and duties deemed appropriate to carry out the lawful 26 27 functions of the department.

(2) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, <u>2006</u>.
 SECTION 2. Section 43-1-2, Mississippi Code of 1972, is
 amended as follows:

31 43-1-2. (1) There is created the Mississippi Department of
32 Human Services, whose offices shall be located in Jackson,

33 Mississippi, and which shall be under the policy direction of the 34 Governor.

35 (2) The chief administrative officer of the department shall 36 be the Executive Director of Human Services. The Governor shall 37 appoint the Executive Director of Human Services with the advice 38 and consent of the Senate, and he <u>or she</u> shall serve at the will 39 and pleasure of the Governor, and until his <u>or her</u> successor is 40 appointed and qualified. The Executive Director of Human Services 41 shall possess the following qualifications:

42 (a) A bachelor's degree from an accredited institution
43 of higher learning and ten (10) years' experience in management,
44 public administration, finance or accounting; or

45 (b) A master's or doctoral degree from an accredited
46 institution of higher learning and five (5) years' experience in
47 management, public administration, finance or accounting.

Those qualifications shall be certified by the StatePersonnel Board.

50 (3) There shall be a Joint Oversight Committee of the Department of Human Services composed of the respective chairmen 51 52 of the Senate Public Health and Welfare Committee, the Senate Appropriations Committee, the House Public Health and Human 53 54 Services Committee and the House Appropriations Committee, four 55 (4) members of the Senate appointed by the Lieutenant Governor to serve at the will and pleasure of the Lieutenant Governor, and 56 57 four (4) members of the House of Representatives appointed by the Speaker of the House to serve at the will and pleasure of the 58 59 Speaker. The chairmanship of the committee shall alternate for twelve-month periods between the Senate members and the House 60 members, with the Chairman of the Senate Public Health and Welfare 61 Committee serving as the first chairman. The committee shall meet 62 63 once each month, or upon the call of the chairman at such times as 64 he or she deems necessary or advisable, and may make

65 recommendations to the Legislature pertaining to any matter within

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the jurisdiction of the Mississippi Department of Human Services. 66 67 The appointing authorities may designate an alternate member from 68 their respective houses to serve when the regular designee is 69 unable to attend the meetings of the oversight committee. For 70 attending meetings of the oversight committee, the legislators 71 shall receive per diem and expenses, which shall be paid from the contingent expense funds of their respective houses in the same 72 amounts as provided for committee meetings when the Legislature is 73 not in session; however, no per diem and expenses for attending 74 meetings of the committee will be paid while the Legislature is in 75 76 No per diem and expenses will be paid except for session. attending meetings of the oversight committee without prior 77 78 approval of the proper committee in their respective houses.

(4) The * * Department of Human Services shall provide the services authorized by law to every individual determined to be eligible therefor, and in carrying out the purposes of the department, the executive director is authorized:

83 (a) To formulate the policy of the department regarding84 human services within the jurisdiction of the department;

85 To adopt, modify, repeal and promulgate, after due (b) notice and hearing, and where not otherwise prohibited by federal 86 87 or state law, to make exceptions to and grant exemptions and variances from, and to enforce rules and regulations implementing 88 or effectuating the powers and duties of the department under any 89 90 and all statutes within the department's jurisdiction, all of which shall be binding upon the county departments of human 91 92 services;

93 (c) To apply for, receive and expend any federal or 94 state funds or contributions, gifts, devises, bequests or funds 95 from any other source;

96 (d) Except as limited by Section 43-1-3, to enter into
97 and execute contracts, grants and cooperative agreements with any
98 federal or state agency or subdivision thereof, or any public or

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99 private institution located inside or outside the State of 100 Mississippi, or any person, corporation or association in 101 connection with carrying out the programs of the department; and

102 (e) To discharge such other duties, responsibilities
103 and powers as are necessary to implement the programs of the
104 department.

(5) The executive director shall establish the organizational structure of the Mississippi Department of Human Services, which shall include the creation of any units necessary to implement the duties assigned to the department and consistent with specific requirements of law, including, but not limited to:

Office of Family and Children's Services;

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(b) Office of Youth Services;

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(c) Office of Economic Assistance;

113 (d) Office of Child Support Enforcement.

(a)

The Executive Director of Human Services shall appoint (6) 114 heads of offices, bureaus and divisions, as defined in Section 115 116 7-17-11, who shall serve at the pleasure of the executive director. The salary and compensation of the office, bureau and 117 118 division heads shall be subject to the rules and regulations adopted and promulgated by the State Personnel Board as created 119 120 under Section 25-9-101 et seq. The executive director shall have the authority to organize offices as deemed appropriate to carry 121 out the responsibilities of the department. The organization 122 123 charts of the department shall be presented annually with the budget request of the Governor for review by the Legislature. 124

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(7) This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2006.SECTION 3. Section 43-1-3, Mississippi Code of 1972, is

127 amended as follows:

128 43-1-3. Notwithstanding the authority granted under
129 subsection (4)(d) of Section 43-1-2, the Department of Human
130 Services or the Executive Director of Human Services shall not be
131 authorized to delegate, privatize or otherwise enter into a

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contract with a private entity for the operation of any office, 132 bureau or division of the department, as defined in Section 133 7-17-11, without specific authority to do so by general act of the 134 135 Legislature. However, nothing in this section shall be construed 136 to invalidate (i) any contract of the department that is in place and operational before January 1, 1994; or (ii) the continued 137 renewal of any such contract with the same entity upon the 138 expiration of the contract; or (iii) the execution of a contract 139 140 with another legal entity as a replacement of any such contract that is expiring, provided that the replacement contract is 141 142 substantially the same as the expiring contract. * * *

This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2006.

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144 SECTION 4. Section 43-1-5, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 145 amended as follows:

146 43-1-5. It shall be the duty of the Department of Human 147 Services to:

148 (1) Establish and maintain programs not inconsistent with
149 the terms of this chapter and the rules, regulations and policies
150 of the * * * Department of Human Services, and publish the rules
151 and regulations of the department pertaining to <u>those</u> programs.

(2) Make such reports in such form and containing such
information as the federal government may, from time to time,
require, and comply with such provisions as the federal government
may, from time to time, find necessary to assure the correctness
and verification of such reports.

(3) Within ninety (90) days after the end of each fiscal year, and at each regular session of the Legislature, make and publish one (1) report to the Governor and to the Legislature, showing for the period of time covered, in each county and for the state as a whole:

162 (a) The total number of recipients;163 (b) The total amount paid to them in cash;

The maximum and the minimum amount paid to any (C) 164 165 recipients in any one (1) month; (d) The total number of applications; 166 167 (e) The number granted; 168 (f) The number denied; The number cancelled; 169 (q) 170 The amount expended for administration of the (h) provisions of this chapter; 171 The amount of money received from the federal (i) 172 government, if any; 173 174 (j) The amount of money received from recipients of assistance and from their estates and the disposition of same; 175 176 (k) Such other information and recommendations as the 177 Governor may require or the department * * * deems advisable; The number of state-owned automobiles purchased and 178 (1) operated during the year by the department, the number purchased 179 and operated out of funds appropriated by the Legislature, the 180 181 number purchased and operated out of any other public funds, the miles traveled per automobile, the total miles traveled, the 182 183 average cost per mile and depreciation estimate on each 184 automobile; The cost per mile and total number of miles 185 (m) traveled by department employees in privately-owned automobiles, 186 for which reimbursement is made out of state funds; 187 188 (n) Each association, convention or meeting attended by

any department employees, the purposes thereof, the names of the employees attending and the total cost to the state of <u>the</u> convention, association or meeting;

(o) How the money appropriated to the institutions
under the jurisdiction of the department has been expended during
the preceding year, beginning and ending with the fiscal year of
each institution, exhibiting the salaries paid to officers and

196 employees of the institutions, and each and every item of receipt 197 and expenditure;

(p) The activities of each division within the
Department of Human Services and recommendations for improvement
of the services to be performed by each division;

(q) In order of authority, the twenty (20) highest paid
employees in the department receiving an annual salary in excess
of Forty Thousand Dollars (\$40,000.00), by P.I.N. number, job
title, job description and annual salary.

Each report shall be balanced and shall begin with the 205 balance at the end of the preceding fiscal year, and if any 206 207 property belonging to the state or the institution is used for profit, the report shall show the expenses incurred in managing 208 209 the property and the amount received from the same. Those reports shall also show a summary of the gross receipts and gross 210 disbursements for each fiscal year and shall show the money on 211 hand at the beginning of the fiscal period of each division and 212 213 institution of the department.

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This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2006.

215 **SECTION 5.** Section 43-1-6, Mississippi Code of 1972, is 216 amended as follows:

43-1-6. The following programs within the Division of
Federal-State Programs, Office of the Governor, shall be
transferred to the * * * Department of Human Services:

220 (a) Office of Energy and Community Services;

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(b) Juvenile Justice Advisory Committee; and

222 (c) Mississippi Council on Aging.

All authority to implement those programs shall be vested in the State Department of Human Services.

This section shall stand repealed on July 1, 2006.

226 **SECTION 6.** This act shall take effect and be in force from 227 and after July 1, 2004.
